NARRATIVE MAIT Call On 05/12/22, I, (Detective Kirk Will) was requested to respond to Bennett Road/N Raynor Ave in Racine County to assist with a MAIT investigation. When I arrived on scene I was tasked with conducting two interviews of members of the Racine County Sherriff's Office (RCSO) Interview of RCSO Sgt Christopher Rydelski I first spoke with RCSO Sgt Chrsitopher Rydelski who works 3rd shift 10pm-6am. Sgt Rydelski is squad number 5081 and badge number 10821. The following is a synopsis of the interview: Sgt Rydelski was at the RCSO substation located near Highway 20 when he heard a radio broadcast of an Oak Creek pursuit entering Racine County. Sgt Rydelski monitored radio transmissions as two other RCSO Deputies (Deputy Kevin Turkowski and Deputy Bryan Schmidt) went to assist. Sgt Rydelski heard radio communications that a crash had occurred, a subject later identified as Edgar G Rodriguez, M/W, 07/25/00 was in custody and possible ingested cocaine. A short time later Sgt Rydelski heard a radio transmission that Rodriguez was seizing. At that time Sgt Rydelski began to respond emergency mode from the substation. RCSO squads are not equipped with dash cams but Sgt Rydelski was wearing his body cam which was acitvated. Sgt Rydelski arrived on scene and stopped south of the crash location. When Sgt Rydelski arrived he observed Rodriguez handcuffed and on his back as several officers were providing medical attention including CPR. A short time later members of the Kansasville Fire Department arrived on scene. The handcuffs were removed from Rodriguez and they began using the LUCAS CPR machine. While medical personal were attending to Rodriguez, Sgt Rydelski conducted traffic control. A short time later Rodriguez was transported from the scene by the med unit. Interview of RCSO Deputy Kevin Turkowski I then spoke with RCSO Deputy Kevin Turkowski who works 3rd shift 10pm-6am. Deputy Turkowski is squad number 5032 and badge number 10373. Deputy Turkowski was parked at Evans Park near Hwy 20 meeting with another RCSI Deputy Bryan Schmidt. Deputy Turkowski heard radio traffic an Oak Creek pursuit was entering Racine County and he and Deputy Schmidt responded to assist in emergency mode. Deputy Turkowski had his body worn camera activated. When Deputy Turkowski arrived on scene he parked his squad to the south of the crash. Deputy Turkowski observed Rodriguez standing outside the driver's door of his crashed vehicle with his hands up. Deputy Turkowski believed Rodriguez was holding something in his hand possibly a water bottle. Deputy Turkowski could see a Oak Creek Sergeant Thomas Loontjens and Oak Creek K9 handler Nicole Raffini standing by their squads to the north giving commands to Rodriguez.

Rodriguez did not comply with commands and went back in the driver's door. At that time the K9 was released. The K9 appeared to bite Rodriguez on the arm while he was near the driver's door. Both K9 Officer Raffini and the Oak Creek Sgt Loontjens approached. K9 Officer Raffini outed the K9 from the bite while the Sgt Loontjens decentralized Rodriguez to the ground. Sgt Loontjens then handcuffed Rodriguez while Deputy Kevin Schmidt assisted by controlling Rodriguez's legs. A med unit was requested at that time for the potential injury from the K9 bite.

Rodriguez was stood up and walked back towards the Oak Creek squads. While this was happening Deputy Turkowski was trying to control traffic. When Rodriguez was being search an unidentified officer asked him to open his mouth. Deputy Turkowski observed at that point Rodriguez seemed "out of it." Deputy Turkowski heard one of the officers say that Rodriguez ingested cocaine. The next time Deputy Turkowski turned around he observed Rodriguez on the ground still handcuffed and beginning to seize. Deputy Turkowski observed officers administer Narcan and use the AED on Rodriguez while waiting for a med unit to arrive. Shortly after a med unit arrived and Rodriguez was transported to the hospital.

The Wauwatosa Police Department is the lead agency for this investigation and is documented under number 22-10012. Contact at Hospital On Thursday, May 12th, 2022, Detective Kelly Zielinski and I, Detective James Short responded to the Aurora Medical Center-Mount Pleasant located at 13250 Washington Ave. Mount Pleasant, WI. regarding this investigation. We arrived at the Emergency Room at approximately 8:27 a.m. The suspect in this case, Edgar G. Rodriguez (M/W 07/25/2000) was in Trauma Room #4 being attended to by medical staff. Just as we arrived we were informed that Rodriguez was going to be flighted to the Aurora Medical Center Summit located at 36500 Aurora Dr. Summit, WI. Contact was made with City of Oak Creek Police Officer Ashley Schnering #111 (late shift 11p to 7a) who was assigned to guard Rodriguez. Officer Schnering stated that she arrived at the hospital at approximately 6:42 a.m. to relieve Oak Creek Officer Nicole Rafini who was the lead on the officer involved incident. Officer Schnering said that she was not involved in the pursuit of Rodriguez. Officer Schnering turned over to me a plastic bag that contained Rodriguez clothing and his Wisconsin D.L. Contact was made with ER Dr. Monica Robinson. Dr. Robinson stated that she started her shift at approximately 7:00 a.m. and took over for Dr. Diana Dovorany who was attending to Rodriguez. Dr. Robinson stated that Rodriguez arrived at the ER around 6:30 to 6:40 a.m. Rodriguez was transported to the hospital by the Kansasville Fire Department Med Unit and arrived in cardiac arrest. Rodriguez was eventually resituated about 10 minutes after arrival. Dr. Robinson said that Rodriguez blood draw showed his AC was .04 and it was positive for the presence of cocaine. Dr. Robinson added that Rodriguez did not have any exterior signs of trauma other than some minor scrapes. A CT scan was conducted and it showed that Rodriguez may have a small brain bleed. poor prognosis. More tests are needed at the time but Rodriguez is not stable.

We observed Rodriguez on the gurney in Trauma Room #4. Nurse Fances Krivanek was the charge nurse at the time. Due to the medical staff prepping Rodriguez for flight transport we were unable to fully inspect his person for photos etc. Dr. Robinson located a [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] who was listed a san emergency contact for Rodriguez in his chart. Contact was attempted with [REDACTED] several times with negative results.

Flight Trauma Team #2 arrived at the hospital at approximately 9:08 a.m. and at approximately 9:33 a.m., Rodriguez was flighted to Aurora Summit. Officer Schnering left the hospital before flight to meet them at Summit. We stayed with Rodriguez until he departed the hospital.

Detective Zielinski and I proceeded to Aurora Summit where we again met with Officer Schnering. We arrived at Aurora Summit at approximately 10:36 a.m. Officer Schnering said that she arrived at Aurora Summit before the flight did. Rodriguez was admitted and was in ICU Room 222. Contact was made with Trauma Dr. Peter Garza who stated that the outlook for Rodriguez was not good as they were waiting for him to be more stable to continue their examination and assessment. Dr. Garza said that Rodriguez was bleeding in his nasal cavity and his blood was not coagulating. They were unsure at the moment why this was occurring.

Det. Zielinski and I were able to observe more of Rodriguez and take photos. We observed several scrapes and a puncture on Rodriguez right elbow. He also had bruising on his left thigh and small scrapes on his wrists and arms. Det. Zielinski took 40 digital photographs which were later saved on the Detective Bureau photo file attached to this case.

Det. Zielinski and departed the hospital at 11:10 a.m. Officer Schnering remained at the hospital with Rodriguez.

Scene Response I responded to the scene which was the end of the pursuit. The location was the southwest corner of the intersection of Highway US 45 (Raynor Ave.) and Bennett Road. Upon my arrival I met with Investigators from Oak Creek, Deputies from Racine County who were maintaining scene security and completing the crash report, and State Patrol Troopers who were conducting a reconstruction in investigation. I was briefed on the information known at that time. Suspect Items Recovered from Police Items identified as belonging to the suspect were located on the hood of an unmarked Oak Creek Squad car identified as being operated during the event by Sgt. Loontjens. The Ford Explorer had no fleet markings but did have Wisconsin Registration 390-PSF. It was parked with squad lights activated facing south with the front wheels touching the corner of the pavement at the southwest intersection of the scene. Investigative brief (and my later review of the squad video from this vehicle) showed medical procedures were rendered immediately in front of this squad. Detective Brett Mendola recovered the items and packaged them into a paper bag and turned them over to me. Also turned over to me were two items recovered by Officers on scene from inside the car.

Detective Mendola explained there was a rolled-up glove containing two items suspected to be contaminated as drug paraphernalia. The items were reportedly recovered from the Cadillac by Oak Creek Officer Raffini and turned over to Officer Hamilton who provided it to Detective Mendola.

The first item was a rolled up \$100 bill showing possible white powder residue. It was later entered as item 22-1483-1. The second item was a contact lens case with one cap on one side. Inside the container area for contacts was white [powder residue. The contact lens case was later entered as item 22-1484-1.

String from Roadway

While on scene I could see items directly in front of the unmarked Oak Creek Squad. Most was medical detritus and not collected. One item in the roadway was a black and white string that looked similar to a drawstring. It seemed out of place and potentially belonged to the suspect. It was likely removed during medical interventions. It was recovered and entered as item 22-1488-1.

Later information was received from investigators that a "Core" Brand water bottle should be near the Cadillac. The suspect was drinking from the bottle when he exited the car. I located the bottle and recovered it. I entered it later as item number 22-1489-1.

Cadillac and Dash Camera Recovered

Once the State Patrol completed their measurements for the reconstruction investigation I inspected the Cadillac. The car had Wisconsin Registration of ANP -1450 and VIN 1G6AR5SX1J0118077. There was extensive damage to the front wheels, and the front fenders and bumper. There was no tire left and the rims/wheels had mostly disintegrated. There was a flat spot on one edge of both wheel rims and part of the passenger rim flew off and penetrated through the front passenger fender. The car appeared to have simply left the roadway and driven into the dirt ditch. It did not appear to strike anything in doing so.

There was no damage to the rear areas of the car or the sides indicating no other contact with another vehicle or previous objects. It did not appear the Cadillac was in a crash prior to the wheel damage and leaving the roadway.

The auto was towed to the Wauwatosa Police Department by N&S towing and secured in an evidence processing garage. It was entered as item number 22-1477-1.

While on scene I could see the Cadillac had a Thinkware brand dash camera installed. The device appeared to be wired to a rear camera from the front head unit which appeared powered and active. Due to concerns that any recording could be overwritten after a period of time the camera was recovered on scene. I am aware some devices similar to this one will overwrite older data with newer data as it continues to record. That could potentially destroy video of the event under investigation if it existed. Based on the exigent circumstances of the data possibly being destroyed, I recovered the camera on scene from the auto to preserve it. Milwaukee County District Attorney's investigator Ron LaGosh entered the car and disconnected the camera main unit and provided it to me.

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The unit does appear to have a digital recording card (Micro SD or similar) installed. The device was later entered as item number 22-1478-1.

Cadillac Search Pursuant to Warrant

On May 16, 2022 I was informed a warrant was obtained for the search of the Cadillac. I executed that warrant on May 16 and searched the Cadillac at the Wauwatosa Police Station in the evidence processing garage.

I recovered two items during that search. A black spring assist folding knife with a Vietnam theme was recovered from the dashboard. The knife was in the front driver's side corner of the top of the dashboard near the VIN corner. It was recovered and entered into evidence as item number 22-1523-1.

From the center cup holder area I located a black metal sniffer tube. This device is a commonly used drug paraphernalia device used for snorting powdered substances. The object has a container space for the drug. A thumb turn operates a valve that dispenses a small quantity of the drug into a chamber with a hole. The user then snorts the drug through the hole. This sniffer was black metal and had the words "SNUFF STUFF" on one end. I recovered the drug sniffer and entered it as item 22-1524-1.

Photography

During the various steps of my investigation IO took a series of Digital photos. On scene and during the tow process I took 92 digital photos of relevant information and items. I took 20 photos of the recovered items once back at the Wauwatosa Police station. I took 47 digital photos of the search process and vehicle on May 16, 2022.

Additionally, I was provided 149 digital photo copies from Racine County Deputy Joseph Arndt while on scene. Those photos were taken by him during their crash investigation phase.

K-9 Officer Nicole Raffini stated she was uninjured, showed no areas of injury, but had dirt stains on her knees from the incident.

K-9 Officer Nicole Raffini turned over her weapon for a round count and inspection. The handgun from her right-handed holster was an HK P30 model, semi-automatic handgun chambered in .40 caliber. The serial number obtained from the slide was [REDACTED]. One round was in the chamber of the gun. The magazine seated in the gun held an additional thirteen (13) rounds of .40 caliber ammunition which is the normal full capacity. Both spare magazines were down loaded and found to contain thirteen (13) cartridges of .40 caliber ammunition which is the normal full capacity.

It appeared by round count that K-9 Officer Nicole Raffini was not missing any cartridges and did not fire her weapon during the incident.

She retained her weapon and ammunition.

K-9 Officer Nicole Raffini indicated that she deployed her K-9 partner, Revi during the incident. Her squad was parked in the sally port of the Oak Creek Police Department. I took photographs of the exterior of her squad, "OC-15." I also took two photographs of Revi on his leash held by K-9 Officer Nicole Raffini. She stated Revi did not have any vest or police markings on him during the

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deployment and appeared exactly as photographed during the deployment.

I photographed the trunk area of squad OC-15 as K-9 Officer Nicole Raffini indicated medical supplies and the AED unit was used from her squad.

I took custody of the AED unit from Oak Creek Officer Georgina Wettengel and entered it into evidence:

I spoke to T■■■ B■■ F/W, ■■■-■■-81 who stated her daughter, A■■■ B■■ F/W, ■■■-■■-09, awoke her and her husband, L■■■ B■■ M/W, ■■■-■■-79, as their dogs were barking. T■■■ B■■ stated they saw a vehicle in the ditch east of their house, several officers north of the			
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vehicle in the ditch, and officers performing CPR on a person north of the vehicle in the ditch. They watched from their front porch which is approximately 250 feet from the street where officers were performing CPR. She stated their view was partially obstructed due to the terrain between their front porch and the road. She stated ambulances arrived after officers began performing CPR. She estimated it was 5:50 AM when they were watching the incident from their front porch.

I spoke to L■■■■ B■■■ who did not have any additional details.

Detective Kastner spoke to A■■■■ B■■■ (I was present), who added that she heard her two Corgi dogs barking and she went outside to the barn (where the dogs spend the night). She heard another dog barking from the area of the vehicle in the ditch. It is believed this was the Oak Creek K-9.

NARRATIVE Canvass 47 124 ST Union Grove On 05/12/22 around 6:30pm, Detective Romeis and I made contact at 47 124 St Union Grove with the resident K M. M stated that she was home this morning but did not witness anything. The cameras on her property were not saving any recordings because she removed the memory card. Kansasville Fire Department Interviews On 05/12/22 at about 7:00pm, I, Detective Kastner, responded to the Kansasville Fire Department at 23730 Durand Ave, Kansasville WI to make contact with the personnel who treated and transported Edgar Rodriguez. <u>Paramedic Jarod Edmonds statement</u> Jarod Edmonds stated that he started his shift this morning at 5:30am and their ambulance was dispatched right as he was walking in to the fire station. He was one of the personnel assigned to Rescue Squad 532. They were originally sent for a report of a dog bite but then dispatch provided several updates including that 2 doses of Narcan were delivered and then that the patient was seizing and CPR was being performed. He is a Paramedic and he was assigned to Primary Patient Care on the call. The other personnel assigned to Rescue 532 was Captain Michelle Murphy, who was assigned Other Patient Care, and Chief Ronald Molnar, who was the ambulance driver. When Rescue 532 arrived on scene, some officers were performing CPR on the patient. He was not sure which officers were there. They were in the grass just north of the patient's vehicle with the patient. The patient was handcuffed when he first arrived. One of the officers took the handcuffs off the patient when they began treating him. He did a pulse check and put a LUCAS device chest compression on the patient while the officers continued CPR. He went through the Cardiac Arrest protocols with the patient, which included giving epinephrine (4 times), 600 mL of saline, a 20 microgram Epi push dose, and a 2mg dose of			
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Narcan. Several times while treating the patient, they obtained a pulse, but then would lose the pulse again.

One of the officers on scene told him that the patient admitted to cocaine use. He saw that the patient's eyes were dilated. Ambulances from Union Grove Fire Department and Franklin Fire Department also arrived on scene and the personnel assisted with treatment of the patient. They were on scene treating the patient for about 20 minutes before transporting him. He did not see any signs of trauma to the patient.

Rescue 532 transported the patient to Aurora Mt. Pleasant Hospital. One of the Union Grove FD personnel, Riley Walters, also rode in Rescue 532 to the hospital to continue to assist him and Capt. Murphy with treating the patient.

The patient was never conscious during the treatment or transport.

Captain Michelle Murphy statement

On 05/19/22, I made telephone contact with Kansasville Fire Department Captain Michelle Murphy and she stated the following:

She was assigned to Rescue 532 on 05/12/22 and around 5:30am, they were dispatched to a report of a dog bite. She is an Advanced EMT and she responded in the ambulance with Paramedic Jarod Edmonds. Chief Ronald Molnar responded from home and went directly to the scene. While they were enroute, they received multiple updates from Racine County Dispatch. They were advised the patient was seizing, then that he admitted to cocaine usage, then that the patient was unresponsive and CPR was in progress. Before they arrived, they requested an additional Paramedic to respond. Union Grove Fire Department responded and sent an ambulance with 2 EMT's, one of whom was named Riley.

When they arrived on scene, she saw that officers from Oak Creek Police were providing CPR and some officers from Franklin PD were there as well as deputies from Racine County Sheriff's Office, who may have been blocking traffic. The officers said that they had already given the patient Narcan and 2 "shocks" with an automated external defibrillator. The officers continued with chest compressions while she and the other fire department personnel provided medical treatment,

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including establishing an airway with an i-gel, placing an intraosseous vascular access (IO), administering epinephrine, and a round of Narcan, and getting the LUCAS on the patient. An ambulance from Franklin FD was also on scene and the personnel assisted with treatment.

She never saw any signs of trauma or injury to the patient. They had placed the patient on a board and did not detect any injuries to his back. She estimated they provided treatment on scene for 10 -15 minutes prior to transporting.

They were able to get a pulse on the patient and loaded him on the ambulance. Chief Molnar drove the ambulance while she, Edmonds, and the Union Grove EMT Riley, rode in the back of the ambulance and continued to treat the patient. The regained and lot the patients pulse several times during the transport. They transported the patient to Aurora Mt Pleasant and the hospital was able to regain a pulse on the patient. She later was advised by the hospital that the patient had a subdural hemorrhage.

Chief Ronald Molnar statement

On 05/19/22, I made telephone contact with Kansasville Fire Department Chief Ronald Molnar, who stated the following:

On the morning of 05/12/22, he was at home when the Fire Department got toned out for a dog bite with police on scene. They normally have a 2 person med unit, which responded. The dispatch updated that the patient was seizing, so he started to head in to assist. The dispatch gave more updates, including that police provided two doses of Narcan and that they were doing CPR. His ambulance (Kansasville rescue 532) requested an additional paramedic from Union Grove Fire Department. Union Grove FD did not have a paramedic available, but they sent an ambulance with 2 EMT's for additional manpower.

When he arrived to the scene, Kansasville Rescue 532 had already been there for about 4 minutes. He saw that one police officer was holding an IV bag while the fire personnel were treating the patient. The LUCAS was already on the patient and the IO was in place. Captain Murphy was doing ventilations and a pulse was obtained in the patient. He went to the ambulance and got the long board and they secured the patient on the board for transport. There were police squads from Oak Creek, Franklin, Racine County Sheriff and a Sate Trooper on scene. The ambulance from Union Grove FD arrived and so did an ambulance and engine from Franklin FD.

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05/12/2022

They loaded the patient into the ambulance, which he drove to Aurora Mt Pleasant. Paramedic Edmonds, Capt Murphy and Union Grove EMT Riley Walters were in the ambulance treating the patient.

He never saw the patient in handcuffs while he was on scene. He did not see any signs of trauma or dog bite to the patient.

He was later informed by the hospital that the patient had a brain bleed and a DIC blood clotting problem.

He approached on foot when he observed the suspect's legs moving in a manner that looked like he may be seizing. He observed a male Oak Creek Sergeant (didn't know his name) performing CPR on the suspect. Trooper Joseph Dashek recalled the female K-9 handler (didn't know her name) getting an AED and connecting it to the suspect.

DASHEK ASSISTANCE OF MEDICAL CARE

Trooper Joseph Dashek recalled Kansasville Fire/Rescue unit arrived and took over CPR efforts. At one point, an unknown Kansasville Fire/Rescue member requested Trooper Joseph Dashek take over chest compressions (CPR) as additional equipment was needed. He took over chest compressions and assisted Kansasville Fire/Rescue personnel in placing a back board under the suspect in order for the automated CPR machine to be affixed to the suspect by Kansasville Fire/Rescue personnel.

DASH CAMERA VIDEO

I obtained the dash camera video for Trooper Joseph Dashek and attached it to the call. The video is 40 minutes and 31 seconds. The camera is pointing toward the suspect for about the first minute and then the camera faces southbound on Highway 45 after Trooper Joseph Dashek parked his squad.

My observations of Trooper Joseph Dashek's squad camera is consistent with is statement.

Rodriguez (M/H 07/25/2000) by officers related to this investigation. The AED is owned by Oak Creek Police Department and was recovered by Detective Technician Michael Romeis and entered into property as evidence at the Wauwatosa Police Station under Wauwatosa PD Property #22-001481-001. On 05-17-2022, Detective Technician Stephen Kirby, at my request, turned over to me a brown paper bag that was sealed with evidence tape and contained the Zoll AED Plus (S/N: X15A732085) that had been entered into property by Det. Romeis. I took the AED to Wauwatosa Fire Station 51 and met with Deputy Chief Christopher Sandoval, who is the EMS Chief for the Wauwatosa Fire Department. There, I opened the bag and removed the AED. D/C Sandoval used an infrared reader and software provided by Zoll (the manufacturer of the AED) to download the raw data from the event involving Rodriguez. D/C Sandoval saved the data on a flash drive I provided him. D/C Sandoval and I looked at the ECG data from the AED. Based on my training and experience as a licensed state of Wisconsin Advanced Emergency Medical Technician and D/C Sandoval's as a licensed state of Wisconsin Paramedic, it appeared that Rodriguez's heart rhythm was extremely tachycardic and irregular. The report from the AED indicated that the AED was powered on at 05:44:55 (AM) on 05-12-2022 and was disconnected at 05:57:16 (AM). This is consistent (although not exact) with the times from a Franklin PD dashcam video I watched from Squad 115 (Franklin PD Sgt. Koster). The AED end time appears to coincide with the arrival of the Kansasville Fire

Department ambulance. During the event, the AED recorded CPR being performed on Rodriguez, including the administration of two shocks (120 joules at 05:47:05 and 150 joules at 05:49:24).

I then removed the 10 batteries from the AED as it was making a chirping noise due to the pads having been removed. I placed all of the batteries and the AED back into the paper bag and returned to the Wauwatosa Police Station. There, I resealed the bag with evidence tape and turned it over to Det. Kirby.

I used the Zoll RescueNet software to create two PDF files. The first file contains the AED Plus Full Disclosure Report (timeline with graph of ECG) and the second contains the AED Plus Incident Log (which includes the Event Timeline).

I uploaded the AED raw data files and the two PDF files to the secure digital evidence management system under this report number. I also printed copies of the two PDF files to be turned over to the Milwaukee County Medical Examiner's Office (MCMEO) to assist them in their investigation and autopsy of Rodriguez.

NARRATIVE This report is written by Detective James Short of the Wauwatosa Police Department as part of the Milwaukee Area Investigative Team (MAIT) investigation into the in custody death of Edgar G. Rodriguez (M/W 07/25/2000) regarding the Oak Creek Police Department (Oak Creek Incident #22-9179). The Wauwatosa Police Department is the lead agency for this investigation and is documented under number 22-10012. Statement of Officer Nicole Raffini On Wednesday, May 18th, 2022, Detective John Milotzky and I, Detective James Short interviewed Oak Creek Police Officer Nicole Raffini at the Law Office of MacGillis Wiemer, LLC, located at 11040 W. Blue Mound Rd. Wauwatosa, WI. Present during the interview was Attorney Kevin Todt representing Officer Raffini. The interview started at approximately 10:00 a.m. and was not recorded at the request of Officer Raffini's legal counsel. The following is a synopsis of the interview and is not a direct transcript unless quoted. Officer Nicole Raffini (Badge #137) is employed as a late shift (11:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.) patrol Officer for the City of Oak Creek, WI. and works a five on two off, four on two off schedule. Officer Raffini started her career at Oak Creek on January 11th, 2017. She completed her academy training at Milwaukee Area Tech College program prior to being employed with Oak Creek. P.D. Oak Creek P.D. put Officer Raffini through the academy. Officer Raffini does not have any prior law enforcement experience. Officer Raffini is also assigned to the department's Honor Guard as well as a K-9 Officer. Officer Raffini has also been a Field Training Officer for approximately one year. Officer Raffini has been a K-9 Officer since October of 2020 and her K-9 partner is named "Revi." Revi is a male Dutch Shepard. Officer Raffini obtained Revi and her training at the Southern Police Canine Inc. located in North Carolina. Officer Raffini trains with Revi eight hours a month with the other two Oak Creek K-9's and eight hours a month with other agencies. Officer Raffini said that use of the K-9 falls under Protective Alternatives within the Intervention Options in the Wisconsin Defense and Arrest Tactics Curriculum. Officer Raffini worked the late shift starting at 11:00 pm on 05/10/2022. Officer Raffini stated that			
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nothing of significance occurred during this shift other than she was involved with a pursuit that was ultimately terminated. Officer Raffini ended her shift on the morning of 05/11/2022 and proceeded home to feed her dogs, eat breakfast, and sleep. Officer Raffini said that she slept for approximately six to seven hours. Officer Raffini picked up her child from sports practice around 5:00 p.m. and returned home to do general things around her residence. Officer Raffini stated this was a basic day and she did not consume any alcohol or take any medication prior to her shift.

Officer Raffini started her shift on 05/11/2022 at 11:00 p.m. with roll call. There were five officers working the shift as well as two Sergeants. Officer Raffini said that this shift was the last day in a cycle and she would spend time catching up on reports prior to her off days. Officer Raffini was in full Oak Creek Uniform to include a body worn camera and would be driving a marked Oak Creek Police Squad (Car #15) with 360 degree emergency lights equipped with in-squad camera. Officer Raffini's assigned squad area was the west side of Oak Creek with the north to south city border and Howell Ave. west to S. 27th St. Officer Raffini patrolled her area until approximately 1:30 a.m. when she returned to the station. Officer Raffini went back out on the street at approximately 4:40 a.m. Officer Raffini described the activity on the shift so far as relatively quiet with no calls of significance.

At approximately 5:30 a.m., Officer Raffini said that she was patrolling in the area of S. 27th St. and W. Puetz Rd. Officer Raffini stated that she was contacted on the squad radio by Sgt. Thomas Loontjens (Badge # 87) who said that a vehicle was "flying up behind her." Officer Raffini said that she pulled to the side of the road on west bound Puetz Rd. in the 2600 block. Officer Raffini said that she could see the headlights of a vehicle travelling at a fast rate of speed approaching her from the east. Officer Raffini said that it was getting light out but vehicles still had their headlights on. Officer Raffini said that she could see that the vehicle approaching her and at one point was going west bound in the east bound lanes passing other vehicles. Puetz Rd. is a two lane road with one lane going in each direction and is a posted 35 mph zone.

Officer Raffini went on to say that the speeding vehicle passed her and continued west bound on Puetz Rd. through the intersection at S. 27th St. Officer Raffini did not recall if the traffic control for west bound was green or red when the vehicle went through the intersection. Officer Raffini was able to see that the vehicle was a black Cadillac sedan. Officer Raffini estimated that the Cadillac was traveling 70 to 80 miles per hour as it passed.

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Officer Raffini activated her squad's emergency lights and siren as she pulled out to attempt to catch up to the vehicle. Turning on her emergency lights activated her squad's camera and her body cam. Officer Raffini continued west bound on Puetz Rd. advising via her squad radio that she was in pursuit of the black Cadillac. Officer Raffini said that she was able to get approximately one quarter of a mile behind the Cadillac. Officer Raffini said that speeds reached one hundred miles per hour at one point. Officer Raffini called out the pursuit on the squad radio stating the speed, and that there were no vehicles or pedestrians. The road conditions were also dry. The Cadillac continued west on Puetz Rd. then made a left turn to proceed south bound on S. 51 St. Officer Raffini continued to pursue the Cadillac and said speeds were now between 80 to 100 miles per hour.

Officer Raffini continued to say that the Cadillac made a right turn and proceeded west bound on Ryan Rd. Officer Raffini was able to close the gap on the vehicle and could see that the Cadillac had a registration plate but she could not read it. Officer Raffini continued to radio the speed and the road conditions. The pursuit continued west bound on Ryan Rd. They approached the area where Ryan Rd. turns north west and becomes St. Martens Rd. As they approached the curve Officer Raffini said that Sgt. Loontjens advised over the radio to terminate the pursuit. Officer Raffini said that she advised that the Cadillac had slowed due to traffic and asked permission to continue. Sgt. Loontjens advised that if the vehicle was slowing the pursuit could continue. Officer Raffini said that due to the slowing speed she was able to get close enough to read the plate on the Cadillac and broadcast the information.

Officer Raffini noted that at this point she knew that there were City of Franklin Police Squads in the area regarding the pursuit. Officer Raffini knew that there were Franklin Squads behind her and as the pursuit continued north bound she could see a Franklin Squad pulled off to the side of the road. Officer Raffini said that she believed that a Franklin P.D. Officer was going to deploy stop sticks so she slowed and backed off the Cadillac. As they approached Puetz Rd. a Franklin P.D. Officer deployed the sticks which were successful. Officer Raffini advised via the radio that there was a positive deployment of the stop sticks and she initially believed that all four tires of the Cadillac had run over the spike strips.

Officer Raffini said that the Cadillac continued north bound and she could see rubber coming off of the front rims of the vehicle. Officer Raffini said that the pursuit continued and that they made some turns but she wasn't familiar with the area. Officer Raffini said that she was able to repeat the

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names of the streets based on Franklin P.D.'s broadcast of the pursuit. At one point the Cadillac made a left turn to proceed south on Raynor Ave. Officer Raffini stated that the Cadillac had to almost come to a stop to make the turn. Officer Raffini believed that the driver may attempt to bail out of the vehicle at this time but the vehicle continued south bound on Raynor Ave. Raynor Ave. is a one lane in each direction north and south bound road. As the Cadillac continued south it was sliding on the road due to no tire tread on the front rims.

Officer Raffini added that she asked via the squad radio if Franklin P.D. had a squad available to conduct a PIT (Pursuit Intervention Technique) maneuver to end the pursuit. A Franklin Officer advised they were trying to get one in position. Officer Raffini said that a Franklin Squad had assumed the first position in the pursuit and she was currently in the second position as the pursuit continued south on Raynor Ave. Speeds of the pursuit were 50 to 55 mph. As the pursuit continued south bound into Racine County the Franklin Squads terminated and backed off. Officer Raffini was back as the lead squad behind the Cadillac. Officer Raffini asked via the radio how far Sq. 87 was from the pursuit. Sgt. Loontjens replied that he was at the "back of the pack." Officer Raffini added that the Cadillac's speed got up to 80 to 90 mph and passed a citizen vehicle on the left as it continued south bound. At this point Officer Raffini terminated the pursuit. Officer Raffini called out "I'm terminating. Last seen south bound from 3600." Officer Raffini said that she pulled to the side of the road and turned off her emergency lights and siren. Officer Raffini said that she had not crested the hill and she could no longer see the Cadillac. Officer Raffini said that she advised she would eventually continue at a safe speed to check for any crashes. Officer Raffini added that Sgt. Loontjens also turned off his emergency equipment and pulled up behind her. Officer Raffini said that she remained to the side of the road for approximately 30 seconds to 1 minute before she pulled away and continued south. Officer Raffini did not shut off her squad camera.

Officer Raffini proceeded south bound and observed the citizen vehicle also south bound crest a hill. As the citizen vehicle crested the hill, the vehicle's brake lights illuminated. As Officer Raffini crested the top of the hill she saw the Cadillac that was involved in the pursuit was off the road to the right in a ditch. Officer Raffini added that the citizen vehicle was stopped in the road next to the Cadillac. The citizen vehicle was the same one the Cadillac had passed just before she terminated the pursuit. Officer Raffini could see that the driver's door to the Cadillac was open and there was a subject standing in the doorway next to the vehicle. The subject was wearing a t-shirt and pants. Officer Raffini couldn't remember what color the clothing was. Officer Raffini radioed "crash crash crash." Officer Raffini turned her emergency lights back on and pulled up approximately 30 feet

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behind the two vehicles.

Officer Raffini exited her squad and proceeded to the rear passenger door where she put Revi on his leash. Officer Raffini said that she drew her service weapon and began to give commands to the subject later identified as Edgar G. Rodriguez (M/W 07/25/2000) in the driver's door to the Cadillac. Officer Raffini also ordered the driver of the citizen vehicle to leave the area. Officer Raffini said that the citizen vehicle made a U-turn and left the scene north bound. Officer Raffini stated that during this sequence the subject re-entered the driver's compartment of the Cadillac and closed the door. Officer Raffini said that the Cadillac had heavy tint on the windows and she was trying to determine if there were any other passengers in the vehicle. Officer Raffini said that she could see the driver's head but didn't believe that there was anyone else in the vehicle. Officer Raffini began to give commands to the subject stating "get out of the car, you're under arrest!"

Officer Raffini said that Sgt. Loontjens had pulled and stopped his squad behind hers. Officer Raffini's squad was partially on the road and partially on the shoulder. Officer Raffini said that they held their positions for a moment knowing that Franklin P.D. was returning and Racine County Deputies were on the way to assist. Officer Raffini said that she and Sgt. Loontjens moved up a bit to further assess the vehicle. Officer Raffini said that the driver door to the Cadillac opened and though still seated in the driver's seat, Rodriguez placed both hands out. Rodriguez turned and looked at Officer Raffini. Officer Raffini ordered Rodriguez to exit the vehicle. Rodriguez exited the vehicle with his hands up near his ears. Officer Raffini further ordered Rodriguez to turn and face away from her. Rodriguez did turn and face away. Officer Raffini continued to order Rodriguez to place his hands higher above his head. Rodriguez's hands remained in the same position by his ears. Officer Raffini said that she didn't know if Rodriguez heard her or didn't understand English. Officer Raffini added that she ordered Rodriguez to put his hands over his head. Rodriguez laced his fingers and put his hands on the back of his head. Officer Raffini could see a squad approaching from the south. Officer Raffini decided to try and hold Rodriguez in this position until more help arrived to assist taking him into custody.

As Officer Raffini gave her commands, Revi was seated at her side barking. Officer Raffini said that Rodriguez moved toward the open drivers compartment and reached with both hands into the vehicle. Officer Raffini said that she could only see Rodriguez's hips and legs as his entire upper body was in the vehicle. Officer Raffini believed that Rodriguez was going back into the vehicle to retrieve a weapon. Officer Raffini said that because she and Sgt. Loontjens were approximately 2

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car lengths from Rodriguez without adequate cover and the possibility of Rodriguez reentering the vehicle for a weapon, she decided to deploy Revi to as the quickest way to control Rodriguez.

Officer Raffini yelled to Sgt. Loontjens that she was going to send her dog. Officer Raffini yelled "██████" which is Revi's command to apprehend. Officer Raffini released Revi from the leash and Revi ran at Rodriguez as he was beginning to stand in the door to the driver's compartment. Revi jumped and tried to bite Rodriguez in the back but was unsuccessful. Officer Raffini said that Revi tried several times to bite Rodriguez but was not able to latch on. Officer Raffini and Sgt. Loontjens converged on Rodriguez who was still near the door to the vehicle. Officer Raffini said she observed that Rodriguez had a bottle of water in his hand. Officer Raffini said that at this point she was confident that Rodriguez did not have a weapon and she and Sgt. Loontjens were able to decentralize Rodriguez even though they were on the embankment of the ditch. Officer Raffini and Sgt. Loontjens were able to get Rodriguez prone with his hands behind his back. Officer Raffini had to control Revi with her free hand. A deputy with the Racine County Sheriff's Office arrived and was able to assist. The deputy controlled the right side of Rodriguez and Sgt. Loontjens controlled the left. At this time Sgt. Loontjens was able to place Rodriguez in handcuffs. Officer Raffini said that she did not perform any focused strikes on Rodriguez and she did not see anyone else perform any strikes.

Once the subject was in custody, Officer Raffini returned to her squad and secured Revi. Officer Raffini said that as she was walking back to assist she saw Sgt. Loontjens and the RCSI Deputy escorting Rodriguez to the front of Sgt. Loontjens squad. Officer Raffini said that Rodriguez was walking in a manner that she believed he may something hidden in his pants. Sgt. Loontjens asked Rodriguez if he had anything "crotched?" Sgt. Loontjens started to conduct a pat down of Rodriguez. No contraband was located. Officer Raffini said that while Rodriguez was being patted down, he had the "thousand yard stare" look on his face as he was staring off in the distance. Officer Raffini believed that Rodriguez was showing signs of impairment based on his behavior and the way he walked when escorted. Officer Raffini said that Rodriguez behavior started to degrade. Rodriguez started to sway as he stood with officers. Sgt. Loontjens asked Rodriguez "What are you on?" Rodriguez stated "cocaine."

Officer Raffini said that at this point Rodriguez could not stand and he was placed on the ground in a seated position. Rodriguez started to have a seizure and he was placed on his back. At this point they believed that Rodriguez had overdosed on something. Officer Raffini said that they tried to

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revive Rodriguez with a sternum rub but he was not responding. Officer Raffini said that she went to the rear of her squad to retrieve the squad's Automatic External Defibrillator (AED). Officer Raffini said that a Franklin Officer who had arrived to assist administered a dose of Narcan to Rodriguez. Officer Raffini stated Rodriguez continued to seize and was now foaming at the mouth. Officer Raffini believed that a RCSI Deputy had made a request for medical to respond. Officer Raffini prepped the AED pads and passed them to a RCSI Deputy who was assisting Sgt. Loontjens. Rodriguez's shirt was torn and the AED pads were applied to Rodriguez chest. Sgt. Loontjens began chest compressions.

The AED analyzed Rodriguez heart rhythm and stated a shock was advised. Officer Raffini pushed the button on the AED to administer the shock. Sgt. Loontjens and Oak Creek Officer William Eisenhardt continued to perform chest compressions on Rodriguez while Oak Creek Officer Garret Hamilton administered breath with the Bag Valve Mask. Rodriguez was administered a second dose of Narcan by an unknown Officer. Officer Raffini administered a second shock with the AED when advised by the machine. CPR continued and the AED next advised to not shock the patient.

CPR continued until the Kansasville Fire Department Med Rig arrived on the scene. Officer Raffini briefed the Paramedics regarding CPR, the use of the AED, and the subjects statement that he used cocaine as well as two doses of Narcan being administered.

Officer Raffini proceeded to look inside Rodriguez vehicle. Officer Raffini observed the center console cup holder contained a rolled up one hundred dollar bill and a contact case which contained a white powdery residue. Officer Raffini collected these items and placed them in a nitrile glove which she turned over to Officer Hamilton.

Officer Raffini added that she was assigned by Sgt. Loontjens to follow the Med Rig transporting Rodriguez to the hospital. Officer Raffini followed the Meds to the Aurora Hospital located in Mount Pleasant. Rodriguez was taken to Trauma Room #4 where after approximately 10 minutes they were able to get a heart beat. Officer Raffini was relieved by Officer Ashley Schnering and Officer Raffini returned to the Oak Creek Police Department where she met with Sgt. Wesley Jerving to provide a Public Safety Statement and continue with the investigation.

I later met with Officer Raffini and Attorney Todt who reviewed this statement and no changes were made.

Loontjens. Wauwatosa Police Detective James Short was also present during the interview. The interview was conducted in a conference room at the Wauwatosa Police Department. Sgt. Loontjens declined my request to record the interview. I confirmed with Sgt. Loontjens that this was a voluntary interview and that he was free to go at any time. Sgt. Loontjens said that he had not reviewed any evidence, photographic, video (including his body camera footage) or otherwise before speaking with me. All quotes provided by Sgt. Loontjens are to the best of his recollection. Background Sgt. Loontjens attended UW-Milwaukee and graduated in 1996 with a degree in Criminal Justice. Sgt. Loontjens attended Milwaukee Area Technical College in 1996 and graduated the Police Academy program in the fall of 1996. Sgt. Loontjens was appointed to the Oak Creek Police Department (OCPD) on June 1st, 1999. Prior to working for OCPD, Sgt. Loontjens worked for the Milwaukee County Sheriff's Department from 1997-1999 and part time for the State Fair Police Department from April of 1997-September of 1997. Sgt. Loontjens was promoted to the rank of Sergeant for the OCPD in 2012. Sgt. Loontjens holds many Law Enforcement Standard Board certifications including; Crowd Control Instructor, Defense and Arrest Tactics instructor (DAAT), and Use of Force instructor, Firearms instructor, and Professional Communications instructor.

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05/12/2022**Activities Prior to Shift**

On May, 11, 2022, Sgt. Loontjens had a normal day prior to his shift. Sgt. Loontjens slept a usual amount, ate as normal and nothing of any emotional or personal significance occurred. Sgt. Loontjens felt normal physically, mentally and emotionally.

Current Assignment

Sgt. Loontjens is currently assigned to the Patrol Division. Sgt. Loontjens works the Night shift (10:45pm-7:00am on a rotating schedule (On 5, off 2, on 4 off 2)) and was on his [REDACTED] day in the 5/2 rotation at the time of the incident on May 12th, 2022.

Start of Shift

On the day of May 12th (Start date/time is technically May 11th), Sgt. Loontjens arrive to work at approximately 10:30pm, dressed in his full uniform and began his normal administrative routine of checking on prior shift calls, staffing for the shift, checking on MWAR's, and fugitive and wanted subject logs. Sgt. Loontjens attended the 11:00pm roll call along with OCPD Sgt. Wesley Jerving. Following roll call, Sgt. Loontjens performed additional administrative tasks that included reviewing teletypes from outside agencies, scheduling and reviewing and approving reports.

Prior to Involved Incident

At approximately 1:00am (May 12th), Sgt. Loontjens finished with his administrative duties, went out on patrol to assist Officers on calls and traffic stops, as he usually does. Sgt. Loontjens took out an unmarked Police Squad SUV with fully functioning 360-degree exterior emergency lighting and siren. At approximately 5:15am, Sgt. Loontjens fueled up his squad at the city garage located at 800 W Puetz Rd. Sgt. Loontjens then proceeded west on Puetz Rd and then stopped at the red light to go south on N. 13th St from Puetz Rd.

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05/12/2022**Suspect Vehicle Identified/Pursuit**

While waiting at the red light, Sgt. Loontjens observed a black sedan traveling west on Puetz Rd, west of S.13th St, at a high rate of speed. Sgt. Loontjens accessed his radar unit and was able to get a lock on the black sedan's speed (Suspect vehicle) at 62MPH in a 35MPH zone. Due to traffic congestion at the red light, Sgt. Loontjens was not able to immediately attempt to catch up to the vehicle to initiate a traffic stop. Sgt Loontjens was able to obtain a second lock on the radar unit of the suspect vehicle still traveling west on Puetz Rd at 70MPH.

Sgt. Loontjens advised knowing he could not safely get out of traffic and catch up to the vehicle, he looked at the in-squad computer and noticed on the GPS mapping that K-9 Officer Nicole Raffini was in the area of S. 27th St/ W Puetz Rd. Sgt. Loontjens advised over the squad radio, "Raffini, you have a vehicle coming your way, hauling". With the suspect vehicle out of sight, Sgt. Loontjens continued through the intersection and west on Puetz Rd.

Sgt. Loontjens then heard over the squad radio that Officer Raffini saw the suspect vehicle pass her at a high rate of speed, west on Puetz Rd. and is attempting to stop the vehicle. Sgt. Loontjens then hears Officer Raffini say over the radio that the suspect vehicle is not stopping for her and is going to pursue it for reckless driving. Sgt. Loontjens advises at this point he is west on Puetz Rd and can see Officer Raffini activate her emergency lights and siren in the 2800blk W Puetz Rd., but he is still several blocks to the east, trying to catch up to Officer Raffini and assist with the pursuit.

Sgt. Loontjens stated there is always an ongoing assessment for continuing a pursuit, factors which include; Likelihood of apprehension, safety of the public, weather and road conditions. Sgt. Loontjens advised at the time the pursuit was initiated, traffic was minimal, almost non-existent, roads were dry and lighted, and it was a known area for Officers. The pursuit continued west on Puetz Rd, then the suspect vehicle turned south on S. 51st St to W Ryan Rd. Loontjens again assessed the desirability of the pursuit and considered all factors again including the conditions and moderate speeds and made the decision to let the pursuit continue. The pursuit continued west on Ryan Rd. Sgt. Loontjens advised when he reached Ryan Rd., he looked west on Ryan Rd and could see that Raffini was in the 6500blk of Ryan Rd and still in pursuit.

Sgt. Loontjens advised at a point during the pursuit he remembers hearing Franklin Police Department over the radio say they had stop sticks set up at St. Martins Rd (Hwy 100) /W. Puetz Rd. Sgt. Loontjens advised he knew that the pursuit was headed that way and again assessed the pursuit and allowed it to continue, thinking that if the suspect hit the stop sticks it could slow and

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eventually stop the pursuit. Sgt. Loontjens advised he did not remember asking Franklin PD to assist with stop sticks or if Franklin just made that decision to assist on their own. Sgt. Loontjens advised several reasons to continue a pursuit after stop sticks are successfully deployed; First, the suspect vehicle slows down and the suspect gives up or is more easily apprehended. Secondly, the driver loses the capability of driving safely and crashes. Lastly, the vehicle is mechanically not able to continue.

The pursuit continued on Ryan Rd., towards S. 76th St. Sgt. Loontjens advised that the suspect vehicle briefly went in to the eastbound lanes of traffic on Ryan Rd., in excess of 80mph, so he made the decision to terminate the pursuit via the squad radio because of reckless driving of the suspect and safety concerns of the public.

Officer Raffini advised that the suspect vehicle had considerably slowed down. Knowing that stop sticks were set up ahead of the pursuit and a further safety assessment, Sgt. Loontjens advised Officer Raffini to continue the pursuit.

Sgt. Loontjens advised the pursuit continued west on Ryan Rd. and where Ryan Rd. starts to curve to the north, briefly lost site of the pursuit. He then heard Officer Raffini over the radio advise that Franklin successfully spiked the suspect vehicle. After getting through the curve on Ryan Rd., Sgt. Loontjens could again see Officer Raffini in pursuit of the suspect vehicle and was now being trailed by four Franklin squads assisting with the pursuit.

Sgt. Loontjens advised the pursuit continued west on W. Loomis Rd from St. Martins Rd (Hwy 100). Officer Raffini was reporting moderate speeds and that front tires of the suspect vehicle were coming off of the rims. Sgt. Loontjens advised Loomis Rd is a 2-lane highway with bends and turns and he lost sight of the pursuit. Sgt. Loontjens approached N. Cape Rd and assumed that the pursuit had gone north on N. Cape Rd. He then heard Officer Raffini say the pursuit was going south on N. Cape Rd, so he made a U-turn and again tried to catch up to the pursuit.

Sgt. Loontjens advised he again assessed the pursuit desirability and because of the moderate speeds, minimal traffic, no suspect front tires, and approximately 4 assisting squads from Franklin PD, he made the decision to let the pursuit continue. Sgt. Loontjens advised at some point while on N. Cape Rd., he was able to catch up enough to physically monitor the pursuit. Because there were 5 squads in pursuit in addition to his squad being an unmarked squad, Sgt. Loontjens turned off his emergency lights and siren. He then got on the squad radio and asked his dispatcher to ask Racine County for assistance since they were getting close to the Racine County border. He then heard

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Franklin PD ask over the radio if there was anyone to assist with the pursuit because they were going to terminate. Sgt. Loontjens was able to catch up to the pursuit, re-activate his lights and siren, and become the #2 squad in the pursuit.

They continued south on N. Cape Rd and at some point, heard Officer Raffini terminate the pursuit over the squad radio. Officer Raffini had pulled over to the right and turned off her emergency lights and siren. Sgt. Loontjens advised in order to debrief with Officer Raffini, he pulled up behind her and turned off his emergency lights and siren. The suspect vehicle continued south on S Cape Rd and out of view.

Suspect Arrest

Sgt. Loontjens advised they made the decision to continue south and check for any accidents the suspect vehicle may have caused. N. Cape Rd. turned into S. 124th St in Racine County. As they crested the hill, they could see approximately ½ mile ahead, a black sedan that matched the fleeing vehicle in the ditch on the west side of the roadway. As they approached the vehicle, he observed Officer Raffini pull up just to the north and east of the suspect vehicle and exited her squad with her K9. As Sgt. Loontjens pulls up, he knew he could not position his vehicle for a textbook felony stop because the suspect vehicle was sitting in the ditch, so he parked his squad car behind Officer Raffini's squad. Sgt. Loontjens stated as he parked, he observed the drivers door of the suspect vehicle open and close. Sgt. Loontjens then exited his squad, drew his firearm and crossed over to the west on foot and makes a tactical approach towards the suspect vehicle's rear passenger side area and stops approximately 20-30 feet from the vehicle. At this point, Sgt. Loontjens addresses a citizen who is sitting in a white SUV facing south in the roadway next to the suspect vehicle. He yells to the citizen, "Get out of here" and the citizen replies, "I saw him in the ditch and was just seeing if he was ok". The citizen makes a U-turn pulls off north on Raynor and out of view.

Sgt. Loontjens says he crouches down in the field for cover/concealment and sees the driver side front door of the suspect vehicle open and close. He did not see any other movement in the vehicle except for the driver's side front seat area. Sgt. Loontjens then thinks Officer Raffini orders the subject out of the vehicle, but is not certain. Sgt. Loontjens then sees the door open and sees the driver's head and shoulders outside of the vehicle. Sgt. Loontjens sees the driver put his hands on top of his head and walks 3-4 feet towards the rear driver's side of the vehicle and turns away from

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Officer Raffini. Sgt. Loontjens then observes the suspect lower his right hand from on top of his head to his mouth area, and immediately orders the suspect to put his hands on top of his head. At this point he hears Officer Raffini yell, "Put your hands on top of your head or I'll send the dog". The suspect does not comply with their orders, puts both hands down quickly and walks back to the open driver's side door. Sgt. Loontjens then yells to Officer Raffini to, "Send the dog", then begins to move to his right to get a better view of the driver's side of the vehicle. Sgt. Loontjens moves right and can now see into the open driver's side door area of the vehicle. The suspects then reaches into the vehicle and grabs a large water bottle from the center console area. At this point, Sgt. Loontjens sees the K9 make contact with the suspect, and the suspect drops the water bottle. Officer Raffini then moves to the rear of the vehicle. Sgt. Loontjens then holsters his firearm and approaches the suspect and the K9.

Sgt. Loontjens takes his right hand and grabs the back of the suspect's collar and attempts to stabilize the subject on the ground using a modified decentralization technique. The K9 is still jumping around the two of them and somehow the suspect goes down to the ground in a grassy area next to the suspect vehicle. The suspect is now laying on the ground, face down, and Sgt. Loontjens puts his knee next to the suspects upper torso in a 3-point ground stabilization technique. Sgt Loontjens grab's the suspect's arms, feels no resistive tension, and puts the subject's hands/arms behind his back. Sgt. Loontjens then uses his right hand to access his handcuffs and handcuffs the suspect without further incident. Sgt Loontjens double locks the handcuffs and checks for fit and tightness.

While the subject was still on the ground, Sgt. Loontjens noticed what appeared to be a bite mark on the suspect's right inside bicep, presumably from the K9, but did not see any other visible injuries. At this point, Sgt Loontjens asks the suspect, "Why did we have to do this this morning?", but the suspect just stares at him and does not reply. Sgt Loontjens is on the suspects right side and with the assistance of an unknown Franklin Police Officer, stands the suspect up and walks him over to the front of his squad. Sgt. Loontjens noted that the suspect was walking funny while being escorted back to the squad car and asked the suspect, "Why are you walking funny, did you crotch something". Sgt. Loontjens advised what he meant by "crotching something", was slang for hiding contraband in the crotch area.

Medical Aid to SuspectReporting Officer(s):
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Once they were standing by the squad, Sgt. Loontjens applied latex gloves and conducted a search incident to arrest of the subject and did not find any contraband. While standing by the squad, Sgt. Loontjens noticed the suspect's behavior changed drastically. The suspect's upper torso muscles were contracting uncontrollably, and could see the suspect's neck muscles tighten. Sgt. Loontjens assumed the suspect was having a medical issue of some sort and inquired for medical assistance with an unknown Racine County officer who was now on scene. Sgt. Loontjens was told medical was enroute for a dog bite with an unknown estimated time of arrival. **Sgt. Loontjens asked the suspect, "What did you take?, and the suspect answered, "Cocaine".** Sgt. Loontjens stated a Franklin officer went to his squad and retrieved a dose of Narcan which is meant to reverse the effects of opiates in the body. One dose of Narcan was administered to the nostrils of the suspect, but it did not have any effect on the suspect's status.

Sgt. Loontjens decided to put the suspect in a seated position on the ground, and a second dose of Narcan was administered to the suspect, with no physical change. At this point the suspect started to have what appeared to Sgt. Loontjens as multiple seizures. Sgt. Loontjens stated while the suspect was in the seated position, " it appeared the life went out of him (Suspect) and he stopped breathing". They then placed the suspect on his back and Sgt. Loontjens supported his torso and head to prevent any choking.

Sgt. Loontjens told Officer Raffini to retrieve her automated external defibrillator (AED) from her vehicle while he started chest compressions on the suspect. The suspect began breathing by himself but it appeared to be extremely labored breathing. The suspect's shirt was ripped to apply the AED pads and two shocks were administered after the AED evaluation. They were then advised by the AED to continue compressions. Sgt. Loontjens stated Oak Creek Police Officer Eisenhardt assisted with two rounds of 60 second compressions, and they both continued compressions for a lengthy period. At one point, Sgt. Loontjens inquired what was taking medical so long to arrive on scene, and was advised that medical was coming from Union Grove, which is a volunteer fire department and would take a little longer to respond. Sgt Loontjens asked Franklin Police if they could get medical on scene faster but was advised they might not respond out of Milwaukee County, but they would check.

Sgt. Loontjens advised they continued CPR until Kansasville EMS responded. Sgt Loontjens advised they had performed CPR and other life saving measures for an extended period before rescue units were on scene. While rescue personnel took over life saving measures he was asked to assist with rescue breathing for the suspect. Eventually a LUCAS machine was utilized, which is

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a mechanical CPR machine, and Sgt. Loontjens was relieved.

Administrative Follow Up

Sgt. Loontjens then stepped away from the scene and made some phone calls to his superiors informing them of what happened. Officer Raffinni had advised him that she had recovered a recovered a rolled up \$100 bill from the vehicle. Sgt. Loontjens knows through his training and experience that a rolled up bill is commonly used by drug addicts to sniff/snort illegal drugs. He then advised Officer Raffini to search the vehicle and then escort the suspect to the hospital with the medical unit.

Sgt. Loontjens advised that Oak Creek Detective Mendola arrived on scene and was briefed on the incident. Oak Creek Police Sergeant Jerving took Sgt. Loontjens public safety statement. Oak Creek Police Officer Hamilton arrived on scene and was assigned as Sgt. Loontjens support officer. Officer Hamilton then drove Sgt. Loontjens to Ascension Hospital for a blood draw, as required by Oak Creek Police Department policy.

Sgt. Loontjens then was conveyed back to the Oak Creek Police Department where he was met by Wauwatosa Detectives for photos and ammunition counts.

Review

After writing my report, I met with Sergeant Thomas Loontjens and his attorney, Brendan Matthews to review the factual accuracy of Sgt. Loontjens original interview with me from May 17th. No changes/additions to the factual content were made.

The time stamp indicators are approximate. The suspect vehicle described in this report was being operated by RODRIGUEZ. Please reference the media files depicting body camera and squad camera videos for further detail. I reviewed the media data files and observed the following: Folder: Officer Raffini Squad Video File: 101933_main Description: The video screen depicts "nraffini, Oak Creek PD, 05/12/2022, and 05:19:02" on the bottom of the screen and shows the front of a police vehicle with push bumper equipped as it travels on a roadway. The police vehicle moves to the right turn only lane and stops for a properly cycling red traffic signal at an unknown intersection. The suspect vehicle is then observed traveling past the police vehicle on the left at a high rate of speed. Emergency lights then appear before the suspect vehicle accelerates to a high rate of speed. The police vehicle slowed almost to a complete stop for a stop sign and does so again for another stop sign before turning left to travel on an unknown road. The police vehicle turns right to travel westbound on W. Ryan Rd. from S. 51st St. at a properly cycling green traffic signal. 05:23:26 - A marked police vehicle is observed parked in the shoulder in the opposing lane of travel with emergency lights activated as the suspect vehicle and PO Raffini's police vehicle pass. 05:23:52- A marked police vehicle is observed stopped on the right on an unknown street with emergency lights activated as another marked police vehicle is observed stopped in the opposing lane of travel with emergency lights activated. 05:25:03 - Two large pieces of debris that appear to have been pieces of tires fell from behind the suspect vehicle. The suspect vehicle and PO Raffini's vehicle turn left at a properly cycling green traffic signal. The suspect vehicle fails to maintain the path of travel in the designated lane and continually crosses over towards the shoulder off of the roadway.

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05:28:10 - PO Raffini's police vehicle moves to the right and an unknown marked police vehicle with emergency lights activated passes PO Raffini on the left.

05:30:35 - The police vehicle slows and pulls to the right as PO Raffini's vehicle then continues behind the suspect vehicle.

05:31:54 - PO Raffini's police vehicle slows to a stop onto the right side of the road and in the shoulder before slowly pulling back into the lane of travel and continuing. It does not appear that emergency lights are activated at this time.

05:33:03 - The suspect vehicle is observed off of the roadway and on the right in a grass covered area. The rear tail lamps are illuminated and an unknown subject is standing outside of the front driver's door. A White SUV (Similar to a Volkswagen Atlas SUV - Unknown Reg) is stopped in the right shoulder next to the suspect vehicle. The subject then re-enters the suspect vehicle and sits in the front driver's seat and closes the door.

PO Raffini runs from the front driver's side of her police vehicle to the right passenger side of her vehicle. She is wearing a full police uniform with a back panel that reads "POLICE" in bright white lettering and a police patch on her left shoulder. She has a firearm in her right hand directed towards the suspect vehicle and her K-9 leashed and tethered to her left hand. The white SUV then pulls away and completes a U-Turn. PO Raffini moves to the right and is off camera.

05:34:29 - A male police officer in a full uniform is observed approaching the passenger side of the suspect vehicle. The officer is seen wearing eye glasses, has short light brown hair, and blue sergeant patches on both sleeves. The officer has a firearm pointed at the suspect vehicle. RODRIGUEZ exits the front driver's door with his hands in the air and facing both officers. RODRIGUEZ then lowers both hands down towards his waist and turns away from officer while raising both arms again. The male officer moves closer to the suspect vehicle and is observed near the rear passenger side of the suspect vehicle. RODRIGUEZ places both hands on top of his head.

PO Raffini and her K-9 Officer moves closer to the driver's side of the suspect vehicle and behind RODRIGUEZ. RODRIGUEZ then lowers both hands, places his right hand into the front passenger compartment of the vehicle, and then sits in the front driver's seat of the vehicle. Two marked police vehicles with emergency lights appear and are traveling towards the scene in the opposing lane of

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travel. PO Raffini quickly approached RODRIGUEZ who then exited with an object that resembled a plastic bottle. RODRIGUEZ then raised and placed the object up to his mouth and tilted his head back while appearing to consume an unknown liquid from the bottle. PO Raffini and the other police officer seen direct RODRIGUEZ to the ground and several police officers are seen responding and assisting.

05:36:57 - RODRIGUEZ is walking under his own power while handcuffed behind his back. Two unknown male Caucasian police officers are seen assisting and directing RODRIGUEZ to walk away from the suspect vehicle and towards the rear of PO Raffini's police squad.

05:41:18 - PO Raffini runs towards the suspect vehicle and enters the front driver's side of the vehicle before exiting when the time stamp indicated 05:41:35. PO Raffini then walks back towards her police vehicle and off camera.

06:02:27 - An ambulance is observed arriving on scene.

The video ends at 06:13:16

The entirety of this video had working audio, but was very quiet and did not provide anything of evidentiary value.

The video is 54 minutes and 26 seconds in length.

Description: The video does not display any time stamps or other information. PO Raffini says similar to the following "37 desk. I'm trying to catch up to a (unintelligible) but it's not stoppin'. We're west on Puetz. Black Cadillac sedan CTS or something like that." The sound of a siren could be heard in the background. PO Raffini continues to update dispatch changes in location. PO Raffini says "It is going over 100 miles an hour." PO Raffini continues to update dispatch with the change in location during the pursuit.

PO Raffini was advised to terminate by a supervisor via radio then permission was granted to continue the pursuit. Please reference dispatch audio recordings for additional details. PO Raffini

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indicated to dispatch that Franklin Police Department successfully deployed a tire deflation device (Stop Sticks) and that all four tires were impacted.

PO Raffini indicated to dispatch that the suspect vehicle had lost two tires and the suspect vehicle was beginning to smoke and pieces of the vehicle were falling off. PO Raffini asked if Franklin Police had a vehicle available for "PIT". Franklin Police indicated to dispatch that they had an officer who would be passing PO Raffini and moving ahead to become the pursuing vehicle. PO Raffini notified dispatch that she had a K-9 and would deploy the K-9 if the suspect fled from the vehicle.

A Franklin Police Department supervisor terminated the pursuit for Franklin Police officers while PO Raffini continued. PO Raffini then terminated the pursuit as the suspect vehicle was traveling over 100mph and having difficulty maintaining control. PO Raffini slowed, pulled to the right, stopped, and deactivated her emergency lights and sirens. PO Raffini then continued to travel and conduct a check for crashes when she indicated she observed that the suspect vehicle had crashed at "Rainer and Bennett".

PO Raffini stops her vehicle and exits before leashing and retrieving her K-9 from the rear of the vehicle. PO Raffini's vehicle had emergency lights activated and was a fully marked Oak Creek police vehicle. PO Raffini runs to the front of her vehicle, retrieves her black semi-automatic firearm from her holster, and points it towards the suspect vehicle with her right hand while providing commands such as "Get out of the car! Get out of the car! You're under arrest! Get out of the car!"

PO Raffini moves slightly to the right and an unknown male Caucasian police officer appears to walk by PO Raffini towards rear passenger side of the suspect vehicle. The officer had his semi-automatic handgun gripped with both hands and was pointing it towards the suspect vehicle.

The front driver's door on the suspect vehicle opens and PO Raffini issues more commands by yelling, "Stay where you are! Put your hands out of the window! Put your hands out the window or you're going to get bit! Leave them where they're at! Stand up and face away from me! Face away from me! Keep your hands up! Keep your hands up! Put your hands over your head!" The suspect vehicle's front driver's door remained open.

PO Raffini then moves closer to the suspect vehicle with her firearm holstered and both hands on the leash of her K-9. RODRIGUEZ remains standing outside of the front driver's door while it is

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opened with both hands on top of his head and facing away from PO Raffini. RODRIGUEZ then lowers his right hand towards his chest. The other police officer is heard yelling "Don't move!".

PO Raffini then commands RODRIGUEZ to 'Back away from the car or you're going to get bit!' RODRIGUEZ does not back away from the vehicle. PO Raffini says "Tom I'm going to send him". PO Raffini's K-9 was barking during the entire encounter. RODRIGUEZ then lowers his arms and reaches into the front driver's side of the vehicle and PO Raffini releases her K-9 while providing an unknown command.

PO Raffini moves towards RODRIGUEZ and places her left hand around RODRIGUEZ's left bicep. RODRIGUEZ is holding a large plastic beverage bottle in his right hand and raises it towards his mouth. Based on the video footage I could not determine if PO Raffini's K-9 made contact with RODRIGUEZ or bit him. PO Raffini commands RODRIGUEZ to get onto the ground. RODRIGUEZ then goes to the ground face down while the other unknown officer takes him into custody. PO Raffini retrieves her K-9 while issuing commands.

The unknown police officer and two other fully uniformed officers assist in placing RODRIGUEZ into custody by placing his arms into handcuffs behind his back. The officers then roll RODRIGUEZ onto his left side.

PO Raffini then walks with her K-9 back to her vehicle and secures the K-9 in the rear of the squad before walking back towards RODRIGUEZ. Several other uniformed officers arrive on scene. RODRIGUEZ is assisted to a standing position by officers and walks back towards the police vehicles. RODRIGUEZ is seen walking under his own power. An officer asks RODRIGUEZ why he is "walking weird" and asked "do you have something in your crotch? What do you got going on today?"

RODRIGUEZ then replies "I snorted some cocaine." The officer asks "You did? How long ago?" and RODRIGUEZ says "Just before I got out." The officer asks "Just before what?" and RODRIGUEZ repeats "Just before I got out." The officer then immediately inquires with another officer that medical is needed. The officer says "The sooner the" before PO Raffini requests for another officer to call for medical assistance which the officer acknowledged by saying "Yeah."

The officer conducts a pat down of RODRIGUEZ and Racine County Deputy Schmidt advises that

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"a rescue squad is coming". The officer replies "Sooner better than later. He's not acting real right." The officer conducts a search of RODRIGUEZ and removes a black cellular phone from RODRIGUEZ's front right pant pocket and hands it to PO Raffini who states she has a bag in her car.

The officer advises Deputy Schmidt that RODRIGUEZ stated he used cocaine and Deputy Schmidt then advises another unknown deputy to update dispatch with that information. The unknown deputy then speaks into his radio.

A unknown Franklin Police officer inquires about using "Narcan" in case it was lacPO Raffini opens the trunk of her vehicle and searches a bag before inquiring with another unknown Franklin officer about "Narcan". Another officer indicated he had some Narcan and is seen administering a single dose to RODRIGUEZ's right and left nostrils. Dispatch was then advised.

An officer updates dispatch by saying "This fella is going to need to go to the hospital. He's not acting right. Probably some cocaine ingestion." Deputy Schmidt then tells RODRIGUEZ to sit down and assists in seating him onto a curb. While seated RODRIGUEZ begins to convulse. PO Raffini yells "Edgar! Edgar" then runs towards the suspect vehicle while indicating shes going to "check out the car to se if there's anything".

While standing outside of the vehicle PO Raffini uses a flashlight in her right hand and conducts a check of the front driver's area of the vehicle. The front driver's seat is black leather and appeared to have been wet in an area. There were several white streak like marks covering the seat and inside of the front driver's side door panel.

PO Raffini then returns to RODRIGUEZ and the other officers. PO Raffini tells the officers she observed a "rolled up one hundred dollar bill so he probably snorted something" An officer asks PO Raffini to update dispatch that "another Narcan was administered". PO Raffini then updates dispatch. Officers continue to speak to RODRIGUEZ who does not appear to be alert.

PO Raffini returns to her police vehicle briefly before walking back over towards RODRIGUEZ and other officers.

RODRIGUEZ then begins to shake and make noises. Deputy Schmidt then advises dispatch for

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rescue to "step it up." An officer then says "Oh shit. Get the defib now!". PO Raffini retrieves an AED (Automated external defibrillator) from the trunk of her police vehicle and begins to set it up next to RODRIGUEZ. RODRIGUEZ can be heard having agonal breathing. Other officers expose RODRIGUEZ's chest and the AED pads are placed on his chest by Deputy Schmidt. The AED analyzed RODRIGUEZ and advised that a shock should be delivered. PO Raffini pressed the shock button on the AED which advised that a shock was delivered and to start CPR.

An officer immediately begins chest compressions and another officers obtains a bag mask. Officers continue to administer CPR and the AED advises to shock the patient which is then completed. The AED later informed officers twice that no shock was advised.

Officers administered CPR to RODRIGUEZ for approximately 7 minutes and 36 seconds before the Kansasville Fire Department arrives on scene. Officers continue to administer CPR for another approximately 7 minutes and 45 seconds before medical personnel take over.

PO Raffini then walks to the suspect vehicle and conducts a search of the vehicle with another unknown officer by starting on the driver's side of the vehicle. PO Raffini advises the other officer that there was a rolled up dollar inside the vehicle and PO Raffini locates a "contacts container" in the center console and advised that there is residue inside of it before handing both items to the other officer. She then advises that there is white pieces all over the seats.

PO Raffini then searched the passenger side of the vehicle and does not appear to locate anything. The video then stops recording.

He runs towards the front passenger side of his vehicle before running towards the rear passenger side of the suspect vehicle with his firearm drawn and gripped with both hands pointed at the suspect vehicle.

Sgt. Loontjen gives commands to RODRIGUEZ such as "Don't move. Don't move! Put your hand back on your head! Don't move! Don't move!" RODRIGUEZ then lowers his arms and reaches into

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the front driver's passenger compartment of the vehicle. Sgt. Loontjen then says "Stop stop stop" towards the direction of PO Raffini and her K-9 while he directs RODRIGUEZ towards the ground using right hand on the top of RODRIGUEZ's back while maintaining control of RODRIGUEZ's left wrist with his left hand. RODRIGUEZ was already down to his knees when Sgt. Loontjen made contact with RODRIGUEZ. The ground appears to be soil covered with thick grass. He then places RODRIGUEZ's hands behind his back before placing him into handcuffs and double locks them.

A plastic beverage bottle can be seen in the grass approximately one foot away from RODRIGUEZ's right elbow.

Sgt. Loontjen then says to RODRIGUEZ "What's the matter with you man? Can't you listen? Roll onto your side. Stay put."

Sgt. Loontjen puts a pair of black nitrile gloves on before asking RODRIGUEZ if he had any weapons on him. RODRIGUEZ stated he had a pocket knife inside of the vehicle. Sgt. Loontjen and a second police officer assist RODRIGUEZ to his feet and begin to escort him back towards police vehicles.

The remainder of audio and events captured is also captured on PO Raffini's body camera and summarized above. (See file: ubj00602_20220512101933e0_01_000)

Sgt. Loontjen narrates that he is shutting off his camera to complete a phone call before the video ends.

The video is 30 minutes and 45 seconds in length.

Description: The video does not display any time stamps or other information. The video starts with Sgt. Loontjen collecting information from other officers on scene and writing in his log book while life saving efforts are being conducted by fire department personnel and other police officers.

Sgt. Loontjen is speaking to another police officer and told him "It was on Puetz. I was at 13th street. I was stopped and I was going to go south and I could see it haulin' so I shut my radar on and had it at 62 and then it was at 70. So then I saw that she was ahead of me closer to 27th street,

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like it's coming your way. She's like ya, so she tries to stop it and it just keeps goin'."

The video ends a short time later.

The video is 4 minutes and 44 seconds in length.

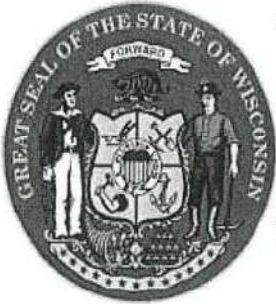

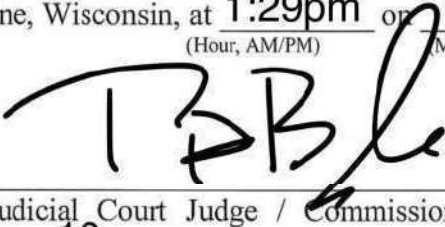

Affiant, Detective Bradley Isaacson, being Second duly sworn on oath, states as follows:

INTRODUCTION AND OFFICER BACKGROUND

- 1) Affiant is currently employed as a Detective for the Wauwatosa Police Department. Affiant has been employed as a law enforcement officer for over 17 years. Affiant is currently assigned the Wauwatosa Police Department Special Operations Group (SOG) and regularly investigates violent crimes including bank robberies, pharmacy robberies and carjackings.
- 2) Affiant is assisting in the criminal investigation of, pursuant to his official duties, the crime(s) of **Flee/Eluding an Officer**, committed in violation of **Wisconsin State Statute(s) §§ 346.04(3)**, which occurred in the City of Franklin, County of Milwaukee, State of Wisconsin **05-12-22**.
- 3) Affiant bases this affidavit on his training and experience, on his own knowledge, on information and belief, and on information contained in written reports and/or conveyed to him by law enforcement officers, on citizen victim and witness statements and on affiant's own investigation, as set forth below.
- 4) That while being tasked with investigating violent crimes, your affiant's investigations have been aided by consent searches and search warrants authorizing the forensic examination of cellular phones and electronic devices utilized by individuals suspected of committing crimes. - 10) Officer Raffini observed a black 2018 Cadillac CTS (WI/Auto – ANP1450) operating in a reckless manner. Officer Raffini reports observing the vehicle traveling in excessive of 100 mph.
- 11) Officer Raffini activates her squad's emergency lights and sirens in an attempt to stop the vehicle.

- 15) Rodriguez makes an utterance to officers that he is high on cocaine. Rodriguez suffered from a medical emergency and was transported by medical personnel to Aurora Mount Pleasant Hospital.
- 16) A blood draw was conducted by medical personnel at the Aurora Mount Pleasant Hospital. The preliminary results indicated the presence of alcohol and cocaine in Rodriguez's blood.
- 17) A search of Rodriguez's person officers located a grey in color iPhone. The iPhone was retained as evidence and transported to the Wauwatosa Police Department by Detective Technician Steve Kirby where it was entered into evidence under property number: 22-001481-001.
- 18) Detective Technician Kirby observed a dash camera within the vehicle. The camera appeared to be on and recording. The camera and accessories were turned off and recovered to prevent the destruction of evidence. The camera and accessories were transported to the Wauwatosa Police Department and entered into evidence under 22-001478-001.
- 19) Your affiant conducted a registration check of the black 2018 Cadillac CTS (WI/Auto – ANP1450). The vehicle is registered to Edgar G. Rodriguez (m/w 07-25-00) at 7120 93rd Ave, Kenosha, WI 53142.
- 20) The black Cadillac was towed to the Wauwatosa Police Department, 1700 N. 116th St, Wauwatosa, WI, and entered into evidence under property number: 22-001477-001.
- 21) Prior to towing the vehicle Detective Technician Kirby observed a knife on the dash board of the vehicle.

associated with these images and videos may include details such as the camera used, date and time the image or video were recorded, and GPS location information.

- 24) Affiant knows from his training and experience that mobile device users can install applications that can be used to hide and even encrypt data and conceal specific data from detection. These applications are generally accessed by covert means known by the user and often require a PIN code, pattern, password, or a unique biometric feature such as a fingerprint. Affiant also knows that users sometimes hide contraband images and other content in other applications and folders such as calendars and games as a way to avoid detection. For these reasons, Affiant knows it is necessary to search all data on the device.
- 25) Affiant also knows based on his training and experience that people using mobile devices commonly keep contact lists containing names and phone numbers. Affiant knows these names and numbers can be useful in identifying possible victims, associates, suspects, co-conspirators, and other relevant individuals.
- 26) Affiant knows based on his training and experience that mobile devices commonly have Global Positioning System (GPS) and other similar geo-location sensors. These sensors may track the historical location of the device geographically and provide a historical record. Affiant also knows that these systems leave log files. Affiant knows that these log files can be recovered and used to locate a device's geographic historical location on a specific date and time. Affiant knows that this information could be used to include or exclude the user from involvement with the planning, execution, and potential post crime cover-up activities.
- 27) Affiant knows that some mobile devices may contain a Subscriber Identity Module (SIM cards) that may contain data associated with the device and user attribution such as contact lists, call logs, SMS messages, telephone number, and other user data commonly found in cellular telephones. This data can be recovered forensically.
- 28) Affiant also knows that some mobile devices may contain removable media cards. These cards are commonly referred to as SD cards or MicroSD cards. These cards can be used to store additional data associated with the mobile device including photographic images, videos, text files and other digital data. Affiant knows that additional data contained within these files may also provide dates, times, locations, settings, devices used, and user attribution information. This data can be recovered forensically.
- 29) Affiant knows that these mobile devices can be used to delete, create, share, and store files and other data including, but not limited to, documents, photographs, videos, electronic mail, search history, financial transactions and other relevant live and deleted user information. Affiant also knows that such devices can be used to communicate and instantly share information with others and that data can be transferred between various devices – wirelessly and by connected cables.
- 30) Affiant also knows that if these items are not seized and isolated from network connectivity in a timely manner, potential inculpatory and exculpatory evidence may be destroyed, transferred, encrypted, modified, or otherwise lost forever. Affiant knows that data recovered from mobile devices can be used to corroborate or refute data recovered or obtained from other mobile devices and/or from service provider records.
- 31) Affiant knows from his training and experience, that it is necessary to search live and deleted data recovered from digital devices from the time when the device was first used through the time when the device was seized. This is specifically necessary to establish associations between a

particular device and associated applications and files to a particular user (or users). This scope of time is necessary to identify potential inculpatory and exculpatory evidence during the planning, execution and post event activities of potential criminal activity. These activities may include communication, contact, calendar entries, pictures, videos, and location information (including GPS, navigation, and maps). This scope of time is also necessary to determine accurate device date and time settings, including time zone changes, and to determine if the date and time settings are correct and if they are set to synch or not synch with the network. Affiant knows from his training and experience that it is important to understand events of a particular day and time in proper context that may exist months before certain criminal acts and to attribute particular users of a device and associated applications when the device was initially setup.

- 32) For the technical reasons described, the digital evidence listed above shall be submitted for digital forensic processing and analysis by a trained forensic examiner.
- 33) That affiant is aware that the proliferation of mobile phones in society has led to the increase in their use in and connected to criminal activity; that the examination and analysis of all telecommunications equipment has become an important aid to law enforcement in the investigation of crime including their utilization of communication devices, their use of coded communications, and their use of false or fictitious identities; that affiant is also aware that in today's society, people utilize various electronic media in numerous aspects of their lives; that criminals also use a host of electronic media in facilitation of their unlawful activities and that modern and current technology relative to cellular phones permits suspects to commit crimes and store evidence of crimes in their cellular phones;
- 34) That affiant has also found it incredibly common for crime suspects to use their cellular telephones to communicate aurally or via electronic message in "text" format with co-actors and / or co-conspirators during the planning, execution and post stages of the crimes they commit; therefore records contained within said cellular telephones may provide evidence related to the identity of said co-actors and / or co-conspirators.
- 35) Affiant knows that records maintained by the service provider, specifically cell tower data, can assist investigators in determining a phone's location at the time calls are made with the phone. Therefore, affiant believes that by obtaining the information contained within the recovered phone(s) will assist investigators in linking the phone(s) to call detail records and other information being sought in this investigation through cellular phones service providers which may also document the location of the cell phones during the time period of the crime(s) described in this affidavit, further assisting investigators with identifying the actors, co-actors and co-conspirators.
- 36) That affiant has found it incredibly common for crime suspects who possess illegal narcotics and / or firearms to often take or cause to be taken photographs and other visual depictions of themselves, their associates, and the illegal narcotics and / or firearms that they control, possess, buy and sell; furthermore, that these photographs and visual depictions are typically kept and maintained on their cellular devices;

RETENTION OF FORENSIC IMAGES AND EXTRACTIONS

- 37) The government will retain a forensic image or forensic extraction of each electronic storage device subjected to analysis for a number of reasons, including proving the authenticity of evidence to be used at trial; responding to questions regarding the corruption of data; establishing the chain of custody of data; refuting claims of fabricating, tampering, or destroying data; and addressing potential exculpatory evidence claims where, for example, a defendant claims that the government avoided its obligations by destroying data or returning it to a third party.

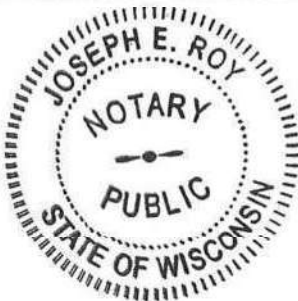

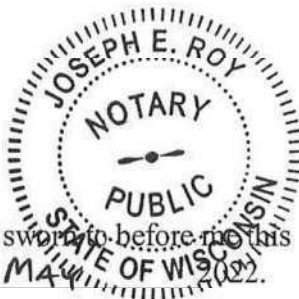

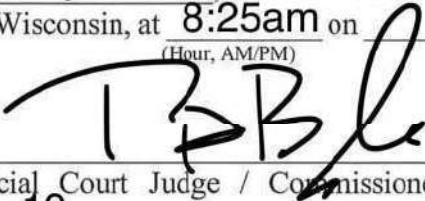

Your affiant also knows from training and experience that specialized training, software, and equipment are necessary in order to download, extract and read the data from the electronic monitoring devices described above. Your affiant knows that members of the Milwaukee Police Department, Wisconsin State Patrol, Dane County Sheriff's Department, Greenfield Police Department, and members of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) have received specialized training in the extraction of data from such devices, and has software and computers designed for this purpose. Your affiant is also aware that due to the location in the vehicle where the electronic monitoring devices are installed, that it may be necessary to remove the device from the vehicle. During the removal process the vehicle maybe damaged in order to correctly remove and process the device.
23. Your affiant states that the data from the Event Data Recorder would greatly contribute to the investigation into this incident by possibly showing the 2018 Cadillac CTS driver's speed, vehicle throttle position, brake switch information and RPM'S prior to and after the incident. The information will also be used to confirm throttle and/or brake usage at the time of the incident.
24. Your affiant further states that the data from the Infotainment and Vehicle System would likely greatly contribute to the investigation by obtaining recent destinations, favorite locations, Bluetooth connections, call logs, contact lists, SMS messages, emails, pictures, videos, social media feeds, vehicle lighting, On-Star communications, and the navigation history of where the vehicle has been, and other information which may constitute evidence of a crime, Flee/Eluding an Officer, contrary to Wis. Stat. § Flee/Eluding an 346.04(3) of the Wisconsin Statutes.
25. Wherefore, your affiant prays that a search warrant be issued to enter said vehicle to search for the items identified herein along with the items listed on the face sheet of the search warrant.

CONCLUSION

26. **LASTLY**, affiant is aware that a search warrant may be issued when the application establishes probable cause to believe that evidence connected with a crime will be found at the place or item to be searched and that probable cause supporting a search warrant is determined by the "totality of the circumstances" wherein the task of the issuing Judge is to simply make a practical, commonsense decision whether, given all of the circumstances as set forth in the affidavit, that there is a fair probability that contraband or evidence of a crime will be found in a particular place; furthermore, affiant is also aware that the Courts have determined that probable cause is not a technical, legalistic concept, but a flexible common-sense measure of the plausibility of specific conclusions; that elaborate specificity is not required and that probable cause may be supported by inferences as well as facts;
27. **WHEREFORE**, based on the above stated information, that affiant has established the requisite amount of probable cause to believe that evidence of the crime(s) of Flee/Eluding an Officer, committed in violation of Wisconsin State Statute(s) §§ **Flee/Eluding an 346.04(3)**, does now exist within the said

NARRATIVE

On 5/12/2022, at approximately 5:30am, dispatch advised that Franklin PD was in pursuit of a vehicle south on 124th St (US 45) from the Racine County Line with speeds in excess of 100mph. Dispatch advised that the vehicle was a black Cadillac bearing Wisconsin ANP-1450, there was a successful spike deployment on the vehicle and that the reason for the initial stop of the vehicle was for reckless driving.

I self dispatched myself to the call as I was in the area of STH 20 and CTH C. While responding, dispatch advised that Franklin terminated their pursuit (approximately 5:32am) and shortly after (5:33am) advised that the vehicle had crashed in the area of US 45 and Bennett Rd. I arrived on scene with Deputy Turkowski at approximately 5:35am.

On arrival I observed the suspect vehicle in the ditch line on the west side of US 45, approximately 30 yards south of Bennett Rd. The vehicle was facing south west. I observed what appeared to be a white male (later identified as the registered owner, Edgar Rodriguez via DOT photo) standing outside the driver's door and he appeared to be drinking a bottle of water. Further, I observed 2 officers on scene. Posted approximately 6-10 feet north of the driver's side tail light was a K-9 officer (later identified as Oak Creek PD Officer Raffini) with her K-9 partner. In the field to the west of the vehicle was another officer (later identified as Oak Creek PD Sgt Lootjens) with his weapon drawn, pointed at the male outside the vehicle.

I stopped short of the scene so as to not cross the line of fire of Sgt Lootjens who was providing lethal cover. I observed Officer Raffini utilize her K-9 to assist in the apprehension of Edgar. At approximately 5:35am I informed dispatch of the other agencies high risk stop and dog bite. I then drove up to the scene as lethal cover had transitioned to hands on. Sgt Lootjens began placing Edgar into handcuffs while Officer Raffini gained control of her K-9. I assisted by securing the Edgar's ankles. Due to the K-9 being utilized to assist in the apprehension of Edgar I had Deputy Turkoski tell dispatch to have rescue respond for a dog bite. At this time other officer's from the Franklin PD and Oak Creek PD also arrived on scene.

As other agencies that were involved in the pursuit had arrived on scene and had control Edgar, I

repositioned across US 45 at Bennett Rd to block traffic from entering the scene and our current working area.

As I exited my squad I observed that Edgar was staring into the sky with a "1000 yard" stare. Edgar did not appear to be in his right mind. I assisted by holding Edgar's right arm while he was being searched. Sgt Lootjens advised that Edgar had admitted to ingesting cocaine, I had Deputy Turkowski advise dispatch of this information.

Edgar's body started becoming limp. Sgt Koster of Franklin PD then administered one dose of NARCAN at approximately 5:40am. Edgar showed no signs of improvement. I then had Sgt. Lootjens assist me with sitting Edgar down on the curb. Edgar then started becoming unresponsive. Franklin PD Officer Fortier then administered a 2nd dose of NARCAN at approximately 5:42am. Edgar appeared to be breathing, but not responding verbally to us. At approximately 5:43am I advised dispatch that Edgar appeared to be seizing. Sgt Lootjens then began chest compressions as Officer Raffini grabbed her defibrillator. Edgar started breathing again, yet remained unresponsive, then had what appeared to be a small seizure, then became unresponsive again.

I took the defibrillator pads from Officer Raffini and attached them to Edgar. During the defibrillator's analyses Edgar's breathing began to sound like snoring, I had Deputy Turkowski advise dispatch of agonal breathing (approximately 5:45am). The defibrillator advised to shock Edgar (approximately 5:46am). After the first shock was delivered, Sgt Lootjens and Oak Creek Officer Hamilton began CPR. At approximately 5:46am the defibrillator assessed and advised no shock. CPR continued. The defibrillator advised no shock at approximately 5:48am, CPR continued. Shock advised at approximately 5:48am, CPR continued. No shock advised at approximately 5:50am, CPR continued. No shock advised at approximately 5:52am. Sgt Lootjens did switch positions with Officer Eisenhardt for chest compressions during CPR.

Kansasville rescue arrived on scene at approximately 5:52am and took over CPR. I then began gathering information from other departments on scene, such as their names and complaint numbers. At this time I also ran the registration and the registered owner. This is when I determined the registered owner, Edgar, was the suspect in custody by using a DOT photo.

It should be noted that Union Grove/Yorkville rescue and Franklin rescue also responded and arrived on scene while I was gathering information.

On Thursday, May 12, 2022 at approximately 7:00am, I, Deputy Schulteis was working as a uniformed deputy for the Racine County Sheriff's Office and was dispatch as a team member of the Racine County Major Crash Assistance Team (MCAT) along with RASO Deputy Arndt to the scene of a single vehicle crash on US 45/N. Raynor Avenue in the Town of Dover, Racine County, Wisconsin. I completed the crash investigation to complete the Wisconsin Motor Vehicle Crash Report and Deputy Arndt took pictures of the scene. Wisconsin State Patrol Trooper Thomson responded to the scene as part of the WSP Tactical Reconstruction Unit. Please see Wisconsin State Patrol C#22-2145902 for additional information on the crash investigation. Also see Oak Creek Police Department C#22-009179 and Franklin Police Department C#22-011115 for complete information on the pursuit and initial observations of the crash scene.

Events Leading to the Crash/Pursuit

The vehicle, a black Cadillac CTS bearing Wisconsin registration of ANP-1450, that crashed was fleeing and eluding the Oak Creek Police Department from a pursuit that was initiated in the City of Oak Creek, Wisconsin. The Franklin Police Department assisted the Oak Creek Police Department by using a set of Tire Deflation Device (aka: Spike Strip) near the intersection of Puetz Road and STH 100 in the City of Franklin. The use of the Tire Deflation Device successfully deflated the front two tires of the fleeing black Cadillac CTS. The Oak Creek Police Department and Franklin Police Department terminated there pursuit of the fleeing black Cadillac CTS near the intersection of US 45/N Raynor Avenue and CTH K/N Cape Street at 5:32am. At this point the black Cadillac CTS continued southbound on US 45/N Raynor Avenue at a high rate of speed, well above the posted speed limit of 35mph while traveling on the vehicles front aluminum wheels.

Locating Crash Scene

At 5:33am the Oak Creek Police Department and Franklin Police Department located the vehicle in western ditch line of US 45/N. Raynor Avenue, approximately 300 feet south of Bennett Road in the Town of Dover, Racine County, Wisconsin. The Oak Creek Police Department and Franklin Police Department took the operator/sole occupant, later identified as Edgar Gerardo Rodriguez, of the vehicle into custody. Rodriguez. At 5:39am the Franklin Police Department advised that Rodriguez was not acting right. At 5:40am the Franklin Police Department administered a dose of Narcan to Rodriguez. At 5:42am the Franklin Police Department administered a second dose of Narcan to Rodriguez. At 5:43am it was reported that Rodriguez began to seize, become unconscious and CPR was started. Kansasville EMS arrived on scene at 5:51am and took over care/CPR of Rodriguez. At 6:13am Kansasville EMS transported Rodriguez to Aurora Medical Center - Mount Pleasant.

Crash Scene Events

The black Cadillac CTS was traveling southbound on US 45/N. Raynor Avenue while leaving scraps and gouges on the roadway from the vehicles tires being "burned off" from being flat for a long period of time. The scraps and gouges on the roadway were left by the black Cadillac CTS's aluminum wheels and suspension components. Damage to Vehicle

The black Cadillac CTS had severe damage to front tires and aluminum wheels, front suspension components, the front under carriage, right front corner of the bumper and a piece of the right front aluminum wheel was stuck through the right front fender. It appeared most of the damage to the black Cadillac CTS was a result from driving the vehicle after the spike strips deflated the front tires, but some of the undercarriage damage and the damage to front bumper was a result of striking the concrete curb and driving through the ditch line.

ASSIGNMENT TO COMPLAINT:

On 5/12/2022 at approximately 8:15am I became aware of an officer-involved critical incident that occurred in Racine County involving Officers from Oak Creek Police Department and Franklin Police Department. The Milwaukee Area Investigative Team was requested to assist with the investigation. Detective Guenette and I responded to the Oak Creek Police Department for briefing and assignments. The Oak Creek PD case number is 22-9179. The Wauwatosa Police Department is the lead investigating agency, and their case number is 22-10012.

We received a briefing from Det. Tim Kastner of Wauwatosa PD and were assigned to interview witness officer, PO Garrett Hamilton of Oak Creek Police Department.

INTERVIEW OF OFFICER HAMILTON:

At approximately 9:33am we conducted the interview of Officer Hamilton, badge # 8146, in a conference room of the Oak Creek Police Department. Officer Hamilton, Detective Guenette, and myself were the only persons present.

Officer Hamilton was present in his duty uniform, consisting of navy blue uniform pants and shirt, with Oak Creek Police patches and badges clearly identifying him as a police officer. Officer Hamilton was also equipped with various police equipment on his duty belt, including a firearm, electronic control device, and other miscellaneous equipment.

Officer Hamilton stated he has been a Police Officer with the City of Oak Creek PD since January of 2020, and was not a police officer prior to that time. Since January of 2020, he attended the police

academy and then field training, being released to solo patrol in September of 2020. Officer Hamilton is assigned to Honor Guard but is otherwise not part of any specialized unit.

Officer Hamilton stated he currently works a 5 on 2 off, 4 on 3 off work rotation, assigned to late shift which is 11:00pm to 7:00am next day. Officer Hamilton said on 5/11 he worked until 11am on overtime, then went home and slept from approximately 12:00pm to 5:30pm, and took a nap from 9:00pm to 10:15pm before coming in for his shift. Officer Hamilton stated this is a typical amount of rest he gets on days he works overtime.

Officer Hamilton told us that he has not consumed any alcohol or drugs in the last 24 hours, is not prescribed any medication, and has no medical or mental health deficiencies. Officer Hamilton was alert and responsive to our questions.

Officer Hamilton said he arrived for his shift on 5/11/22 at about 10:45pm, wearing the current uniform and equipment we observed him wearing. He was assigned Squad 1 which is a Ford Interceptor marked police squad equipped with a light bar and a camera system. Officer Hamilton was also wearing a Panasonic body-worn camera and stated the body-worn camera was recording during this incident but he was unsure if the squad camera was recording because he did not activate his emergency lights during this event. Officer Hamilton said he did not view his body camera footage and did not sync his camera to download the footage yet.

Officer Hamilton told us he was assigned to Area 3 for his shift, which encompasses everything east of N. Howell Ave. Also assigned Area 3 was Officer Eisenhart. Officer Hamilton said that, without regard to this incident, his shift was typical and he was not involved in any significant calls for service or use of force.

Officer Hamilton said that sometime shortly after 5:00am (he was unsure of the exact time) he was in the break room at the OCPD eating his lunch when he heard radio traffic of Sgt. Loontjens reporting a vehicle passed him on W Puetz Rd at a high rate of speed. Sgt. Loontjens radioed to Officer Raffini who was further west on W Puetz Rd. He said he heard Officer Raffini observe the vehicle pass her and initiated a pursuit.

Officer Hamilton said he got into his squad and started leaving the station, and Officer Eisenhart passed by the station in his squad. He said he heard Sgt. Loontjens and Officer Raffini as they headed

west on W Puetz Rd passing S. 27th St, into the City of Franklin. He said it sounded like the suspect vehicle continued to Hwy 100 and Puetz where Franklin PD was stationed with stop sticks. Officer Hamilton said he heard Officer Raffini indicate over the radio that the suspect vehicle hit the stop sticks with at least two tires at that location. The suspect vehicle then continued south into Racine County. Officer Hamilton said he and Officer Eisenhart obtained permission to leave their jurisdiction and headed south on I-41/I-94, paralleling the pursuit, although Officer Hamilton could not recall exactly what street(s) the pursuit was taking place on. Officer Hamilton said they were not using any emergency equipment, just hustling down the interstate while tracking the pursuit as it traveled southbound parallel to them.

Officer Hamilton said at some point after entering Racine County, the vehicle increased its speed, and Officer Raffini radioed that she terminated the pursuit, pulled over to the side of the road, and then continued southbound to look for crashes. He said she radioed that she saw taillamps and a possible crash. Officer Hamilton said a few moments later Officer Raffini reported they had one person in custody, and also mentioned the suspect was acting strangely and believed the suspect may have injected cocaine.

Officer Hamilton said he arrived shortly thereafter, and observed several squads and officers on the side of the road, providing lifesaving measures to the suspect, including CPR and AED. He observed the suspect lying on his back on the side of the road, unresponsive, and he heard someone say they had already administered two doses of Narcan but there was no response.

Officer Hamilton said he recalled that the suspect was handcuffed with his hands behind his back at the time that officers were performing lifesaving measures. He said he did not remove handcuffs; they were removed at some point before Kansasville Fire & Rescue arrived, but he did not know who removed them. Officer Hamilton said the suspect was wearing clothing at that time, he just couldn't remember exactly what the clothing items were, but was certain he was wearing pants/shorts and a shirt. Officer Hamilton said he did not observe any external injuries to the suspect. He said the suspect was unresponsive throughout his contact with him; the suspect did not talk or make a statement.

Officer Hamilton said he remembered hearing conversations among officers on scene, which summarized the incident, that the suspect was ordered out of the vehicle at gunpoint, that the K9 was deployed (Officer Raffini is a K9 handler), that the suspect was taken into custody and handcuffed at his vehicle, and escorted back toward the squads, at which point the suspect collapsed and became

unresponsive. Officer Hamilton said he did not know to what extent the K9 engaged or apprehended the suspect. He did indicate that he did not use any force during this incident, and did not personally see anyone use force during this incident, as the suspect was already unresponsive and receiving lifesaving measures when he arrived.

Officer Hamilton said he obtained a bag mask and provided rescue breaths through a bag mask to the suspect. During these efforts, Officer Hamilton observed the suspect was having seizure-like reactions and convulsions. He said Kansasville Fire & Rescue arrived on scene a few minutes later and relieved him.

Once relieved, Officer Hamilton said he accompanied Officer Raffini to the suspect's vehicle to observe as Officer Raffini searched the vehicle for evidence of any drug possession, and to assist Officer Raffini in the event of an accidental inhalation. Officer Hamilton said he observed Officer Raffini locate a rolled-up \$100 bill and a contact lens case in the center console cupholder, both of which contained what appeared to be white powder drug residue inside. Officer Raffini turned these over to Officer Hamilton who maintained custody of this evidence until turning them over to Detective Mendola when he arrived on scene.

Officer Hamilton stated he did not observe the suspect, suspect vehicle, the pursuit, or any part of this incident until he arrived on scene where the suspect vehicle had come to a stop. He said the suspect vehicle was about 10 yards off the roadway, and he observed tire/wheel markings in the gravel and grass indicating the vehicle left the roadway and came to a stop a short time later. Officer Hamilton said he observed no fixed objects in the area that would have caused the vehicle to crash, implying that the suspect vehicle came to a stop and did not strike an object, and that he did not believe the suspect was injured from a motor vehicle crash.

We ended the interview, which lasted approximately 35 minutes.

This incident report will be forwarded to the Wauwatosa Police Department, the lead investigating agency in this matter.

My Body Worn Camera (BWC) was not activated during this incident. Below is a summary of events based on my recollection.

On Thursday, May 12, 2022, at approximately 7:33 a.m., I was notified by the Milwaukee Area Investigative Team (MAIT) that the Oak Creek Police Department (OCPD) had initiated a pursuit with a vehicle that concluded with the suspect being in critical condition. I was advised to respond to the OCPD, 301 W. Ryan Rd, OCPD case #22-9179. The Wauwatosa Police Department (WUPD) was the lead agency for this incident, WUPD case #22-10012.

Upon arrival, I met with WUPD Sergeant James Wood, who assigned me to interview a witness officer. The witness officer was OCPD Officer William Eisenhardt (Badge #8144). This interview began at approximately 9:30 a.m. Officer Eisenhardt has worked for OCPD for approximately 3 years. He has worked in law enforcement for approximately 6-7 years. Officer Eisenhardt is primarily assigned to patrol. He has specialized training on the ERU unit for their SWAT team. He is an FTO, K9 agitator, and a part of their alcohol and tobacco tavern check unit. Officer Eisenhardt works third shift, which is 11:00 p.m. - 7:00 a.m.

Witness Officer - OCPD Officer Eisenhardt

Officer Eisenhardt stated this incident began around 5:15 a.m. or 5:20 a.m., on May 12, 2022. Officer Eisenhardt was wearing a patrol uniform and operating a marked patrol squad during the incident. Officer Eisenhardt heard over his radio Sergeant 887 radioed that he had a vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed northbound on either S. 13 St. or S. Howell Ave. Sergeant 887 notified Officer Raffini (137) to be on the lookout for the vehicle, due to Officer Raffini being located in the area the suspect vehicle was traveling.

The suspect vehicle description was a black newer model Cadillac sedan. Ultimately, Officer Raffini was able to catch up to the suspect vehicle and initiated a pursuit. The vehicle went westbound on W. Puetz Rd. and continued westbound through the S. 27 St. intersection. sticks on the vehicle at the location of W. St. Martins Rd. / W. Puetz Rd. The stop sticks were supposedly successful.

The suspect vehicle continued westbound on W. Loomis Rd., from this location. The vehicle went southbound on S. 124 St., from W. Loomis Rd. S. 124 St. turns into Raynor Ave. and the suspect vehicle was found in a ditch near the intersection of Raynor Ave. / Bennet Rd.

Officer Eisenhardt stated that he was not directly involved in the pursuit. Once he heard the initial pursuit transmission he responded to S. 27 St. / W. Ryan Rd., in case the chase came back into the City of Oak Creek. Officer Eisenhardt asked Sergeant Loontjens (87) if they need more officers to assist in the pursuit. Sergeant Loontjens confirmed they needed further assistance and Officer Eisenhardt paralleled the pursuit, while the pursuit was on S. 124 St. Officer Eisenhardt paralleled the pursuit on I-94 southbound, until he reach HWY 20.

Officer Eisenhardt was notified that the suspect vehicle was found in the ditch at the above location and asked his sergeant if they needed more officers at the location. The sergeant requested additional officers and Officer Eisenhardt responded to the location. Prior to Officer Eisenhardt arriving on scene, he heard officers over his radio call out that the suspect was in custody and the officers also requested medical for the suspect.

Upon arrival, Officer Eisenhardt observed the vehicle in the southwest corner on the intersection in the ditch. The drivers door of the vehicle was open and there was multiple officers on scene at this time. Officer Eisenhardt believed the additional officers on scene were from Franklin PD, Racine County Sherriff's Office, and possibly a State Trooper.

Officer Eisenhardt observed two OCPD officers on scene, who were Officer Raffini and Sergeant Loontjens. Officer Eisenhardt observed the suspect for this incident, who was later identified by Wisconsin photo drivers license as Edgar G. Rodriguez M/W. Rodriguez was laying on the ground on his back, located approximately 20 yards north of the suspect vehicle. He was agonal breathing and OCPD Officer Raffini and Sergeant Loontjens were providing medical aid. Officer Eisenhardt believes Officer Raffini was setting up the AED and Sergeant Loontjens was administering chest compressions to Rodriguez.

Officer Eisenhardt began preparing a ventilator to assist with Rodriguez's breathing. OCPD Officer Hamilton (146) followed Officer Eisenhardt to the scene and also assisted by preparing the mask for the ventilator. Officer Hamilton provided rescue breaths with the ventilator and Officer Eisenhardt assisted Sergeant Loontjens with chest compressions. Prior to Officer Eisenhardt assisting with compressions he observed the AED was already

hooked up to Rodriguez and Officer Raffini was operating the AED. Officer Raffini administered two shocks per the instructions given from the AED.

Officer Eisenhardt believes he administered approximately 5-6 rounds of chest compressions. A round of chest compressions is 30 compressions. Officer Hamilton was providing two breaths with a ventilator for every 30 chest compressions given to Rodriguez.

A small medical unit with two people, possibly from Kansasville, had arrived on scene and began assisting with medical aid. After this the Franklin Fire Department arrived on scene to also assist. Officer Eisenhardt continued administering chest compressions until Rodriguez was able to be hooked up to a Lucas machine. After this Officer Eisenhardt assisted paramedics by holding up an IV bag of saline that was being administered to Rodriguez. Rodriguez was loaded up into an ambulance and transported from the location.

Officer Eisenhardt was then assigned to go retrace the pursuit route, which was approximately 16 miles. After Officer Eisenhardt completed this assignment he returned to OCPD and spoke with a supervisor and was advised to standby until he could be interviewed. Officer Eisenhardt reported that he was uninjured from this incident.

NARRATIVE

On Thursday, May 12, 2022, at 7:33 a.m., I (Detective Casey #355) was notified that the Milwaukee Area Investigative Team (MAIT) was requested to assist the Oak Creek Police Department in an investigation where their agency was involved in a pursuit, where the pursued vehicle crashed, and the driver went PNB (pulseless non-breather) shortly after. The driver of the vehicle had been identified as Edgar Gerardo Rodriguez (m/W, DOB: 7/25/2000).

Initially, I responded to the Oak Creek Police Department. I was then requested by Wauwatosa Police Department Detective Tim Kastner to respond to the Franklin Police Department to assist with interviews of Franklin Police Officers that were involved in the incident. Detective Kastner and several other investigators along with myself then responded to the Franklin Police Department.

First, Greenfield Police Department Detective Arron Busche and I met with Franklin Police Officer James R. Fortier (M/W, DOB: ■■■/■■■/1996). Also present was Officer Fortier's representative, Wisconsin Professional Police Association Business Agent Jim Schumitsch. At the beginning of the interview, I explained why M.A.I.T. was investigating this incident. I also told Officer Fortier that the interview was voluntary, and he could end the interview at any time.

Officer Fortier stated his badge #68 and he was hired at the Franklin Police Department on January 4, 2021. He had previously worked at the Town of Oconomowoc Police Department as a Police Officer from May 21, 2018, until January 4, 2021. He has no military experience. Officer Fortier went to the Police Academy at WCTC and has been trained in A.R.I.D.E and is Taser trained.

Officer Fortier works 3rd shift, which is from 11:45 p.m. until 8:00 a.m. The previous day, Officer Fortier got 5-6 hours of sleep and he stated that is normal for him. He was off-duty the day before.

Officer Fortier stated on May 11th he started at 11:45 p.m. and was assigned to Squad 128 which is a fully marked Ford Explorer and is equipped with Watch Guard video recording system. He was assigned to Area 342, southeast area. Officer Fortier was not wearing a body worn camera.

At about 5:20 a.m., Officer Fortier was in the station and heard Oak Creek Police Department Sergeant Loonjtens on the police radio that Oak Creek Officer Nicole Raffini Squad #37 was trying to catch up to a vehicle that was westbound on Puetz Road at a high rate of speed. He eventually heard that Officer Raffini was in pursuit of the vehicle and Dispatch was trying to patch the radio frequency to the Chase Channel. Officer Fortier heard the vehicle was on 51st Street southbound and then on Highway 100 westbound.

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Officer Fortier left the station and went to Highway 100 and Puetz Road to try and set up spike strips. He broadcasted several times on the radio that spike strips were deployed on HWY 100 and Puetz Road. He had known from radio transmissions that the vehicle being pursued was a black Cadillac. Officer Raffini backed off on the pursuit as she took notice of the spike strips in that intersection. Officer Fortier then saw the suspect vehicle northbound on Highway 100 and it hit the spike strips. Followed behind the vehicle was multiple Franklin squads and one Oak Creek squad.

Officer Fortier then began following the pursuit. The suspect turned westbound onto Loomis Road, then the suspect vehicle started driving southbound on 124th Street. Sergeant Koster then said to terminate the pursuit when squads were southbound from County Line Road. Officer Fortier then pulled his squad to the side of the road and got out of his vehicle.

Officer Fortier stated that Sergeant Loonjtens had caught up to the pursuit. Initially Officer Raffini continued the pursuit, but a short time later also terminated the pursuit. Officer Raffini stated she was going to check the area to see if the vehicle crashed.

A short time later, Officer Fortier heard on the radio that the vehicle had crashed. Officer Fortier drove south on 124th Street until he came upon the crash. He stated that the suspect vehicle was in a drainage ditch and appeared to have driven off the road. When he was arriving, Sergeant Loonjtens was with the suspect, and he was already handcuffed. Officer Raffini was putting her K-9 partner into her squad car.

Officer Fortier went by Sergeant Loonjtens and started to assist with the suspect. Officer Fortier observed the suspect was sweating profusely, his eyes were peeled wide open, and he appeared to be under the influence of an unknown substance. Sergeant Loonjtens asked the suspect what he took, and the suspect stated "coke." As they were trying to walk the suspect, he could not stand nor walk, and they had to hold him up. Officer Fortier suspected the cocaine may have been laced with fentanyl and could have been having an adverse reaction.

They were trying to walk the suspect to the roadway. Officer Fortier believed the suspect was standing or in an upright position when Sergeant Koster delivered one dose of Narcan to the suspect. Officer Fortier did not see a reaction from this dose of Narcan, so he delivered a second dose of Narcan nasally. At that point the suspect's condition deteriorated and he started to have convulsions. The suspect then went unresponsive. They had laid the suspect on his back and noticed that he was foaming at the mouth. Officer Fortier said that initially the suspect had a pulse. Oak Creek Officers were doing CPR and hooked up an AED to the suspect, and he was shocked twice.

Officer Fortier believed that the Fire Department was requested soon after the crash. The Kansasville Fire Department arrived later and took over medical care of

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the suspect. Officer Fortier stated from the time the suspect exited the vehicle and went unresponsive was within a few minutes, which he described as a very short amount of time.

Officer Fortier did not search the suspect's vehicle and did not observe any drugs or drug paraphernalia.

Officer Fortier stated when he saw the vehicle driving recklessly and going about 80 mph on Ryan Road, he could not see who was driving the vehicle nor if there were any other passengers. He described the suspect at the crash site as being male, White, and 20 years of age.

Officer Fortier had no further contact with the suspect. He then returned to the Franklin Police Department.

Detective Busche and myself then met with Franklin Police Officer Carlos E. Reyes (M/W, DOB: ■/■/1985). 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the pursuit and Officer Reyes became the #3 unit in the pursuit. Officer Reyes said the pursuit continued southbound on Loomis Road. An officer, who he believes was Officer Fortier, had "sticked" the vehicle and it continued to drive. The vehicle started to slow down to 50- 55 mph, so he asked Sergeant Koster if he should move up and try to PIT the vehicle. Sergeant Koster then said to get in front of him. Officer Reyes then told Officer Raffini that he wanted to pass her to get in front to PIT the vehicle. Officer Reyes then passed Officer Raffini and became the primary unit on 124th Street. Sabel. Sabel is in officer for the Franklin Police Department and has been employed by the Franklin PD since July of 2021. Prior to working for the Franklin Police Department, Officer Sabel was a police officer for the Nashville Police Department. He started working for the Nashville Police Department in 2013, and worked there up until he transferred to the Franklin Police Department.

Officer Sabel stated he works a 5-2-5-3 schedule, meaning he works 5 days, has off 2 days, works 5 days, then has off 3 days. Officer Sabel said he was in the [REDACTED] day of his 5 day work week and had just had 3 days off. The shift on 5/12/2022, was a normal shift, there was nothing out of the ordinary, and the call volume was light. Officer Sabel stated he was on a call for service on West Elm Court which is located approximately 200 yards south of the intersection of Puetz Road and St. Martins Road. Officer Sabel did not know the exact time of this call but estimated it to be between 0500 and 0530 hours. Officer Sabel said he heard one of his co-workers call over the radio and it sounded as if something significant was occurring. Officer Sabel did not remember what officer he heard on the radio and initially did not know what was going on. Officer Sable then turned his radio on "scan" mode and learned that the Oak Creek Police Department was in pursuit of a vehicle near his location. Officer Sabel cleared from the call for service on West Elm Court and began heading to the intersection of Puetz Road and St. Martins Road. As Officer Sabel approached this intersection he observed the pursuit moving west on St. Martins Road. Officer Sabel activated his emergency lights and sirens and followed the pursuit. Officer Sabel was not sure of the exact location but stated that very early on in his involvement in this incident he had heard over the radio that Officer Fortier of the Franklin Police Department had a successful deployment of spike strips near Highway 100 (also referred to as St. Martins Road) and Puetz Road. Officer Sabel stated he was the fourth squad behind the suspect vehicle and was approximately 8 to 10 car lengths behind the third squad. Officer Sabel stated Oak Creek was the number 1 squad in the pursuit. He believed the driver of the Oak Creek squad was Officer Raffini. The second squad was driven by Sgt. Koster of the Franklin Police Department and the third squad was driven by Officer Reyes of the Franklin Police Department. Officer Sabel

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stated the suspect vehicle was possibly a black Cadillac but was not sure of the model or year. The pursuit continued west on St. Martins Road towards Loomis Road where it turned southwest. The suspect vehicle continued west until it turned east onto 124th Street. Officer Sabel was not positive of the speed but stated it was under 55MPH and that a PIT (Pursuit Intervention Technique) maneuver was considered. Sgt. Koster advised Officer Reyes to move forward and attempt to initiate the PIT maneuver. Officer Sabel observed Officer Reyes move into a position where the PIT maneuver would be possible but stated that it was determined not to be safe enough to execute. Officer Sabel said the vehicle increased it's speed to approximately 70MPH at which time Sgt. Koster terminated the pursuit.

Officer Sabel advised that he immediately pulled his squad over to the shoulder of the road. He placed the squad in park, turned off his emergency lights and sirens, and exited the squad. Officer Sabel said Officer Reyes had parked his squad nearby. Officer Sabel lost visual contact of the pursuit and could no longer hear it. A few moments later he heard over the radio that the suspect vehicle had crashed. Officer Sabel stated he immediately got back into his vehicle and drove east on 124th Street. He was not sure of the nearest cross street and advised he is not familiar with this area. Officer Sabel said when he arrived on the scene of the crash he observed the suspect, who was in handcuffs, being helped to his feet. Officer Sabel said he heard someone mention an ambulance but was not aware if one had been summoned or not. Officer Sabel said he heard an officer say "he might be on something" in reference to the suspect. Officer Sabel did not know who the officer was that said this.

Officer Sabal was ordered by Sgt. Koster to clear from the scene and return to Franklin.

Officer Sabel stated Franklin Police Department does not have body-worn cameras but all squads have dash-cam. Officer Sabel said his squad's dash-cam is automatically activated when the emergency lights and sirens are in use.

This ends Officer Sabel's statement.

On Thursday 05/12/22 at approximately 07:33 CAPT. LINDSTROM of the Greenfield Police Department sent out a text message on behalf of the Milwaukee Area Investigators Team. CAPT. LINDSTROM was requesting a limited response of 10-12 team members to assist with an incident involving a vehicle pursuit initiated by an Oak Creek Police Department officer which resulted in the suspect vehicle crashing in Racine County (OCPD case# 22.009179). Furthermore the vehicle operator, later identified as RODRIGUEZ/EDGAR/G. M/W 07/25/00, was pulseless and not breathing when he was transported to the hospital. I, SGT. KARCZEWSKI, sent a response indicating I would be responding to assist with this investigation and a short while later DET. FITZGERALD also sent a response indicating he would be responding as well. Myself and DET. FITZGERALD are trained members of the Milwaukee Area Investigators Team.

Per the request I responded to the Oak Creek Police Department at approximately 08:30 followed a short while later by DET. FITZGERALD. After we had arrived on scene we were briefed by DET. TIM KASTNER of the Wauwatosa Police Department which was the lead agency for this incident (WPD case# 22.010012). Myself and DET. FITZGERALD were given the assignment of interviewing officers of the Franklin Police Department who were part of the pursuit, stop stick deployment, and arrest of RODRIGUEZ.

We then responded to the Franklin Police Department where we were assigned to interview PO WALTON and SGT. KOSTER. Prior to any interviews being conducted we were advised that the Franklin Police Department union representation, attorney ANDREW SCHAUER of the Wisconsin Professional Police Association, was in route to sit in on the interviews.

At approximately 09:45 myself and DET. FITZGERALD were escorted to an interview room where PO WALTON was waiting for us. After entering the room, and prior to beginning the interview, DET. TROMP of the Franklin Police Department entered and asked PO WALTON if he wanted union representation to which he said no. He was asked again by DET. TROMP and told that a union attorney was currently on scene and again he declined any representation. We then began the interview.

I began by asking PO WALTON what happened earlier this morning involving the vehicle pursuit. PO WALTON stated that he was leaving the station around 05:15 when he heard radio transmissions from

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Oak Creek PD reference a vehicle pursuit that was entering the city of Franklin. PO WALTON then exited onto W. Loomis Rd. proceeded to ST. Martins Rd. where he turned eastbound. He continued eastbound while thinking about where to deploy stop sticks in an attempt to slow down the suspect vehicle. PO WALTON heard that the suspect vehicle was now westbound on Ryan Rd. so he proceeded to the area of Elm Rd. and Puetz Rd. where he pulled over and parked on the side of the road. He then exited his vehicle, proceeded to the rear of it, and opened up the box containing the stop sticks. Before he could even remove them from the box, the suspect vehicle passed him still going westbound. PO WALTON then closed the trunk and re-entered his police car. He left the scene and entered the pursuit where he was the last vehicle. PO WALTON briefly crossed over into Racine County but then returned to the city of Franklin as the pursuit had been terminated thus ending his involvement with this incident.

After obtaining PO WALTON's statement I asked him some follow up questions. I began by asking him if anyone instructed him to deploy the stop sticks and his response was that he did not remember. Next, I asked him if he could describe the car that was being pursued and he described it as a black Cadillac. Upon asking him if he saw any occupant(s) when the vehicle passed him he said no. Upon asking him if he could hear anyone talking or yelling inside the car as it passed he said no. I also asked PO WALTON if he ever drove to the scene of the crash and he said no. I did ask if he knew what the speed limit was at the location where the suspect vehicle passed him and he thought it to be 50mph and also added that the suspect vehicle was speeding, however he was unable to give an estimate of its speed. In conclusion I asked him if he had anything else to tell me about this incident he said no.

At the conclusion of this interview myself and DET. FITZGERALD gave DET. KASTNER a briefing on what was said.

At approximately 11:08 we proceeded to the office of SGT. KOSTER to conduct his interview. It should be noted that attorney ANDREW SCHAUER was also present. For more information on this interview please see DET. FITZGERALD's supplemental report.

It should be noted that the Franklin Police Department does not have body worn cameras.

At approximately 12:00 we briefed DET. KASTNER on our second interview and after this briefing he cleared us from this assignment. Myself and DET. FITZGERALD then returned to the village of

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Greendale ending our involvement with this investigation.

NARRATIVE On Thursday 05/12/22, at approximately 08:30 I, DET. FITZGERALD, responded to the city Oak Creek for mutual aid request for an incident involving their agency. A short time later I arrived at OCPD and met with Wauwatosa DET. KASTNER, whose agency was assigned lead in this incident. SGT. KARCZEWSKI was already on scene and we were both assigned to respond to the city of Franklin to conduct officer interviews at their agency. Once there we were assigned to speak with both PO JOHN WALTON and SGT. MACKENZIE KOSTER. At 09:45 we met with Franklin PO WALTON. For a summary of this interview please refer to SGT. KARCZEWSKI's report. At 11:08 we met with FRPD SGT. KOSTER in his office. He was accompanied by his labor attorney Andrew SCHAUER. The following is a summary of SGT. KOSTER's accounts. SGT. KOSTER advised he works late shift, 23:45-08:00, and at approximately 05:00 he heard, via his radio (scanning other agencies) that the city of Oak Creek was engaged in a high speed pursuit that had entered the city of Franklin. At this time SGT. KOSTER was in his office conversing with PO FORTIER. Both he and PO FORTIER, along with any other FRPD squads began responding in an attempt to assist Oak Creek PD. As he proceeded from his department parking lot the pursuit had begun traveling west on Hwy. 100 towards Hwy. 36. PO WALTON and PO FORTIER set up on Hwy 100/Ryan Rd, between the area of W. Puetz Rd. and W. Prairie Grass Way, with Spike Strips. SGT. KOSTER stated he got to this area just as the pursuit arrived and the suspect struck all four of its tires over PO FORTIER's spike strips. SGT. KOSTER conducted a U-turn and caught up to the pursuit as the second vehicle behind the Oak Creek PO RAFINI's squad and began calling out directions of the pursuit. The pursuit turned left (S/W bound) onto Hwy. 36 from Ryan Rd. and speeds reached approximately 90 mph. The suspects vehicle began to shred its front tires and SGT. KOSTER had to conduct an evasive (snap) turn to avoid striking fragments of the tires. The suspect then proceeded south onto 124th St and was traveling at approximately 40-50 mph. As they proceeded past County Line Rd. (on 124th St.) PO REYES (FRPD) advised over the radio that he was going to get into position to conduct a PIT maneuver. SGT. KOSTER advised this was done as he himself was not PIT certified and PO REYES was and this was the reason for the change in position. After

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this change in position was done the suspects vehicle began to accelerate to approximately 80 mph, with both it's front tires shredded and on the vehicle rims. This led SGT.. KOSTER to determine the pursuit had reached a point that he concluded it was no longer safe and advised all Franklin officer, via squad radio, to terminate the pursuit. SGT. KOSTER advised this was in the area of 124th. St. and 5 Mile Rd. All Franklin squads pulled over to side of the road and a trailing Oak Creek PD squad continued with the lead Oak Creek PD squad and they also terminated their pursuit a short time later. Oak Creek PD advised they began to check the area after the pursuit was terminated and advised over the radio that the vehicle had left the roadway and crashed. SGT. KOSTER heard that the suspect had bailed out of the vehicle and asked Oak Creek PD via radio if they required their officers to respond via mutual aid for a perimeter and they did. Franklin squads responded to assist.

SGT.. KOSTER arrived at the scene of the crash behind other Franklin squads and observed Oak Creek PD Sgt. LOONTJENS and Franklin PO FORTIER escorting the suspect, who was already in handcuffs and walking under his own power, towards his direction. With the subject in custody, on his feet, and in no apparent medical emergency, he advised FRPD Officer RAEZ and SABLE to return back to their city. The suspect was not talking but was conscious. SGT. KOSTER advised he then noticed that, although the suspect had his eyes open, his breathing (though not agonal at this point), appeared shallow.

SGT. KOSTER began to think that the suspect was having some type of medical reaction. PO FORTIER was the first to suggest utilizing "Narcan" and SGT. KOSTER advised Oak Creek PD that all Franklin officers carry "Narcan" on their person and requested administering it. SGT. KOSTER did so while the suspect was still standing, administered one dose of Narcan in the suspect's left nostril. SGT. KOSTER said again that the suspect was still conscious but gave no reaction to him being so close to him or even being given the medication. The suspect was then gently assisted to the ground by officers and he was given another dose of Narcan. The suspect began to seize and foam at the mouth and Oak Creek PO RAFINI obtained an AED from her squad. Medical response was requested from both jurisdictions, as well as from the city of Franklin and they began life saving measures. The AED was used on the suspect in conjunction with CPR/chest compressions. Deputies from Racine and Oak Creek PD continued these CPR/Life saving measures until Med units arrived on scene, first being that of the Kansasville Fire department followed by Franklin Fire Department. With the fire department on scene they took over life saving measures and utilized a 'Lucas device" for chest compressions.

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SGT. KOSTER advised that though the suspect was initially in hand cuffs the cuffs were removed a short time after life saving measures began. SGT. KOSTER advised he went to look over the suspects vehicle and while doing so Oak Creek PO RAFINI said something about locating a rolled up dollar bill, or something indicative of drug use. Further he advised he was on still on scene when the suspect was moved into the Kansasville med unit but did not see him loaded into the rig. In preparation of leaving the scene SGT. KOSTER contacted his immediate supervisor to apprise them of the situation. Then, with it confirmed that Franklin PD assistance was no longer needed on scene, he and PO FORTIER returned to their city.

SGT. KOSTER advised he back tracked his portion of the pursuit to obtain the millage and it was 7.9 miles. Also while speaking with SGT. KOSTER he utilized his Computer Aided Dispatch system and obtained the times he called out for both when Narcan was utilized (05:40:18), CPR and AED was utilized (05:49 / two shocks given) and the first med units arrived on scene at 05:51.

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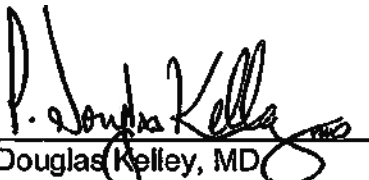

AUTOPSY PROTOCOL

Final Diagnoses:

- I. Detection of cocaine and benzoylecgonine in antemortem blood specimen (see toxicology report)
- II. Pulmonary edema, lungs
- III. Thin film of subdural blood to posterior intracranial cavity (non-space occupying)
 - A. No subarachnoid hemorrhage or contusions to brain
 - B. No skull fractures or neck fractures
- IV. Abrasion to right arm/elbow
- V. Ecchymosis to arms, possibly from medical intervention
- VI. Small linear contusions, bilateral wrists
- VII. Procurement of heart, aortic arch, corneae, pelvic bones, long bones, and tissues prior to postmortem examination

IDENTIFICATION:

Identification is made at the time of postmortem examination by means of a hospital identification tag around the left wrist. There are two identification toe tags around the right great toe.

RADIOGRAPHS:

None.

PHOTOGRAPHS:

Photographs are taken for identification and documentation.

CLOTHING/PERSONAL EFFECTS:

The body of the deceased is received unclad, having undergone prior bone and tissue procurement.

EVIDENCE OF MEDICAL/SURGICAL INTERVENTION:

There are numerous sutured incisions involving the chest, abdomen, groin, both medial legs, and both lateral arms. There are areas of red ecchymoses to both dorsal hands, both ventral wrists, and both antecubital fossae which may be associated with prior medical intervention.

EVIDENCE OF POSTMORTEM CHANGES:

Livor mortis is red-purple, posterior, and fixed. Rigor mortis is established to the jaw. It is indiscernible to the extremities due to prior procurement. The decedent's body is cool to the touch. There is diffuse green discoloration to the abdomen with some putrefactive change noted to the soft tissues around the abdominal incisions.

IDENTIFYING MARKS, SCARS, AND TATTOOS:

There is a monochromatic tattoo of the Grim Reaper to the dorsal right hand with a monochromatic tattoo of a snake to the ventral left forearm.

EVIDENCE OF TRAUMATIC INJURIES:

There is diffuse red-purple contusion to the right elbow with four abrasions to the posteromedial arm just above the elbow region. These include a 2 x 0.2 cm linear red abrasion with three linear abrasions/contusions medial to it, all running roughly in parallel. The three additional abrasions are 1.5 to 2 cm in length and 1 to 2 mm in width.

There is an area of purple contusion adjacent to the abrasions. There is a 4 cm scratch abrasion beneath the area of the elbow where the contusion is located. To the right dorsomedial wrist, there are two sets of parallel red contusions which are 0.3 to 0.4 cm apart. The first set measures 1.4 cm x 0.3 cm and the second measures 1.2 x 0.3 cm. There is a 1 cm linear band of abrasion to the dorsomedial left wrist with a 1.8 x 0.4 cm band of abrasion proximal to it. There is a 2.8 cm linear abrasion to the dorsal left hand. There is a large area of red and purple ecchymosis to the right antecubital fossa and lower portion of the upper right arm with multiple linear areas which run roughly longitudinal. Some of this ecchymosis is likely related to medical intervention. Along the anterior edge of the sutured incision to the right deltoid region are multiple curvilinear abrasions which may represent antemortem abrasion or injury from procurement. There is ecchymosis to both ventral wrist regions which is likely related to medical intervention. Additionally, there is red ecchymosis to the left antecubital fossa which is likely from medical intervention. Small areas of abrasion are noted adjacent to the anterior edge of the sutured incision to the left upper arm. These likely represent injuries from procurement. Similarly, there are faint areas of abrasion to both upper thighs adjacent to the sutured incisions which are likely related to procurement. There is a scabbed linear injury to the right upper anterior thigh.

On reflection of the scalp, there are no subgaleal hemorrhages. There are no cranial fractures. There is a thin film of subdural blood to the posterior cerebrum collecting to the posterior intracranial cavity. There is very small amount of subdural blood collecting to the posterior fossa as well. There is no evidence of subarachnoid hemorrhage or contusions to the brain. There is no evidence of injury to the cervical spine. Dissection of the anterior and posterior neck shows no significant hemorrhages to the musculature or soft tissues. It is notable that there are patchy areas of hemorrhage to the fascia of the neck and back which are consistent with postmortem changes. Small areas of similar hemorrhages are noted to the pleural and peritoneal surfaces as well as some soft tissues of the body.

GENERAL EXTERNAL EXAMINATION

The decedent's body is that of a normally-developed, well-nourished, white male appearing consistent with the reported age of 21 years. The decedent's body measures 66 inches in length and weighs 113 pounds (measured on admission to Medical Examiner's office). The decedent's hair is short and dark brown, with a short beard and mustache to the face. The corneae are indiscernible due to prior procurement. The

conjunctivae appear clear and without petechial hemorrhages, however. The nares are patent with a small amount of blood around the nares. The ears are unremarkable. The dentition is natural without oral trauma. The trachea is in the midline and there is no palpable lymphadenopathy or thyromegaly. The chest, despite the absence of the anterior chest plate, appears to have a normal anterior-posterior dimension. The abdomen is soft. The genitalia are that of a circumcised adult male with testes descended into the scrotum. The extremities, back, and buttocks are otherwise unremarkable.

GENERAL INTERNAL EXAMINATION

BODY CAVITIES:

The decedent's body is opened by means of intermastoid incisions as well as opening of the previously made incisions to the chest and abdomen. The heart, aortic arch, anterior chest plate, and pelvic bones are absent. There is an absence of the abdominal aorta and iliac vasculature as well. The long bones and tissues of the legs and arms have been procured. There is residual blood to the body cavities as a result of these procurements. No adhesions or adenopathy are found.

MUSCULOSKELETAL SYSTEM:

The decedent has undergone procurement of bones including the anterior chest plate and pelvis. The remainder of the skeleton reveals no fractures. The bone marrow of the ribs is dark red and homogeneous. The musculature of the body is red and of normal appearance throughout the body.

NECK:

There is no hemorrhage to the soft tissues or musculature of the neck. The hyoid, thyroid, and cricoid cartilages are intact. There is no lymphadenopathy and the thyroid gland is of normal size with homogeneous, red-brown parenchyma. There is no obstruction to the upper airway. There is no trauma to the tongue.

CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM:

The heart and aortic arch are absent as well as the proximal thoracic aorta. The abdominal aorta and common iliac arteries are also absent. The remaining portion of the thoracic aorta is without atherosclerosis or abnormality.

RESPIRATORY SYSTEM:

The lungs weigh 485 grams on the left and 400 grams on the right. Both lungs are red and homogeneous with diffuse pulmonary edema. There are no masses to the lungs. There are no obstructions to the lower airways. The pulmonary vasculature has a normal configuration without atherosclerosis or pulmonary emboli.

HEPATOBIILIARY SYSTEM:

The liver weighs 1,220 grams. The capsule is intact and the parenchyma is brown and homogeneous without masses or cysts. The gallbladder contains 25 mL of green bile without stones.

SPLEEN:

The spleen weighs 100 grams. The capsule is intact and the parenchyma is red and homogeneous with fair demarcation between the red and white pulp.

PANCREAS:

The pancreas has a tan, lobular parenchyma without abnormalities.

ADRENAL GLANDS:

The adrenal glands are of normal size with orange cortices and tan medullae.

GASTROINTESTINAL SYSTEM:

The stomach contains 100 mL of red fluid without food particles. The mucosa of the esophagus is diffusely purple in color but without distinct erosions or ulcerations. The mucosa of the stomach is red in color without erosions or ulcerations. The small and large intestines are unremarkable. The appendix is present.

GENITOURINARY SYSTEM:

The kidneys weigh 130 grams on the left and 130 grams on the right. The capsules strip with ease and the underlying subcapsular surfaces are red-brown and smooth. The corticomedullary junctions are distinct and there are no mass lesions to the kidneys. The ureters pursue their normal course to the urinary bladder which has a homogeneous, tan mucosa. The prostate gland is of normal size with homogeneous tan parenchyma.

HEAD/CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM:

On reflection of the scalp, there are no subgaleal hemorrhages. There are no cranial fractures. To the superior cerebral convexities, there is a very small film of subdural blood without underlying subarachnoid hemorrhage. There is a thin film of subdural blood to the left posterior intracranial cavity with a patchy distribution of subdural blood to the right intracranial cavity. There is some blood settling to the posterior portion of the posterior fossa as well. There is no subarachnoid hemorrhage or contusion to the brain. The brain weighs 1,485 grams and is soft. There is some friability to the central structure of the brain (notably the right basal ganglia) with loss of the architecture during serial sectioning). No hemorrhages or mass lesions are seen, however. There are no fractures to the base of the skull.

SPECIMENS COLLECTED:

At the time of postmortem examination, vitreous fluid (collected by the eye bank) and subclavian blood (collected by the tissue procurement organization) as well as liver tissue and gastric contents are retained. A DNA card is prepared. Representative tissues are retained in formalin.
