SUMMARY On Tuesday, September 13th, 2022, at approximately 9: 04 PM, Sherman D. Solomon (M/B ■■■/82) shot at Milwaukee Police Officers Seth Edwards, Cameron Scott, and Mark Dillman in the 1500 block of N. 33rd ST. The officers were responding to multiple ShotSpotter incidents in that area when they attempted to contact Solomon. Solomon immediately began firing at the officers, who returned fire, striking Solomon. Solomon succumbed to his injuries later at the hospital. In accordance with Wisconsin State Statute § 175.47, The Milwaukee Area Investigative Team responded and investigated the use of force. The Wauwatosa Police Department was the lead investigative agency.

On Tuesday, September 13th, 2022, at approximately 9:56 PM, I, Detective Lieutenant Joseph Roy, was notified of the officer involved shooting in the 1500 block of N. 33rd St. by Wauwatosa Police Captain Shane Wrucke. I immediately responded to the command post, located in the 3300 block of W. Galena St., where I met with Milwaukee Police Department Detective Lieutenant Wesam Yangham. Lt. Yangham provided me a synopsis of the event, a run down of what actions the Milwaukee Police Department took immediately after the incident, and a walk through of the crime scene as it was known at that time. In accordance with the Milwaukee Area Investigative Team (MAIT) MOU, and Wisconsin state law, he then turned the investigation over to me.

I briefed Sgt. James Wood and West Allis Police Detective Lieutenant Timothy Gold on the incident and we set about the investigation. Compiled in this report are supplemental reports and other documents, which describe the actions taken by members of the Wauwatosa Police Department as well as members of other MAIT agencies.

NARRATIVE

On Tuesday, 09/13/2022 at approximately 10:00pm, I (Detective Cepican) was notified that the Milwaukee Area Investigative Team (MAIT) was being activated for an Officer Involved Death in the area of N 33rd St and W Galena St.

I was asked by Wauwatosa Police Department Sgt James Wood to respond to Froedtert Hospital where the deceased subject was transported by Milwaukee Fire Department Med 6.

Detective Jeremy Bronner and I arrived at Froedtert Hospital at 10:14pm.

I met with Milwaukee Police Department Detective Michael Tanem outside the Emergency Department - Trauma Department. Detective Tanem provided information about the deceased subject. The deceased subject was identified as Sherman D Solomon, M/B, ■■■/1982. Solomon was in Trauma Bed A and was assigned the name Nevada Doe when he arrived at Froedtert Hospital.

Milwaukee Police Officer Mohammad Abdulghani was standing by with Solomon in Trauma Bed A. Detective Bronner spoke to Officer Abdulghani, see his supplemental report.

Detective Tanem turned over to me a Wisconsin Driver's License that was recovered from Solomon. The Driver's License was for Solomon.

Detective Tanem provided a brief synopsis of information he received. The Milwaukee Police Department received a "Shot Spotter" report in the area of 33rd and Galena at 9:02pm. A Milwaukee Police Department Police vehicle, occupied by three (3) City of Milwaukee Police Tactical Enforcement Unit Officers was in the area. The Officers (no known names) addressed a subject who was standing in the street, holding a firearm and discharging rounds into the air. The subject turned towards the Police vehicle and the subject fired rounds at the Police vehicle. An unknown number of Police Officers returned rounds toward the subject. The subject was struck and Officers rendered aid to the subject, identified as Solomon. Milwaukee Police Officer Abdulghani and Officer Jordon Kunya arrived on scene shortly thereafter and Officer Abdulghani took over CPR on Solomon. Officer Abdulghani rode in Milwaukee Fire Department Med 6 to Froedtert Hospital.

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Solomon was tended to by Froedtert Hospital Emergency Room Trauma personnel and was admitted at 9:41pm. Solomon was pronounced deceased by Dr Thomas Grawey at 10:00pm.

Solomon was transferred into a "quiet room" out of the Trauma Room. I stayed with Solomon in the quiet room. At 11:43pm, I recovered Solomon's belongings. I recovered the following items:

- gray Nike Air Jordan size 11 shoes - entered into evidence, under property #22-002981-1
- black Nike shorts/pants size XL - entered into evidence, under property #22-002981-2
- gray and black Champion boxer briefs - entered into evidence, under property #22-002981-3
- white Old Navy long sleeve shirt - entered into evidence, under property #22-002981-4
- gray tank top - entered into evidence, under property #22-002981-5
- pair of white socks - entered into evidence, under property #22-002981-6
- inhaler - entered into evidence, under property #22-002981-7
- Wisconsin Driver's License of Sherman D Solomon - entered into evidence, under property #22-002981-8
- 2.5 grams of off white/gray chunky substance - packaged in four (4) aluminum foil - entered into evidence, under property #22-002981-9

I made contact with Solomon's mother, M █████ S █████, B/F, █████/1963 of █████ █████ █████, Milwaukee, WI, ph #(████)-████-████. M █████ had arrived at Froedtert Hospital and was asking questions about her son. Detective Bronner and I met with M █████ outside of the Emergency Room entrance. M █████ was cooperative with us initially and stated she dropped her son, Sherman Solomon off at her niece's residence in the 2200 blk N 39th St. M █████ stated her son was wearing gray Nike shoes, black Nike pants and a white long sleeve shirt. M █████ stated shortly after she dropped her son off, her niece (D █████ W █████ - unknown spelling) called M █████ and stated "auntie, I think the Police just shot Sherman". M █████ stated she drove to the area of 33rd and Galena and saw all the Police around. M █████ stated the Police would not allow her near the scene, but told her the person was transported to Froedtert Hospital, which is why she came to Froedtert Hospital. M █████ asked if her son was gone and I told her he was. M █████ then walked away and did not want to talk to the Police and Security Officers present.

The Milwaukee County Medical Examiners Office sent the Transport team to Froedtert Hospital and Al Jenkins, M/B, █████/1984 arrived and took custody of Solomon.

At the Wauwatosa Police Department, I entered the clothes into evidence and placed them into the

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Evidence Drying Cabinet. I am trained in the use of NARK II Field Tests. I followed the printed instructions and I subjected a minute amount of the substance to numerous different test kits. There was no conclusive test as to what the substance is.

NARRATIVE**22-21034 MAIT Investigation**

This report is completed by Detective Technician Stephen F. Kirby as part of the Milwaukee Area Investigative Team (MAIT) assisting in the Officer Involved Death Investigation in the City of Milwaukee (Milwaukee case 222561703) on September 13, 2022. Wauwatosa Police are the lead investigating agency with case number 22-21034. I was assigned the responsibility of the scene investigation in coordination with the Wisconsin State Crime Lab (WSCL) Crime Scene Response (CSR) team.

Crime lab staff on scene

The WSCL CSR team was officially requested and arrived on-scene. Chief Chris Johnson was the lead investigator with Julie Avila assisting. Also on scene, as part of the CSR team, was Pamela Taylor (CSR Photographer) and Amy Rutgers (CSR Team Member).

The scene itself was protected by Milwaukee Police Officers who maintained a scene log. See their reports for details.

Additional assistance was provided for scene documentation and processing by Wisconsin State Patrol for mapping and Greenfield Police for aerial photos and video. See those reports for details.

Scene Response Scene Overview

The incident occurred in a residential neighborhood in the 1500 block of North 33rd Street which is south of West Galena Street and north of West Cherry Street. The incident started approximately mid-block and moved about 3 houses to the north and in a slight west to east track.

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On arrival the involved officer's Squad car, MPD squad 386 a black and white 2018 Explorer Police Interceptor, was parked at slight angle facing to the southeast on the east side of the roadway about mid-block. Evidence was already marked by cones and other means in the area. The final location of the suspect was on the west side of the street at the north end of the block two houses south of West Galena Street.

Scene Processing: WSCL CSR

The WSCL CSR team worked to document and recover all items of evidence in the scene. Chief Johnson retained the evidence for packaging and documentation and will be turning the items over to Wauwatosa Police as soon as possible. Those item specifics will be documented in a separate report to follow.

Note, certain emergency medical only equipment on scene was turned over to MPD at the conclusion of scene processing and not retained as evidence.

MPD Squad Camera Recovered on Scene

While conducting the scene investigation, a request from investigation Commanders was made to recover the squad camera from MPD squad 386 for data offloading for review. Once the squad was photographed, I removed the device from the squad and turned it over to Lt. Roy to pass onto MPD for the data offload.

I removed the hardwired Axon Fleet 2 camera with serial number X54004814, from squad 386. The device was intact and appeared to be pointing forward before being removed.

Milwaukee Police Squad 386 Entered to PropertyReporting Officer(s):
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I recovered Milwaukee Police Squad 386, a black and white 2018 Explorer Police Interceptor SUV with Wisconsin "Official" registration of E7782 (VIN: 1FM5K8AR5JGC76142) from the scene. I conveyed the squad to The Wauwatosa Police Department for further investigation. Personal and uninvolved police gear from the squad were turned over to MPD staff at TEU on the way to the Wauwatosa Police Station. I entered the squad as property number 22-2984-1 and secured it in evidence storage.

Suspect Firearm Status Check

The firearm recovered by WSCL CSR was identified as a Smith and Wesson M&P 40, 40 S&W caliber, semi-automatic handgun with serial number [REDACTED]. I conducted a check of the serial number and found it was not listed as a stolen gun. I conducted an ATF firearms trace (Trace# [REDACTED]) the results of which are pending.

Additional Scene Processing: Recovery of Fired Bullet

In the afternoon of September 14, 2022, I returned to the scene which was still monitored and secured by MPD. I again met with WSCL CSR staff Chris Johnson and Julie Avila.

I spoke to the homeowners at 15 [REDACTED] North 33rd Street. Scene investigation showed their home was struck by at least two fired bullets during this incident. M [REDACTED] R [REDACTED] (M/B [REDACTED]/1975) confirmed there was no bullet damage to his front porch siding under his picture window or on his soffit above the front steps before the incident. I explained our need to recover the evidence to [REDACTED] R [REDACTED] and his wife M [REDACTED] R [REDACTED] (F/B [REDACTED]-1979). They consented to the recovery attempt and signed a written consent form. The form was later scanned and attached to this case. I also recorded the consent discussion using my issued body camera. Those recordings were later uploaded to the secure EVIDENCE.COM servers. See those two recordings for details.

CSR was able to recover the bullet from the soffit. The bullet that appeared to strike the siding is believed to have fragmented and the amount of damage required to investigate if the item was

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intact and retrieve the item from the wall was unreasonable compared to the forensic value. See CSR reports for details. The recovered bullet was retained by CSR and will be turned over with the other items as detailed above.

Documentation Received from WSCL

On September 16, 2022 I received materials from WSCL regarding scene documentation. Two scale maps from Wisconsin State Patrol were received. One showed the scene area in general but without any evidence or squad cars. The second showed the same but with the squad cars in place. Both were saved to the digital secure MAIT server and Detective Bureau server under this case number.

Some initial scene photos were received as well. Those were also uploaded to the secure MAIT server and Detective Bureau server under this case number.

On 09/14/22, I made telephone contact with M [REDACTED] S [REDACTED] (F/B, [REDACTED]/63), who is the mother of the deceased Sherman Solomon. I requested to speak to M [REDACTED] in person and she agreed. Det. Stahl and I met M [REDACTED] S [REDACTED] at her residence, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED], Milwaukee, at approximately 5:00pm. M [REDACTED] was agreeable to talking in our unmarked squad car.

My department issued body-worn camera was operational during this contact. The video footage was uploaded to the secure digital evidence management system under this report number. The following is a synopsis of M [REDACTED]'s statement and not verbatim, see the video for details.

M [REDACTED] stated:

She last saw her son, Sherman, yesterday (09/13/22) around 6pm. She saw Sherman sitting on the grassy hill of the house ([REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED]) behind her's. She went over to him and Sherman asked her to drop him off because he was not supposed to be over there. Sherman is not supposed to be in the area because of a restraining order put in place by his probation/parole officer. About 5-6 years ago, Sherman had tore up her house, he broke out the windows and kicked in doors.

She drove Sherman over to her niece, D [REDACTED] W [REDACTED]'s, house, on N 39 St off of W North Ave, which is where Sherman had been staying. It was about 6:30-6:45pm when she dropped him off. Sherman seemed like his normal self.

She got a phone call around 9:30pm from D [REDACTED] and D [REDACTED] told her that Sherman may have been shot by police.

Sherman has been staying with D [REDACTED] for about 1 month. Before that, Sherman was staying with a girlfriend for a few months. Sherman just came back to Milwaukee about 3 months ago. He was released from prison in Illinois and he was supposed to be living down there. When Sherman was living in Illinois, he was in Saukville, IL. Sherman was released from prison in December.

Sherman was involved in a shooting at L [REDACTED] G [REDACTED]'s house about 1 month ago. L [REDACTED] G [REDACTED]

Yesterday when she saw Sherman, he was wearing black jogging pants, black t-shirt, white and gray Jordan's, phone on a sky blue chain around his neck.

(We showed M■■■■ the video surveillance from Mike's Foods that captured Sherman and two unidentified males on 09/13/22) M■■■■ stated that she believed she has seen the male in the dark hoody before, hanging around outside the liquor store at 35/Galena (ABC Liquor 1596 N 35 St) but she did not know his name.

When she dropped off Sherman yesterday (09/13/22) at D■■■■s, Sherman was complaining of a toothache because one of his teeth had broken off or chipped. Sherman had two single packs of Tylenol in his hand. Sherman said he was going in the house, taking a shower, eating something, taking all 4 of the Tylenol, and laying down. Sherman had called her the other night and told her that his mouth was hurting and he asked her if she had any antibiotics.

On 09-14-2022, Sgt. James Wood asked me to take fingerprint cards from the deceased in this case in an attempt to ask a Fingerprint Examiner from Milwaukee Police Department to positively identify the deceased, believed to be Sherman D. Solomon (M/B ■■■/1982). Sgt. Wood handed me an envelope that had been given to him by Detective Bradley Isaacson, who had attended the autopsy. The envelope contained 2 fingerprint cards; one with right index fingerprints (3) and one with right thumbprints (3) of the deceased. Sgt. Wood told me that Solomon's next of kin (his mother) did not want to see a photo of her son after death in order to identify him.

On the afternoon of 09-14-2022, I took the fingerprint cards to the Milwaukee Police Department Administration Building. There, I met with Fingerprint Examiner Chet St. Clair. FE St. Clair compared the fingerprints of the deceased from the Milwaukee County Medical Examiner's Office to known fingerprints of Sherman D. Solomon (M/B ■■■/1982). FE St. Clair confirmed that the fingerprints taken by MCMEO of the deceased matched known fingerprints of Solomon (MPD Bureau of Identification #292333).

I informed Sgt. Wood of the positive identification of Solomon.

Once back at the Wauwatosa Police Station, I scanned copies of the fingerprint envelope and two fingerprint cards (all bearing MCMEO case #22-06670), attached the scanned documents to this case file and then sealed the envelope and cards in plastic and secured them as evidence in

REVIEW OF NEIGHBORHOOD SURVEILLANCE VIDEO:

On 09-13-2022, Sgt. James Wood assigned me to accompany Milwaukee PD Homicide Detectives Michael Driscoll and Cassie Lindert to review surveillance video from a house in the 1600 block of N. 34 St. and to collect surveillance video from a house in the 1500 block N. 33 St. related to this investigation.

SURVEILLANCE VIDEO AT 16■■ N. 34 ST.:

Along with MPD Officers who were already at the residence, Det. Driscoll, Det. Lindert, MPD Forensic Investigator (FI) Ulatowski and I went to the upper level at 16■■ N. 34 St. to review surveillance video of the suspects in this case that had been recorded just prior to the officer involved death that occurred in the 1500 block N. 33 St. FI Ulatowski recovered video onto a thumb drive to be entered as evidence for their case related to Shot Spotter alert #81-86943.

I watched the video from the above-listed residence. The camera points west from the porch area of the house. Three M/B subjects can be seen walking southeast from the west sidewalk to the east sidewalk, north of 16■■ N. 34 St. The first subject in the group appears to match the description of the suspect/victim in this case who was later identified as Sherman D. Solomon (M/B ■■■/1982). The subject appears to be holding a handgun in his right hand and, at least once, raises it in the air and fires a round. Muzzle flash can be seen. After crossing to the east sidewalk, the 3 subjects continued walking south and out of the camera's view.

Along with Det. Driscoll and FI Ulatowski, I went to the upper level at 15■■ N. 33 St. There, we made contact with a resident, P■■■ X■■■ (M/A ■■■/1987), who had given law enforcement consent to review and recover video footage from his Night Owl brand video surveillance system. It was determined that the working exterior cameras, numbered 1, 2 and 6, would potentially have evidence related to the incident. Video footage was recovered by FI Ulatowski onto new USB thumb drives from the above-referenced cameras that had been recorded on 09-13-2022 between 8:50 and 9:15 PM. FI Ulatowski turned over to me one of the thumb drives for evidentiary purposes. One thumb drive was turned over to Det. Driscoll.

As FI Ulatowski was saving the surveillance video to the thumb drives, I was able to view some of the footage. In it, I saw the video for one of two cameras that was on the front porch of 15■■ N. 33 St. The camera labelled as channel 1 (herein after referred to as camera 1) is pointing north. The video is partially obstructed by the porch roof and trees along the sidewalk, but does show a view that reaches north to W. Galena St. In the video, I observed subjects who matched the description of those viewed on the video I had seen from 16■■ N. 34 St. at Mike's food store, which is on the southeast corner of N. 33 St. and W. Galena St. Eventually, at video timestamp 21:03:44 (9:04:44 PM) the subjects walk southwest, crossing from the east to the west sidewalk of N. 33 St., continuing south. The third subject walking south appears to be the same suspect with the handgun that had been first in the line of subjects walking south on N. 34 St. That subject can be seen holding the handgun in the air in his right hand, north of 15■■ N. 33 St. on the west sidewalk, but it is unknown if a round is fired at that time. The subjects continue walking south and when the third subject is in front of 15■■ N. 33 St., he can be seen again raising the handgun with his right arm into the air and firing at least one round into the air from the handgun. Muzzle flash can be seen. A short time after the subjects walked out of view of the camera to the south, a black and white, marked Milwaukee Police SUV can be seen driving south on N. 33 St. from W. Galena St. The solid red and blue 360 degree emergency lights are illuminated on the squad. The police SUV can be seen driving south out of the view of camera 1. A short time later, the subject who had been firing in the air came running north along the west side of N. 33 St., crossed northeast across N. 33 St. It appeared that a handgun was still in the subject's right hand. He ran out of view of the camera due to trees being in the line of sight. Flashlights can also be seen pointing toward the subject.

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The camera labelled as channel 2 (herein after referred to as camera 2) is pointing south. It is positioned next to and just south of camera 1. This video is also partially obstructed by the porch roof and trees along the sidewalk. At timestamp 21:04:13 (9:04:13 PM), three subjects are seen walking southbound along the west sidewalk of N. 33 St. in front of 15■■■ N. 33 St. Two subjects are walking almost side by side, followed by the suspect, who appears to have an object in his right hand. The suspect pauses momentarily, looking back over his left shoulder just as headlights pointing south from north of him illuminate him. The subjects then begin running south. Suddenly, the suspect turns around and begins running north along the west side of N. 33 St. As the subject is running north on the west sidewalk, his right hand is extended to the east (perpendicular to the street) in what appears to be a sidearm shooting stance. A small cloudy area can be seen that is consistent, based on my training and experience, to be the gases expelled from a firearm after a round is discharged. The suspect then runs out of the camera's field to view to the north. (This is where camera 1 shortly after again shows video of the suspect).

SURVEILLANCE VIDEO FROM 15■■■ N. 33 ST. ENTERED AS EVIDENCE:

I uploaded the surveillance video from the thumb drive onto the Wauwatosa Police Department's secure evidence management system under this case number. I entered the thumb drive as evidence and secured it in Wauwatosa Property Room locker #1.

NARRATIVE

This supplemental report is written by Detective Nick Stahl, assigned to the Wauwatosa Police Department, Detective Bureau, Early Shift.

It is being written in regard to the Milwaukee Area Investigative Team (MAIT) investigation into the fatal, officer involved shooting of Sherman D. Solomon, m/b, ■■■-■■-82, which occurred on 09-13-22 at approximately 9:06 PM, in the 1500 block of N. 33rd St. - Milwaukee Police Department Incident # 22-256-1703.

Interview Assignment:

On 09-14-22, I was assigned to conduct an interview of Milwaukee Police Sergeant, Nikhom "Nik" Lee who responded to the scene of this incident shortly after it occurred. It should be noted that my interview with Sgt. Lee occurred on 09-15-22 at approximately 3:25 PM, and was conducted over the telephone.

Sgt. Nikhom Lee background / assignment:

Sgt. Nikhom Lee has been employed by the Milwaukee Police Department for approximately 11 years and his assigned people soft # is 021485. He is currently assigned to the Early Shift as a Patrol Sergeant and works out of District # 3, located at 2333 N. 49th St. Sgt. Lee has been serving as a Milwaukee Police Sergeant for approximately 16 months.

Sgt. Nikhom Lee prior call and response to shooting scene:

On Tuesday, 09-13-22, Sgt. Lee's assigned squad number was "3210." He was dressed in full Milwaukee Police Department Uniform and was driving a fully marked Milwaukee Police Department squad - Car # 322. According to Sgt. Lee, squad car # 322 is equipped with a squad camera, however, there is no recorded footage of his response to this incident. Additionally, Sgt. Lee was not equipped with a body camera.

At approximately Sgt. Lee was dispatched to 12■■■ N. 43rd St., to conduct a Mental Observation (MO) of a subject in distress. During that call, Sgt. Lee overheard on his police radio that shots were fired in the area of N. 33rd and W. Galena St.

Upon hearing this, at approximately 9:07 PM, Sgt. Lee finished the Mental Observation call and

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"without going over the air" he responded to the location of the shots being fired. Sgt. Lee arrived in the 1500 block of N. 33rd St., from the south, within a few minutes.

Upon his arrival, he observed (3) Milwaukee Police offices rendering medical assistance to the victim / suspect, later identified as Sherman D. Solomon, m/b, ■■■-■■-82, in front of 15■■■ N. 33rd St. Sgt. Lee personally knows the (3) officers he saw rendering aid and identified them as Cameron Scott, Mark Dillman, and Seth Edwards.

According to Sgt. Lee, the aid he observed being rendered by the (3) officers to Solomon was the application of bandages and a tourniquet. As the officers were handling this, they also provided Sgt. Lee a brief description of another (2) subjects who were with Solomon and fled the scene during the incident.

In addition to coordinating other responding units, Sgt. Lee broadcast a description of the (2) fleeing subjects over the police radio. Those two subjects were described as:

Subject # 1 - a m/b, wearing a black t shirt, and black and blue shorts

Subject # 2 - a m/b wearing all black

Sgt. Lee stated that medical attention for Solomon had already been called for by the officers rendering medical assistance to him. Sgt. Lee further stated that he was not aware of any injuries to anyone else - including officers, suspects, or citizens in regard to this incident.

I asked Sgt. Lee if he observed anything in the area. He answered by saying he observed a black semi automatic handgun with a "drum magazine" lying in the street, approximately 5-7 feet away from where Solomon was being rendered aid.

Additionally, Sgt. Lee observed "multiple" bullet casings on the ground, as well as a fully marked Milwaukee Police Squad with bullet holes in it. According to Sgt. Lee, the bullet holes he observed on the police squad were in the "B Frame" also known as the "B Pillar" and the rear, passenger side window.

Sgt. Lee did not recall if any words were spoken by Solomon as he was being treated. He added that Sherman Solomon was identified by a Wisconsin Identification card that was on his person.

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This Wisconsin ID card was believed to have been located by Milwaukee Police Officer, Mohammad Abdulghani. Officer Abdulghani would also ride in the med unit with Solomon when he was transported to Froedtert Hospital.

Sgt. Lee remained the on scene commander for this incident until the arrival of the Milwaukee Police Department Criminal Investigation Bureau, other Milwaukee Police Department Command Staff, and the Milwaukee Area Investigative Team (MAIT) team, at which time, all were briefed about the incident.

Sgt. Lee remained on the scene until approximately 330 - 400 AM, when he cleared.

This report is written by Detective Jeremy Bronner of the Wauwatosa Police Department as part of the Milwaukee Area Investigative Team (MAIT) investigation into the officer involved shooting death of Sherman D. Solomon, (M/B █████/1982) in the area N 33 Street and W Galena Avenue. The Wauwatosa Police Department is the lead agency for this investigation and is documented under number 22 -21034.

On Tuesday, 09/13/2022 at approximately 10:00pm, I (Detective Jeremy Bronner) was notified that the Milwaukee Area Investigative Team (MAIT) was being activated for an Officer Involved Death in the area of N 33rd St and W Galena St. I was asked by Wauwatosa Police Department Sgt James Wood to respond to Froedtert Hospital where the deceased subject was transported by Milwaukee Fire Department Med 6. Detective Ryan Cepican and I arrived at Froedtert Hospital at 10:14pm.

Detective Cepican and I met with Milwaukee Police Department Detective Sergeant Michael Tanem outside the Emergency Department - Trauma Department. Sergeant Tanem provided information about the deceased subject. The deceased subject was identified as Sherman D Solomon, M/B, █████/1982. Solomon was in Trauma Bed A and was assigned the name Nevada Doe when he arrived at Froedtert Hospital.

Milwaukee Police Officer Mohammad M. Abdulghani was standing by with Solomon in Trauma Bed A. Officer Abdulghani stated he was one of the first officers to arrive on scene after the incident.

Statement of Milwaukee Police Department Officer Mohammad Abdulghani.

Abdulghani stated he has been a police officer with the City of Milwaukee since January 2019. He is currently assigned to District 3 and works the 4 pm to 12 am shift. Tonight, Abdulghani stated his squad number was 3230 and his People Soft Number (Employee Number) is 027117.

Abdulghani stated he heard a transmission over his police radio of officers responding to a "Shot Spotter" call in the area of the incident. Next, there was another transmission from his police radio in regards to three subjects that were eastbound. The next transmission Abdulghani heard from his radio was "Shots Fired".

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Abdulghani arrived on scene of the incident and ran over to the "Tac guys" Abdulghani stated "Tac" is how members of the Milwaukee Police Department Tactical Enforcement Unit (TEU) are commonly referred to. Abdulghani observed the TEU officers rendering medical aid to a black male, later identified as Sherman D. Solomon, M/B, 3/26/1982.

Abdulghani stated one of the TEU officers informed him there were two additional shooters that were last seen westbound from the area. Abdulghani took up a position of security as the TEU officers provided first aid to Solomon. Abdulghani stated he observed that Solomon's head faced north and feet south. Approximately three feet above Solomon's head was a black semiautomatic pistol with black in color drum style magazine. Abdulghani stated the pistol appeared to have had a malfunction due to the slide was partially ajar.

Abdulghani observed a baggie of a "gray chunky substance" on the right side of Solomon and live round next to near Solomon's legs. Abdulghani stated as the TEU officers provided first aid to Solomon, he was alert, kicking his legs and talking to officers. Abdulghani was instructed by Milwaukee Police Department Sergeant Nikhom Lee to look in Solomon's for a form of identification. From Solomon's left front pocket, Abdulghani removed a black flip style cell phone, a "fold to close" style sandwich bag that contained a green leafy material and a Wisconsin Driver License with the name Sherman D. Solomon, M/B, ■■■/1982. Abdulghani stated he observed a touch screen style smart phone on a green lanyard around Solomon's neck.

Abdulghani stated he was instructed by Milwaukee Police Department Sergeant Tyler Kirkvold to escort Solomon in Milwaukee Fire Department Med Unit 6 to Froedtert Hospital. Abdulghani stated while Med Unit 6 traveled to Froedtert Hospital, Solomon became unresponsive, pulseless non-breathing and was pronounced deceased shortly after arrival. Abdulghani stated from the time he arrived to the scene and encountered Solomon until the time he became unresponsive, Solomon's only statements were about his difficulty breathing.

Detective Jennifer Toepfer of the City of Brookfield Police Department accompanied me to Milwaukee Fire Department Station 32 on 09-16-2022 at 10:00 AM to interview fire department personnel who responded to and provided patient care to Sherman D. Solomon (M/B ■■■/1982) on 09-13-2022, just after 9:00 PM in the 1500 block N. 33rd St. Also present for the interviews, per MFD policy, was MFD Battalion Chief Brian Gardner (Battalion Chief 10).

09/13/2022**STATEMENT OF LT CRAIG IHLENFELD (STARTING AT 10:05 AM ON 09/16/2022):**

Lt. Ihlenfeld said he was the Fire Officer in Charge of Engine 32 on 09-13-2022. Just before 9:00 PM, he was working in his office at Milwaukee Fire Department (MFD) Station 32. Sometime just after 9:00 PM, he heard pops and, based on his experience, he knew those sounds to be gunfire. He went to tell the crew that he believed they would be responding to a shooting soon.

Engine 32 was dispatched to the area of N. 33rd St. and W. Galena St. for a report of an Officer Involved Shooting. On their arrival on scene, Lt. Ihlenfeld observed a bloodied subject on the ground on the east side of N. 33rd St., south of W. Galena St., whom they determined to be their only patient. The subject was handcuffed behind his back and Milwaukee Police Department (MPD) Officers were rendering first aid to the subject. He heard officers trying to reassure the patient, saying "We got you. We got you." The officers were trying to calm the patient. Officers told MFD personnel that the patient's leg was messed up.

MPD Officers had applied a tourniquet to the patient's upper right leg. The tourniquet placement and application appeared to be appropriate based on Lt. Ihlenfeld's training.

The patient was saying, "I got asthma. I got asthma." over and over. There was a lot of blood on the ground and around the patient. One of the police officers was holding pressure on the patient's right flank. Lt. Ihlenfeld also observed a distinct deformity to the patient's right thigh. He directed his crew to perform a rapid trauma assessment of the patient and told Firefighter Keith Jefferies to listen to the patient's lung sounds (with a stethoscope). The crew also tried to use a pulse oximetry (pulse ox) machine to determine the amount of oxygen in the patient's blood, but the patient was moving around a lot and trying to get up.

Because HEO/PFR Christman is a paramedic, he was trying to establish IV access on the patient, but could not because of how much the patient was moving around.

Police pointed out to Lt. Ihlenfeld the patient's handgun near the curb east of the patient, but within arms' reach. They also pointed out a fired cartridge casing in the street and the patient's personal property, including what Lt. Ihlenfeld believed to be drug paraphernalia.

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After trying to sit up multiple times, the patient then began also rolling from side to side, making it very difficult for treatment of the patient. MPD Officers were trying to calm the patient, telling him they needed him to stay still so that the MFD personnel could help him. It didn't seem to help and the patient continued moving around.

Lt. Ihlenfeld said his job at the Lieutenant on the engine was to stand back, view the overall scene, direct his crew, take notes/write the report and be the "clean hands guy", meaning that he kept his hands free of the patient's blood and body fluids so that he could retrieve medical equipment for the rest of his crew without contaminating sterile equipment in their bags.

A MPD Sergeant on scene gave Lt. Ihlenfeld the patient's name and date of birth for his report. Lt. Ihlenfeld gave his name and the names of the rest of Engine 32's crew to the MPD Sergeant. He also asked the sergeant for the caliber firearm(s) with which the patient was shot, if any other suspects were injured and/or if there were any injured officers. He learned that the patient was shot with 9mm handgun ammunition and that there were no other patients known to police at the time. The MPD Sergeant also told Lt. Ihlenfeld that officers were in the area because they had been dispatched to a Shot Spotter alert, that the officers were fired upon by the patient and that they returned fire, striking the patient.

When Engine 32 first arrived on scene, the patient was alert and oriented.

When MFD Med 6 (paramedic ambulance 6) arrived on scene, Lt. Ihlenfeld gave a patient report to Med 6 Lt. Cambronero. The patient was quickly loaded into the ambulance and transported to Froedtert Memorial Lutheran Hospital. HEO/PM Christman and FF Jefferies rode in the back of Med 6 with the patient, the two-person crew of Med 6 (Lt. Cambronero and FF/PM Newborn) and a MPD Officer. Lt. Ihlenfeld drove Engine 32 to Froedtert, following Med 6, so he is unaware of the patient care and patient condition after he was loaded into Med 6.

I asked Lt. Ihlenfeld if he saw or heard anyone else near the scene during patient treatment. He said that people were on the porch of a house on the east side of N. 33rd St., just east of the patient's location. He overheard them saying, "Dudes were blasting. Cops showed up and got him." Lt. Ihlenfeld described the people on the porch as calm and just having a conversation.

09/13/2022**STATEMENT OF HEO/PFR BRIAN CHRISTMAN (STARTING AT 10:31 AM ON 09/16/2022):**

HEO Christman said that he was assigned as the Heavy Equipment Operator or HEO on Engine 32 on 09-13-2022. He explained that the HEO is the driver and pump operator on a fire engine. He said that he is also a PFR (Paramedic First Responder). As a PFR, HEO Christman is primarily responsible for patient care on medical calls until an ambulance arrives.

On 09-13-2022, just before 9:00 PM, HEO Christman was taking trash and recycling outside from MFD Station 32. While outside, he clearly heard a lot of gunfire, yelling and sirens. He knew that it was likely that they would be dispatched to a call for a shooting soon. He went back inside and started to make his way to Engine 32 in anticipation of being toned out for a call. A short time later, Engine 32 was dispatched to a shooting on N. 33 St. near W. Galena St.

HEO Christman drove Engine 32 out of the station, north on N. 30 St., west on W. Galena St. and came to a stop at N. 33 St. There, he observed yellow police line up, blocking the streets. The crew of Engine 32 made their way south on N. 33 St. to the east side of the street in the 1500 block. Milwaukee Police Officers were with their patient (Solomon), who had been handcuffed behind his back. Officers had applied a tourniquet to the patient's upper right leg, which had an obvious deformity. The patient was flailing around and kept trying to get up. Officers were trying to verbally calm the patient, telling him he needed to remain still so that they could help him. Officers had been trying to apply bandages to the patient's right side, which is where he was wounded by gunfire, but the patient was moving too much and also kept pulling the bandages off.

HEO Christman said he observed gunshot wounds to the patient's right thigh, right lateral abdomen and an abrasion to his left shoulder. He said assessing the patient was very difficult because he was fighting everything he and the rest of his crew were trying to do. The patient was conscious and speaking while they were on scene. His speaking was making sense, but he was ignoring their questions being asked to assist in providing medical care. The patient kept saying that he has asthma and was having a hard time breathing.

An officer told HEO Christman to watch out for a firearm that was about 2-3 feet from the suspect's left shoulder, near the east curb.

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HEO Christman assessed the patient's lung sounds by auscultation (using a stethoscope) and his lungs were clear. The assessment of the patient was a group effort. While on scene, HEO Christman was trying to obtain IV access on the patient, but he couldn't, partially because of how much the patient was moving around. When Med 6 (the Milwaukee Fire Department Paramedic Ambulance assigned to the call) arrived on scene, HEO Christman told Milwaukee Police Officers that they would need to move the handcuffs from behind the patient's back to the rails of the cot so that they could continue to provide patient care. They did and the patient was moved from the ground onto the cot and then wheeled into the back of Med 6. At this point, the patient was less responsive, but still alert.

HEO Christman, the patient, a Milwaukee Police Officer, Firefighter Jefferies and the crew of Med 6 were in the back of Med 6. Firefighter Smith drove Med 6 to Froedtert Memorial Lutheran Hospital.

Due to the patient's flailing around, the crew gave up on putting bandages on his wounds and instead held direct pressure on the gunshot wounds. IV access was finally gained on the patient's right arm. About halfway to the hospital, HEO Christman noticed a change in the patient's heart rate and heart rhythm. The patient became completely unresponsive. A bag valve mask (BVM) was used to assist the patient in breathing as he had insufficient respirations. The patient's heart also stopped, so the Lucas device was attached to the patient to give him chest compressions. Once it was attached, the Lucas device ran continuously until care was transferred to Froedtert Hospital medical staff, except for a brief pause to reposition the device. MFD personnel attempted to insert an advanced airway device into the patient, but it was not possible because his jaw was clenched tightly.

Once Med 6 arrived in the ambulance bay at Froedtert, the crew started removing monitor wires from the patient, but the Lucas device continued working and they continued ventilating the patient with the BVM. The patient was wheeled on the cot into the trauma room at Froedtert and placed on bed A in the trauma room, where he was turned over to the care of hospital staff. HEO Christman did not stay in the trauma room to watch the resuscitation efforts.

On scene, HEO Christman did not see or hear any citizens. The only conversation HEO Christman heard from MPD personnel, other than the warning about the firearm in the street, was related to patient care.

STATEMENT OF FF MARCUS SMITH (STARTING AT 10:50 AM ON 09/16/2022):

Firefighter Marcus Smith said that he was assigned as the Senior Firefighter on Milwaukee Fire Department Engine 32 on 09-13-2022. Just before 9:00 PM on 09-13-2022, FF Smith was in Station 32's day room and was watching tv and talking on the phone. He heard gunshots and he knew that HEO/PM Christman was outside taking out the trash, so he checked to be sure Christman was ok.

Shortly after hearing shots, Engine 32 was toned out for an officer involved shooting on N. 33 St., just south of W. Galena St. When they arrived on scene, FF Smith observed that the patient (Solomon) was handcuffed, a little combative and was saying he couldn't breathe.

The patient had gunshot wounds to the abdominal area and right leg. Milwaukee Police Officers had applied a tourniquet to the patient's right leg. When they rolled the patient on his right side to check for wounds, blood began pouring out his body. FF Smith tried to put an occlusive dressing on the patient's abdominal wound, but it didn't stay on because of the amount of blood and because the patient kept pulling it off.

FF Smith went with FF/PM Newborn of Med 6 to get the cot out of Med 6. After the patient was loaded in Med 6, FF Smith moved Engine 32 so that Med 6 could be driven through to transport the patient to the hospital. FF Smith drove Med 6 to Froedtert Hospital. When he first started driving west on W. Galena St., FF Smith did not drive with the siren activated. When he got to N. 35 St., FF Smith activated Med 6's emergency lights and siren and then drove south on N. 35 St. from W. Galena St. to W/B W. Wisconsin Ave. and to Froedtert Hospital's ambulance bay. FF Smith could not tell much about patient care, but did hear when the Lucas device was applied to the patient to begin chest compressions.

Regarding his observations on scene, FF Smith said he did not see or hear any citizens, he thought he may have seen a gunshot wound opposite the patient's femur injury and he did not hear any Milwaukee Police personnel say anything.

STATEMENT OF FF KEITH JEFFERIES (STARTING AT 11:02 AM ON 09/16/2022):

Firefighter Keith Jefferies said that he was assigned as a Firefighter on Milwaukee Fire Department Engine 32 on 09-13-2022. Just before 9:00 PM on 09-13-2022, FF Jefferies was in Station 32's apparatus bay. He heard 2 gunshots, followed by a pause and then several more gunshots. FF Jefferies went into the station's kitchen and asked HEO Christman if the noises he had just heard were gunshots. HEO Christman said yes. A short time later, Engine 32 was toned out to respond to N. 33 St. just south of W. Galena St. for an officer involved shooting.

When they arrived, FF Jefferies got the airway and trauma medical bags from Engine 32 and walked to the patient, who was being treated by Milwaukee Police Officers. FF Jefferies put a nonrebreather oxygen mask on the patient, but he wouldn't tolerate it and kept shaking his head from side to side to knock it off of his face. FF Jefferies then tried to obtain a blood pressure from the patient's arm by using the automatic blood pressure cuff, but it did not seem to be able to read a blood pressure. He continued helping by being one of the "clean hands" personnel, meaning that he wasn't touching the patient or any blood so that he could grab supplies for other personnel. He was grabbing tape and occlusive dressings for FF Smith. FF Jefferies then tried to obtain a blood pressure from the patient manually (with a manual BP cuff), but couldn't because the patient was moving around too much. He then assisted in loading the patient into Med 6.

FF Jefferies was about to move Engine 32 so that Med 6 would be able to get through to transport the patient to the hospital, but FF Smith ended up moving Med 6. FF Jefferies held pressure on the patient's abdominal wound, showing that he was squeezing his abdomen and back.

FF Jefferies said that the patient was initially very verbal on scene, telling MFD personnel that he was in pain, where he had been shot and that he had asthma. Once the patient had been loaded into Med 6, he became less responsive. Once they had transported the patient about 1/2 of the way to Froedtert Hospital, he went PNB (pulseless nonbreathing), so the MFD personnel in the back of Med 6 attached the Lucas device to begin chest compressions. They also tried to insert an oral airway into the patient's mouth, but they couldn't because his jaw was clenched.

FF Jefferies said that no one from Milwaukee Police talked directly to him, but a message was

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conveyed to him to be careful of the patient's blood and firearm, which was a handgun on the ground near the east curb of N. 33 St. He said he did see the patient's handgun, which had a drum magazine attached. He saw people on a porch near the patient's location in the street, but he did not hear whether or not they said anything. FF Jefferies did not stay in the trauma room during hospital staff treatment of the patient. -END OF INTERVIEW OF FF KEITH JEFFERIES AT 11:13 AM- Regarding the crew of Milwaukee Fire Department Med 6, Lt. Gabriel Cambronero was interviewed on 09-16-2022, but Firefighter/Paramedic Josh Newborn was not working, so he was interviewed on 09-22-2022. <u>STATEMENT OF LT GABRIEL CAMBRONERO (STARTING AT 11:15 AM ON 09/16/2022):</u> Lt. Cambronero said he was assigned as the Officer (boss) on Med 6 on 09-13-2022. As such, he was the person charged with ALS (Advanced Life Support) care for patients on any calls to which Med 6 was dispatched. Just after 9:00 PM on 09-13-2022, Med 6 was dispatched to N. 33 St. near W. Galena St. for a report of an officer involved shooting. When they arrived in the area, it was difficult for Med 6 to gain access to the scene because Milwaukee Police squads were blocking entry to the area. When he reached the patient (Solomon), Lt. Cambronero saw that he was already in the care of Milwaukee Fire Department Engine 32's crew and officers of the Milwaukee Police Department. The patient was conscious and alert when Med 6 arrived, saying that he couldn't breathe. Lt. Cambronero saw that a tourniquet had been applied to the patient's right leg and that the patient was bleeding from his right flank (side). MFD personnel tried to give the patient oxygen, but he wouldn't tolerate the oxygen mask. None of the dressings they tried to apply to the patient's gunshot wounds would stick because of excessive bleeding and sweating and because he was moving around so much. The patient was eventually given two IV's (right and left antecubitals, which are the areas on the inside of a person's elbows between lower and upper arm). The patient was only given normal saline solution and no medications were given by Milwaukee Fire Department Paramedics. Once		
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the patient was moved into Med 6, Lt. Cambronero estimates they were stuck on scene for about 2 minutes because of MPD squads blocking their exit.

Present in the back of Med 6 while transporting the patient to the hospital were Lt. Cambronero, FF/PM Newborn, HEO Christman, FF Jefferies and a Milwaukee Police Officer. FF Smith drove Med 6 to Froedtert Hospital. Initially, the patient's pulse rate was 130 beats per minute (bpm), then 80 bpm and then 70 bpm. As this change was occurring rapidly, Lt. Cambronero recognized that the patient was "going downhill" fast. The patient's heart eventually stopped beating and MFD personnel attached the Lucas device to the patient to give him chest compressions. This occurred shortly after a BVM was used to give the patient artificial respirations.

Once at the Froedtert Hospital trauma room, Lt. Cambronero gave a patient report to the attending emergency/trauma physician and nursing staff. He did not stay in the trauma room during patient treatment by hospital medical staff. Lt. Cambronero was not in the room when the doctor pronounced the patient deceased.

On scene, Lt. Cambronero did not hear anything that was said by Milwaukee Police Department personnel. The patient's shirt was removed on scene. His pants and underwear were removed in the back of Med 6. While they were treating the patient on the scene, Lt. Cambronero did see a small crowd of citizens nearby, but they were calm and he did not hear them say anything. Med 6 responded to the scene from their quarters at Station 21 (2050 N. Palmer St.). When responding to the scene, FF/PM Newborn was driving. He said FF/PM Newborn will next work on 09-22-2022.

On 09-22-2022 at 9:00 AM, Detective Jennifer Toepfer of the City of Brookfield Police Department accompanied me to Milwaukee Fire Department Station 21 to interview the last fire department personnel who responded to and provided patient care to Sherman D. Solomon (M/B [REDACTED]/1982) on 09-13-2022, just after 9:00 PM in the 1500 block N. 33rd St. Also present for the interview, per MFD policy, was MFD Battalion Chief Ronald Firnrohr (Battalion Chief 10).

STATEMENT OF FF/PM JOSH NEWBORN (STARTING AT 9:00 AM ON 09/22/2022):

Firefighter/Paramedic Josh Newborn said that he was the paramedic assigned to Med 6 on 09

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-13-2022. Just after 9:00 PM on 09-13-2022, Med 6 was dispatched, along with Engine 32, to N. 33 St., just south of W. Galena St. Med 6 responded from Station 21 (Med 6's assigned quarters/station). When they arrived on scene, getting the ambulance into the area was somewhat difficult because of the location of parked Milwaukee Police squads.

PM Newborn said that when he arrived on scene, Lt. Cambronero went to meet with the crew of Engine 32 while he grabbed the medical bags and cot from Med 6. When he arrived at the patient's location, PM Newborn saw that the patient (Sherman Solomon) was flailing around a lot. The PFR (HEO Brian Christman) could not secure IV access in the patient's arm. PM Newborn believes this was mostly because Solomon was flailing around so much. PM Newborn had to hold Solomon down while treatment and assessment occurred. PM Newborn tried to give Solomon oxygen via a nonrebreather mask, but Solomon would not tolerate it and ripped the mask off, even with his hands handcuffed behind his back.

About 8-10 minutes into their transport of Solomon to Froedtert Hospital, Solomon began to decompensate quickly, went unresponsive and his heart stopped. As a result, the fire department personnel needed to attach the Lucas device so that mechanical chest compressions could be done. PM Newborn tried to insert an advanced airway into Solomon, but Solomon's jaw was clenched tightly and he could not manually open Solomon's mouth. The total transport time from scene to Froedtert Hospital was about 12 minutes.

Present in the back of Med 6 during the transport of Solomon to Froedtert Hospital were Lt. Cambronero, HEO Christman, FF Jefferies, PM Newborn and an unknown Milwaukee Police Officer and FF Smith drove Med 6 to Froedtert.

PM Newborn said that he did not see or hear any citizens when he was on scene. He did not hear Solomon say anything, nor did he hear anyone from Milwaukee Police Department say anything.

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NARRATIVE**Oak Creek PD Canvas Reports**

On Thursday, September 22nd, 2022, I, Det. Lt. Joseph Roy, received two reports from Oak Creek Police Lieutenant Andrew Thorne.

The reports by OCPD Sergeant Georgina R. Wettengel, and Detective Gary Schneider, detail their actions in the canvas of the 1500 block of N. 33rd St., portions of the 1600 block of N. 33rd. St., and portions of the 3300 block of W. Galena St.

Of note in their report, Det. Schneider references speaking with M■■■■ R■■■■ at 15■■ N. 33rd St. R■■■■ told Det. Schneider that he had some video that might have captured the suspects. Schneider indicates that the video was emailed to Wauwatosa Police Sergeant James Wood (who Schneider refers to as Sgt. Hunter). See Sgt. Wood's report for details of the video.

The reports were attached to the case and placed in the MAIT folder on the secure server.

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NARRATIVE

On 09/15/22, I (Sgt. James Wood) received reports from the West Milwaukee Police Department (WMPD). The reports were completed by Detective Brian Chic and Officer Brandon Makouske. Their reports detail video surveillance from Mike's Food Store, 1556 N. 33 St., and a statement from the store's employee, M■■■■■■ H■■■■■■.

Officer Makouske detailed the video footage from Mike's Food Store in his report. The video's timestamp is approximately 17 minutes slower than the actual time. Officer Makouske obtained verbal and written consent from the owner to remove the store's DVR. MPD Forensic Analyst, Shaunku Mays, downloaded the video from the store's DVR and provided Officer Makouske with a copy of the video.

Of note from the video, Officer Makouske detailed the following:

- **8:57:24 p.m.** (8:40:24): two younger black male subjects (**Msub8** and **Msub9**) walk into the store briefly turning around and walking back out.

- **8:57:36 p.m.** (8:40:36): a middle aged black male subject wearing a white long sleeve shirt with the lettering "Old Navy" with a bear imprinted on the front chest, black pants, and a cellphone on a blue lanyard (**Msub10**) walked into the store. It is believe based on the audio the subject stated "oh you guys are closed" to H■■■■■■. The subject then walks out of the business.

As **Msub10** walks into the business he can be seen lifting up his shirt from the bottom lifting it over an object which was tucked in his right side waistband. As **Msub10** continued to walk into the business a large bulge can be observed on his right side abdomen under his shirt. The object prints a large portion of **Msub10's** shirt causing his shirt to be pulled away from his abdomen.

- **8:57:42 p.m.** (8:40:42): **Msub9** can be seen standing on the sidewalk just outside the front of the business and as **Msub10** exited the store **Msub9** walks out of camera view to the south

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following **Msub10**.

- **8:58:18 p.m.** (41:18): 1 single gun shot can be heard

- **8:58:18 p.m.** (41:18): 1 single gun shot can be heard

- **8:58:21 p.m.** (8:41:21): a police squad car can be seen turning south onto N. 33rd Street from W. Galena Street. Shortly after, red and blue lights can be seen in the store windows reflection. At this time, Harrington is behind the service counter actively counting money from the cash register.

- **8:58:24 p.m.** (41:24): tires squealing and 1 gun shot can be heard

- **8:58:28 p.m.** (41:28): police sirens can be heard

- **8:58:28 p.m.** (8:41:28): H [REDACTED] looks around out the store front windows as if something had caught her attention. Still actively counting money.

- **8:58:30 p.m.** (41:30): multiple gun shots (7-8 rounds) can be heard

- **8:58:32 p.m.** (8:41:32): H [REDACTED] moves to the floor to take cover

- **8:58:33 p.m.** (41:33): multiple gun shot rounds can be heard in succession along with verbal commands being yelled

It should be noted that the times in parentheses are the store video's time stamp and times in bold are the approximate actual times they occurred.

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Det. Chic interviewed Mike's Food Store employee, M [REDACTED] H [REDACTED]. H [REDACTED] heard the gun shots but did not see what happened.

Det. Chic provided me with screen shots of the video, still images of customers from the store, and the store video which were saved to evidence.com.

Of note, Spc. Ross made contact with the occupant, M■■■■ R■■■, of 15■■■ N. 33 St. R■■■ stated that he was home during the time of the incident. R■■■ stated that he could "feel" the impact of bullets impacting the front of his residence. He saw emergency lights from a Milwaukee Police Department marked squad car.

I was teamed up with Investigators Steven Bacon, Mason Kohlhapp, and Nathan Spittlemeister, from the Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office, and our assignment was to canvass residences on the west side of N. 33rd St.

This supplemental report is in regard to a canvass of the residence located at 15■■ N. 33rd St. / Upper level. This residence is located on the s/w corner of 33rd and W. Galena St. and is a duplex. The lower level is reportedly vacant. This residence is not equipped with any surveillance cameras.

The (2) persons reportedly living in the upper level at this address were identified as J■■■■■■■■. F■■ m/b, ■■■-■■-83 and B■■■■■■■■. C■■, f/b, ■■■-■■-89. Upon making contact with F■■ and C■■, it was suspected that both were highly intoxicated by alcohol as they were loud, unsteady on their feet, slurring their words, and were essentially uncooperative.

Each were separately asked if they saw or heard anything regarding the shooting that occurred earlier. F■■ advised that he was inside and didn't hear anything. C■■ stated that she was also inside and that she heard shots but didn't see anything. Neither had anything else useful to add.

This report is written by Wauwatosa Police Det. Martin Keck, currently assigned as an investigator on the Milwaukee Area Investigative Team (MAIT). This report pertains to the officer involved shooting death of Sherman D. Solomon (M/B ■■■/82), which occurred in the City of Milwaukee on 09/13/22. The Wauwatosa Police Department is the lead investigating agency for this case.

INTERVIEW OF INVOLVED OFFICER MARK DILLMAN

On Friday, 09/16/22 at 10:00am, I conducted an interview of Milwaukee Police Officer Mark Dillman (Milwaukee Police People Soft #018112). The interview took place in a conference room located at Cermele & Matthews law office, 6310 W. Bluemound Rd., Milwaukee. Investigative personnel present during the interview were Wauwatosa Police Det. Kelly Zielinski, Wauwatosa Police Det. Lt. Joseph Roy and Brookfield Police Det. Sgt. Josef Sabre. Attorney Matthews was also present during the interview. Prior to the interview starting, P.O. Dillman was asked if he wanted the interview recorded and he stated he did not.

P.O. Dillman did not discuss this shooting or incident with anyone other than his attorney, besides the public safety statement he gave on scene. Additionally, P.O. Dillman advised he had not viewed any of the body worn camera footage or other evidence collected during this investigation.

GENERAL BACKGROUND

P.O. Dillman grew up in Hubertus, WI. He graduated from Hartford High School in 1991. He attended college at the Milwaukee Institute of Art and Design from 1991 through 1996. In 1996 he graduated with a diploma.

From 1996-2006 P.O. Dillman worked at American TV in Waukesha where he worked on car stereos and various electrical work.

P.O. Dillman is single and does not have any children.

P.O. Dillman does not use drugs and does not drink alcohol.

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At the end of 2006 P.O. Dillman went to the Milwaukee Police Academy. He was hired on 12/18/06 and graduated the academy in 2007. After finishing the police academy, P.O. Dillman went to District 5 where he served as a patrol officer. After approximately three years as a patrol officer, P.O. Dillman was assigned as a "Violent Crimes Car" in District 5, responsible for pro-active police work. In December 2021, P.O. Dillman was assigned to the Milwaukee Police Tactical Enforcement Unit (TEU). P.O. Dillman explained that thirty-six people applied for TEU, seven of which passed and three of which were selected.

P.O. Dillman expressed that he has been a pro-active police officer his entire career. He explained that he has been in hundreds of foot pursuits, vehicle pursuits and responded to many high-risk calls. He advised he has consistently and continuously arrested individuals for violent crimes and firearm related offenses.

ADDITIONAL TRAINING

In addition to his required training as a police officer for the City of Milwaukee, P.O. Dillman was trained as a rifle operator when patrol rifles were introduced to patrol. He also attended a course on identifying armed subjects that was presented by a federal law enforcement agency.

LAW ENFORCEMENT RECOGNITION

During his career, P.O. Dillman explained he has received nine formal awards / recognition for actions he took in his role as a police officer. He received four live saving awards, three meritorious arrest citations and was recognized two times for excellence in policing.

CURRENT ASSIGNMENT

P.O. Dillman explained that in his current assignment as a member of the Tactical Enforcement Unit, he reports for duty at SPD (Specialized Patrol Division), located at 4715 W. Vliet St. He is currently assigned to the Early Shift with his normal work hours from 4pm to 12am.

As a member of TEU, he assists with search warrants executed by the police department and any tactical situation or call. He attends additional, regular tactical training. When not training, executing search warrants or dealing with tactical situations, TEU officers assist patrol. They assist patrol throughout the City but focus their efforts in high crime areas. TEU officers respond to "Priority 1 calls" including robberies, shootings and shots fired incidents. TEU officers typically patrol in two

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-man cars, but if there is an odd number of officers working a shift, they deploy a three-man car for that shift. <i>ACTIVITIES PRIOR TO SHIFT</i> On 09/13/22 P.O. Dillman woke up sometime between 9am and 10am. He had a typical night of rest. P.O. Dillman did not work on 09/12/22 and 09/13/22 was the first day of his work week. P.O. Dillman worked out prior to his shift. <i>ON DUTY ACTIVITIES ON SEPTEMBER 13TH 2022</i> P.O. Dillman reported to duty early on 09/13/22 because he had to testify at Prelim Court. After testifying in person at court, he went back to SPD. He arrived at SPD at approximately 4:20pm. There, he met with the rest of the TEU shift that was working the Early Shift on 09/13/22. These officers consisted of Seth Edwards, Cameron Scott and their sergeant. Because they only had three officers, the three of them went out as a three-man car, and were assigned as Sq. 763. They loaded their squad car, a fully marked City of Milwaukee Police Ford Explorer equipped with functioning lights, siren and camera. P.O. Edwards drove the squad, P.O. Scott was the front seat passenger and P.O. Dillman sat in the passenger's side rear seat. During the tour of their duty, they assisted District 7 with a vehicle pursuit. Following the vehicle pursuit, other District 7 officers located a stolen vehicle and arrested the occupants. Sq. 763 responded and assisted the officers with this investigation. At the conclusion of this, Sq. 763 went back on patrol. P.O. Dillman had Q-Doba for dinner. His partners both brought food to eat that night. After eating, they went back on patrol. P.O. Cameron observed on the squad computer that there were shot spotter detection calls pending in the area of N. 30th St. and W. Lisbon Ave. The officers decided to respond to the shot spotter calls as this is part of their expected responsibilities being a TEU squad assisting patrol. P.O. Dillman explained that he has an application (app) on his phone that is connected to the shot spotter system. This app provides specific information related to the shot spotter detections occurring throughout the city. P.O. Edwards advised dispatch that they would be investigating the shots spotter call on N. 30th St. and W. Lisbon Ave. P.O. Dillman believed the actual address for the		
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call was 30██ W. Lisbon Ave.

While responding to the area of N. 30th St. and W. Lisbon Ave., P.O. Dillman recalled P.O. Scott advised that he saw three individuals walking down a block near the area where the shots were reported to have been fired from. P.O. Dillman did not recall specifically where they responded from or where they were when P.O. Scott made this observation, other than it was somewhere close to N. 30th St. and W. Lisbon Ave. P.O. Dillman advised that while he is in the back seat of the squad, a lot of times his focus is on his phone and the shot spotter app. He advised he was focused on this at the time they were responding.

The three of them arrived to the area of 30██ W. Lisbon Ave. Dillman explained there is a gas station located on the south side of the street and a field on the north side of the street. He stated they checked the field and did not observe anything out of the ordinary or anyone in need. P.O. Dillman observed a vehicle in the back of the gas station on the south side of the street. He did not believe the vehicle was occupied.

P.O. Dillman and P.O. Scott began to walk southbound across W. Lisbon Ave. to check the gas station regarding the shots fired incident. P.O. Dillman remembered as he was in the middle of the street, he heard two more gun shots that were close to them. P.O. Edwards pulled up to pick up P.O. Dillman and P.O. Scott, as they were now going to respond to the area where these most recent shots were fired from.

Once in the car, P.O. Dillman began to pull up the shot spotter information on his phone, as this information comes to the app almost instantaneously. P.O. Dillman further explained that the shots came from the area where P.O. Scott had seen the three people walking together. The three officers were then on the look out for these three subjects as they believed they were the ones responsible for the gun fire in the area.

P.O. Dillman pulled up the shot-spotter information and recalled that the most recent shots they heard came from the 1600 block of N. 34th St., specifically 16██ N. 34th St. They responded to that block. While in the area, they spoke with a Hmong couple and inquired about the gun shots. They were advised by the couple that the shots came from a group of subjects on foot and that the subjects walked eastbound on W. Galena St. P.O. Dillman did not recall specifically where they were when they spoke to the Hmong family.

The officers continued to check the area. P.O. Edwards pulled up to a vehicle that had its

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headlights on parked facing westbound in the 3300 block of W. Galena St. There was a female in the driver's seat with her window down. P.O. Edwards pulled up driver's door to driver's door with the woman's vehicle. P.O. Edwards asked the female where the shots were coming from and she advised she did not know. At this point, P.O. Dillman heard one or two more gun shots just around the corner from where they were. P.O. Edwards accelerated forward and then turned southbound on N. 33rd St. As they turned the corner, P.O. Dillman heard another gun shot in very close proximity to them.

DEADLY FORCE ENCOUNTER

As they were traveling southbound in the 1500 block of N. 33rd St., P.O. Scott exclaimed, "Right there, right there!" P.O. Dillman heard another gun shot fired in very close proximity to them. P.O. Dillman believed that P.O. Scott either saw somebody with a gun or actually saw the person shoot because of the way P.O. Scott said, "Right there, right there!"

P.O. Dillman advised as they were driving down the block, P.O. Edwards activated the emergency lights in the "steady" mode, meaning the red and blue lights are activated and remain on, but do not flash. P.O. Dillman advised that the three people they were approaching definitely knew they were the Police.

As they got close to the group of subjects, P.O. Dillman was able to see the group of three on the sidewalk on the west side of the street. P.O. Dillman described the subjects as having an "Oh Shit!" moment upon seeing the police car pulling up towards them. He described how the three subjects began to run into each other trying to run away from the scene. This further solidified in P.O. Dillman's mind that the suspects knew they were encountering the police.

P.O. Dillman described the actors as two subjects wearing all black and one subject wearing a white shirt. P.O. Dillman was unable to provide a description of the other two other than they were wearing black clothing. P.O. Dillman estimated the subjects were twenty to thirty feet away from them when the squad came to rest.

P.O. Dillman described his mindset as they pulled up on the group. He explained how he has been in hundreds of foot pursuits with armed subjects. P.O. Dillman was fully anticipating the subjects would run. He planned to chase one of the three subjects on foot, take him into custody and investigate the matter. P.O. Dillman explained he did not have his gun out and was "hands free" - getting ready to chase on foot.

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P.O. Dillman explained the subject in the white began to run towards the squad instead of away from the squad. This surprised P.O. Dillman because in his experience, most people run away from the police, not at the police. P.O. Dillman focused his apprehension efforts on the subject running towards them because he was the closest one to the squad. P.O. Dillman initially thought it was good the subject was running towards the squad because he thought this would make his efforts in catching him much easier. P.O. Dillman thought to himself, "I'm going to be right on him."

As P.O. Dillman exited the squad, he heard gun shots going off and rounds "coming at us". P.O. Dillman heard a "ton" of rounds being fired and he knew the subject was shooting at them because P.O. Dillman observed a handgun, which he described as a black handgun with a drum magazine, in the suspect's hand and the suspect's hand was extended towards the squad. P.O. Dillman explained the suspect was now running northbound on the sidewalk "blindly" shooting his gun towards the squad. P.O. Dillman described the suspect's body was facing northbound in the direction he was running, but his arm was angled to the side and behind him firing in the direction of the police. P.O. Dillman did not see muzzle flash coming from the gun but knew it was being fired because he could hear it, see the gun recoil and see the subject's arm flexing as the shots were fired.

As this moment, P.O. Dillman thought to himself, "I could have gotten killed." He explained the suspect was approximately six feet away from him as he was getting out of the car and the suspect was running northbound on the sidewalk.

P.O. Dillman began to run for cover. He ran around the rear of the car towards the driver's side rear of the car for cover. As P.O. Dillman ran around the squad car for cover, he was preparing himself to be shot and thought at any moment he would be shot. P.O. Dillman thought to himself, "Is Seth dead? Is Cam dead?"

P.O. Dillman drew his handgun from its holster while near the driver's side rear corner of the squad car and reacquired the suspect, who was still armed and running eastbound across N. 33rd St. As the subject was running across the street, P.O. Dillman realized he was again exposed and did not have cover.

At this point, P.O. Dillman began to engage the subject. P.O. Dillman found no other use of force would have been a viable option except for the use of deadly force against the suspect, who was and continued to be an imminent threat to the officers. The squad had just come from the area the suspect was running at and towards and P.O. Dillman knew there were no other people out on the

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street in the area. P.O. Dillman began to run northbound down the street towards the subject while firing at him. P.O. Dillman believed he fired his first two or three rounds while holding his firearm with his strong hand only. He continued to fire as he moved his left hand to his gun to get a better grip on his firearm. P.O. Dillman fired what he thought was an additional five rounds while holding his gun with both hands. P.O. Dillman believed at the time he had shot seven or eight times. P.O. Dillman advised his shots were fired in one continuous string of fire. P.O. Dillman advised that while he was firing his complete view of the suspect became somewhat obstructed because of his sight picture, explaining his hands and gun were blocking his view of a portion of the suspect's lower body.

P.O. Dillman explained the subject fell to the ground on the north side of a vehicle that was parked on the east side of the street. P.O. Dillman thought to himself that the subject now has cover and P.O. Dillman is again exposed.

P.O. Dillman explained he then saw P.O. Edwards to his right. P.O. Dillman was relieved when he saw P.O. Edwards because P.O. Dillman thought P.O. Edwards was just killed by the suspect. P.O. Edwards went around the east side of the parked vehicle the suspect fell by and P.O. Dillman went around the west side of the car, creating a flank. P.O. Dillman was shouting, "Show me your hands! Show me your hands!"

P.O. Dillman could see both hands of the suspect raised in the air coming out from the front of the car. The suspect was lying on his back with his hands in the air. P.O. Dillman observed blood coming out from the right side of the suspect's mid section at the bottom of his shirt. P.O. Dillman saw the same gun the suspect was holding was now next to the curb approximately three feet away from the subject. P.O. Dillman observed the suspect's gun was not in lock back.

P.O. Dillman wears his body camera on the center portion of his chest on his exterior vest carrier. P.O. Dillman activated his body camera after firing. He knew that the incident was going to be captured by video on his camera, but the audio would not be due to the time at which he activated his camera. He explained the body camera video goes back thirty seconds from moment of activation, but the audio is not captured in the thirty second time frame, but begins recording upon activation.

P.O. Dillman holstered his handgun and rolled the subject to his stomach. P.O. Dillman placed the subject in handcuffs and began to administer first-aid. P.O. Dillman described how the individual went from being a suspect wanted for shooting at the police to being the victim of a shooting. He

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began to change modes from defending the life of himself and his fellow officers to saving the individual's life.

P.O. Dillman believed that P.O. Scott was shot. Shortly after handcuffing the suspect, P.O. Dillman saw P.O. Scott and this was a "pleasant surprise" because again, he thought P.O. Scott was shot. P.O. Scott collected the medical bag from inside of their squad car and brought it over to where the suspect was.

P.O. Dillman told P.O. Scott to look for the other two suspects and to be careful because they did not know where they were. They were concerned the outstanding suspects were still in the area and remained on "high alert".

P.O. Dillman advised that P.O. Edwards got on the radio and informed dispatch and other officers that they had "shots fired", a subject was down, that all of the officers were OK and that there were still suspects still out. P.O. Dillman heard P.O. Edwards say the outstanding suspects ran south, but P.O. Dillman did not observe this himself.

P.O. Dillman remained with the suspect who advised the officers that he was shot. P.O. Dillman asked the subject what his name and birthday were and the subject told him. P.O. Dillman advised that other officers began to arrive on scene.

P.O. Dillman observed the subject was shot on the right side of his body. P.O. Dillman observed blood on the lower portion of his shirt. P.O. Dillman advised the subjects right leg was not in a normal orientation and believed his right leg was broken. P.O. Dillman advised the suspect had a wound near his right hip and on his right side blow his ribs.

P.O. Dillman explained that P.O. Edwards began packing the wound on his hip with a dressing. P.O. Edwards tried putting a chest seal on the wound on the right side of his body below the ribs. They also applied a tourniquet on the suspect's right leg. P.O. Edwards tried to forcing the subject's leg back into its normal position in an effort to straighten it out.

The suspect asked to be sat up and wanted to roll on his right side. The officers would not allow him to roll on his right side because they were trying to treat his wounds, which were on the right side of his body. P.O. Dillman held the suspect's head while the officers provided first-aid.

P.O. Dillman advised he observed a bag of drugs, which he believed was crack cocaine, bigger

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than an "eight ball" fall from the subject's clothing as they rolled him over.

P.O. Dillman was escorted away from the scene by Milwaukee Police Sgt. Trevor Devor. P.O. Dillman provided his public safety statement to Sgt. Devor.

P.O. Dillman explained that this was the first time in his entire career that "someone attacked us". He thought with 100% certainty he was going to be shot during the encounter. He fully expected both of his partners had been shot or killed as the encounter unfolded.

P.O. Dillman did not have any prior encounters with this specific suspect prior to the incident, and did not have any knowledge of who he was.

This report is completed by Detective Technician Stephen F. Kirby as part of the Milwaukee Area Investigative Team (MAIT) assisting in the Officer Involved Death Investigation in the City of Milwaukee (Milwaukee case 222561703) on September 13, 2022. Wauwatosa Police are the lead investigating agency with case number 22-21034.

Evidence Transferred from Wisconsin State Crime Lab (WSCL) to Wauwatosa Police

On September 28, 2022 I met with Chief Johnson at the Milwaukee WSCL to receive the evidence the Crime Scene Response (CSR) team collected and packaged the night of the incident. I received 43 items of evidence properly sealed and packaged. I signed the "Receipt of Physical Evidence" form and a copy is attached to the case and uploaded to the MAIT folder. Note, the number of items on the form for CSRT shows 44 evidence marker numbers but 43 physical items were turned over. Item 43 was a fired bullet in a wall of a house. Attempts to recover that item failed and evidence marker 43 was not a physical item recovered.

Property Entry

I entered all 43 items received from WSCL CSR into Wauwatosa Property as evidence and secured them into Wauwatosa Police Vaults. Suspect Fired Cartridge Cases and Bullet

The five fired .40 S&W cartridge cases (scene items 31, 32, 33, 34, and 35 which are entered as Wauwatosa items 22-3309-31, 32, 33, 34, and 35) were all identified as being from the suspect's Smith and Wesson Model M&P 40 with serial number [REDACTED]. The suspect gun is scene item 1 and entered as Wauwatosa Police item 22-3901-1. Additionally, the fired bullet recovered from the soffit at 15 [REDACTED] North 33rd Street (scene item 44 entered as Wauwatosa Police item 22-3309-43) was identified as having been fired from the suspect's gun.

The suspect fired cartridge cases were in front of and to the west of the Officers squad while the fired bullet was to the east and south indicating the suspect likely fired in the direction of the squad car and officers.

Officer Scott's Fired Cartridge Cases and Bullet

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Officer fired cartridge cases, scene items 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9 (entered as Wauwatosa Police items 22-3309-5, 6, 7, 8, and 9) were identified as being from Officer Scott's handgun.

The fired bullet recovered in the roadway northeast of 15th North 33rd Street (scene item 36 entered as Wauwatosa Police item 22-3309-36) was also identified as having come from Officer Scott's firearm.
