Total Calls YTD (No DMP Calls): 11,177 Calls

Homicide— There were 0 homicides reported. There were 0 overdoses reported this month.

May 19, 2025

Shootings / Shots Fired— There were 2 shots fired reported and 0 people injured this month. 5 firearms were taken as evidence (7 total firearms were placed into property).

25-010175: At approx. 23:23 on 4/14/25, Officer responded to the 2500 blk of N 124th St. for a report of shots fired. During the investigation, officers found a resident of the lower unit was cleaning a firearm and fired one shot into an adjacent apartment.

25-010393: At approx. 8:18 on 4/17/25, Officers responded to the 2900 blk of N 120th St. for a report of shots fired. Upon arrival, officers located a vehicle that was egged and shot at while parked in the driveway. Suspects are unknown at this time.

Sexual Assaults— There were 2 sexual assaults and 2 indecent exposures reported.

Robbery— There were 2 robberies reported this month.

25-011362: At approx. 23:30 on 4/27/25, Officer responded to 11737 W Burleigh St. (Bowlero Parking Lot) for a report of a robbery. The victim reported one known and one unknown subject robbed him at gun point and took a necklace.

25-011673: At approx. 18:04, one subject was arrested after stealing a laptop from Best Buy. The suspect entered the store and requested to see the “nicest” laptop. During the purchasing process, the suspect grabbed the laptop and attempted to run out of the store. While running out of the store, he pushed an employee.

Assaults— There were 14 assaults reported this month. 11 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence. 1 incident was reported as resisting/obstruction officer.

Burglary— There were 22 burglaries reported this month.

There were multiple burglaries reported at 1205 N 62 St. (Reef Apartment garage) multiple vehicles were entered after suspects entered the parking garage.

Thefts— There were 122 thefts (77 retail thefts and 9 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 15 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 4 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 12 reported at Home Depot.

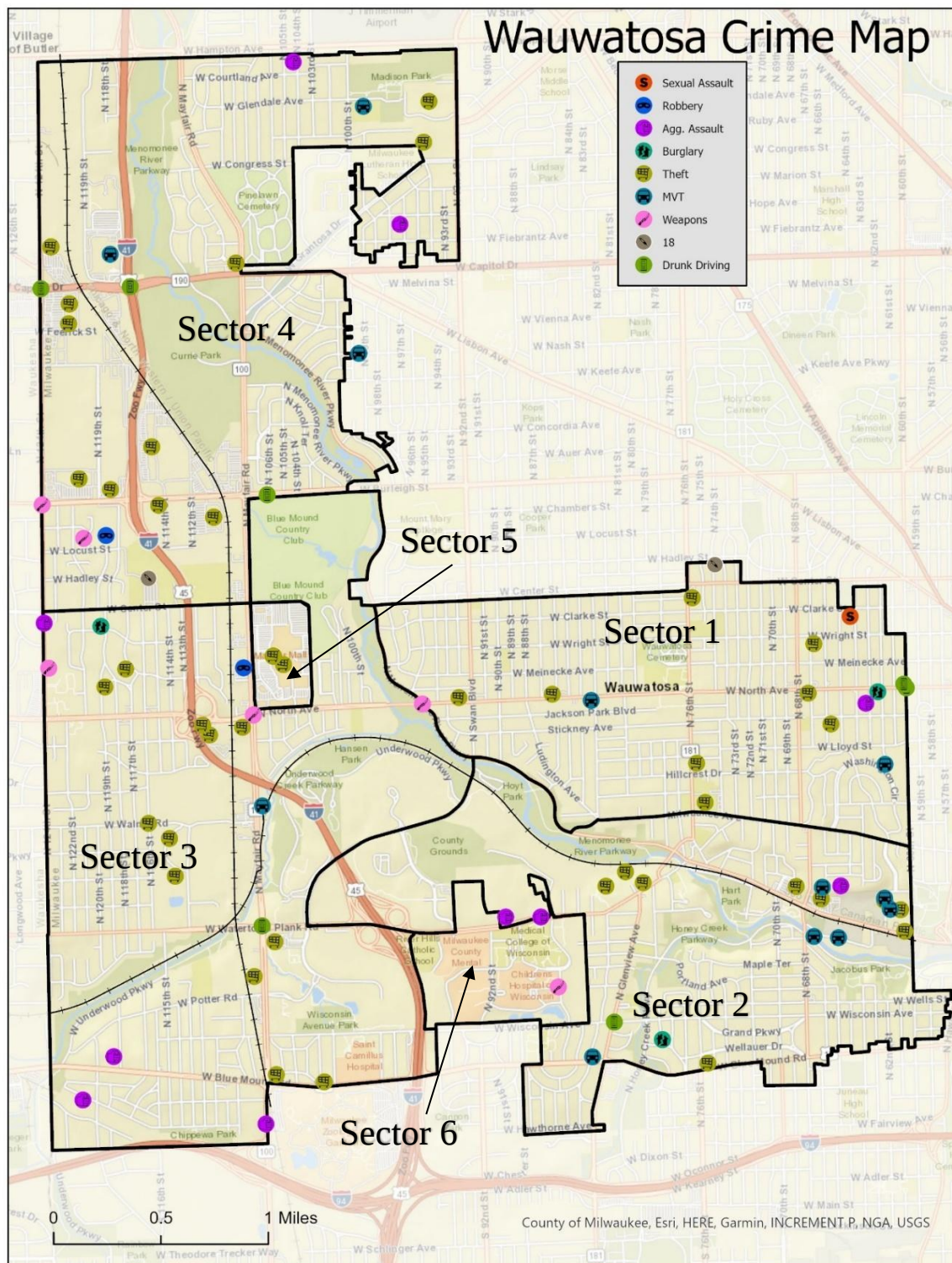
Theft of Motor Vehicles— There were 9 (1 attempt and +1 not returned rental) motor vehicles reported stolen. 8 vehicles were targeted this month were without keys. There were 0 vehicles taken while they were running. 9 of the 9 vehicles have been recovered. 2025 YTD: 26 (6 attempts and +8 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen.

The Milwaukee area has seen a significant increase in the use of key fob re-programmers to steal vehicles. This increase was identified in November 2024, with the theft of multiple Infiniti Q60s from the area. The initial trend targeted Nissans and Infiniti's; however, currently there are a variety of vehicles being targeted.

Arson— There were 0 arsons reported this month.

Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI) — There were 13 OAWIs reported this month

Pursuits/Eluding Cases – There were 8 reports of eluding. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed.
