Homicide— There were 0 homicides reported. Ten overdoses were reported this month.

Shootings / Shots Fired— There was one report of shots fired, 0 were injured this month. 24 firearms were taken as evidence (24 total firearms were placed into property).

Sexual Assaults— There were 3 sexual assaults and 1 sex offense reported.

Robbery— There were 2 robberies reported this month.

Assaults— There were 14 assaults reported this month. 22 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence. 0 incident(s) were reported as resisting/obstruction officer.

Burglary— There were 6 burglaries reported this month.

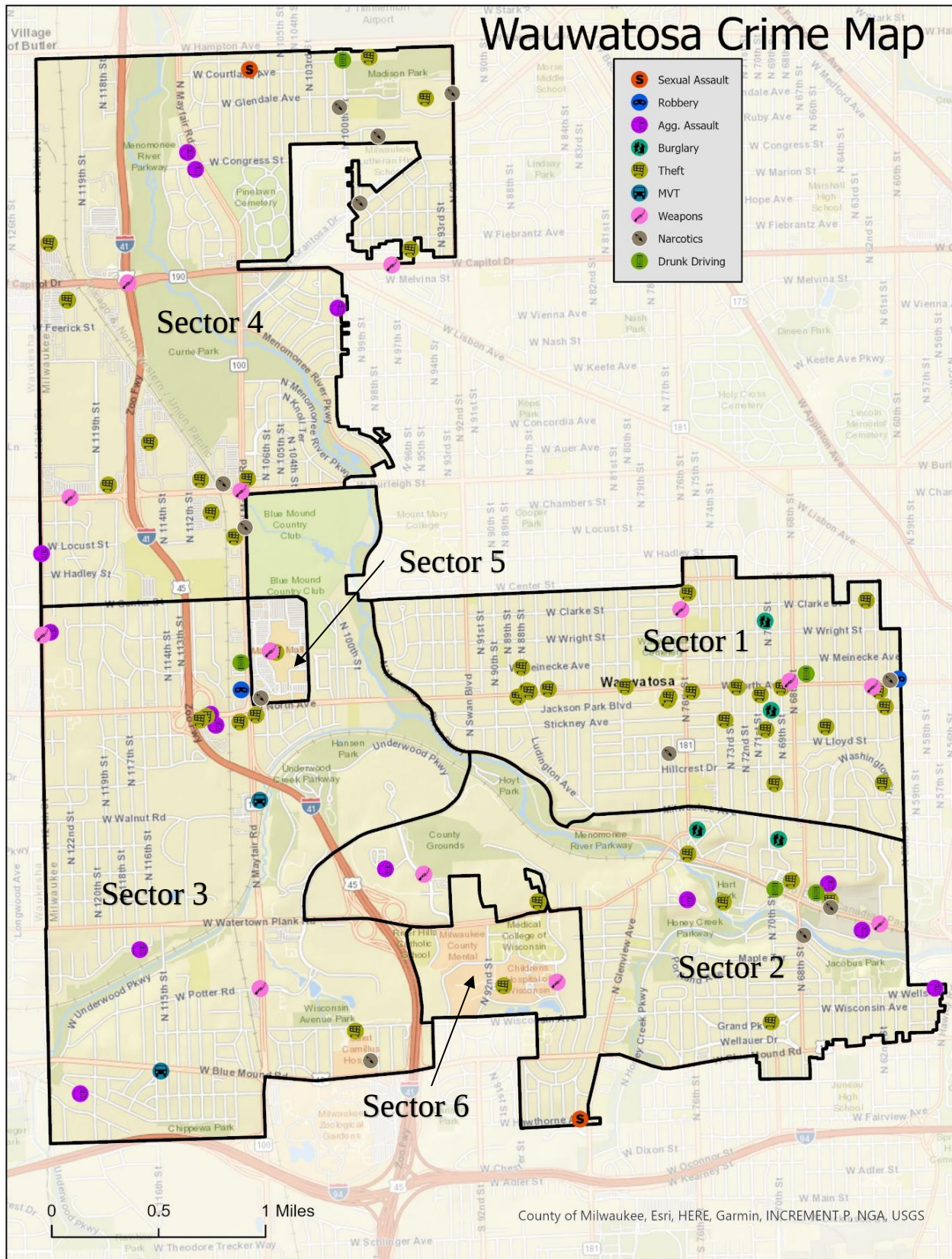
Thefts— There were 86 thefts (38 retail thefts and 6 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 7 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 4 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 4 reported at Home Depot.

Theft of Motor Vehicles— There was 1 (0 attempts and +0 not returned rentals) motor vehicle reported stolen. It was taken without keys. There were no vehicles taken while running. The one stolen vehicle has not been recovered.

Arson— No arson was reported this month.

Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI) — There were 8 OAWIs reported this month

Pursuits/Eluding Cases – There were 3 reports of eluding. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed.
