OPERATIONS **December 2025**

Major Crime Update-November 2025

Total Calls YTD (No DMP Calls): 31,293 Calls

Homicide— There were 0 homicides reported. There were 4 overdoses reported this month.

Shootings / Shots Fired— There were 0 shots fired reported and 0 people injured this month. 7 firearms were taken as evidence (8 total firearms were placed into property).

Sexual Assaults— There were 5 sexual assaults and 2 sex offenses reported.

Robbery— There were 4 robberies reported this month.

25-036042: On 12/23/25 at approx. 11:27am, an unknown M/B suspect committed a Strongarm Robbery at Macy's, after leaving the store with unpaid merchandise and then punching loss prevention.

25-036162: On 12/24/2025 at approx. 12:35pm., the victim was working at JD Sports, located at Mayfair Mall when two unknown M/B subjects fought him and stole his \$550.00 chain. Two suspects were later arrested.

25-036365: On 12/27/2025, at approx. 2:46pm, an armed robbery occurred within the southern portion of the food court at the Mayfair Mall. The suspect was later arrested.

25-036618: On 12/30/2025, at approx. 12:55pm, a juvenile entered the BP Gas Station and attempted to purchase cigarettes. When the suspect's card was declined, the suspect yelled at the clerk "I'll Shoot you..." and left the store with the items. The suspect was later arrested.

Assaults— There were 12 assaults reported this month. 14 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence. 0 incident(s) were reported as resisting/obstruction officer.

Burglary— There were 10 burglaries reported this month.

Non-residential structures were entered 66.66% of the time. Most burglaries occurred during the daytime (44%). Lawn equipment were most commonly taken.

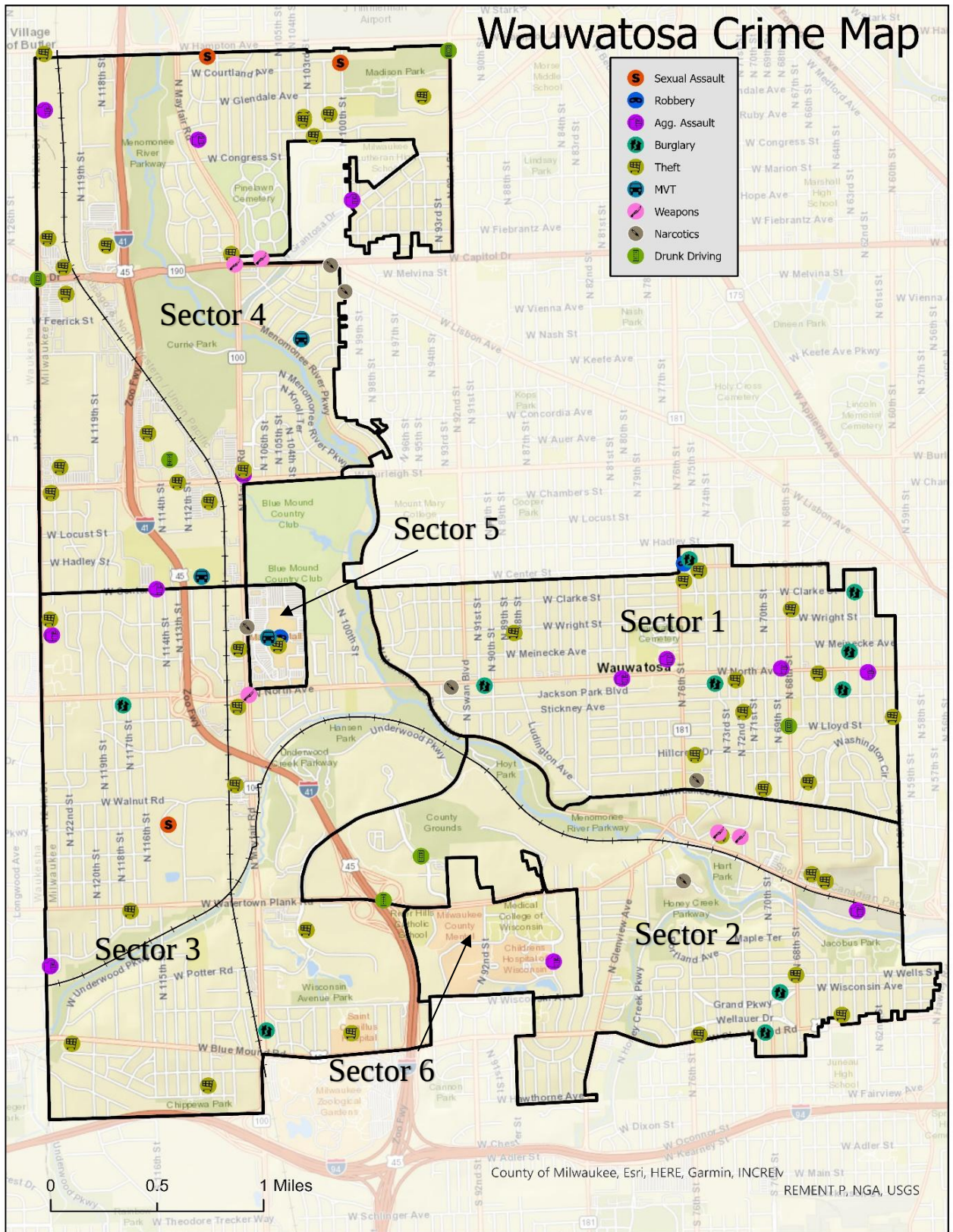
Thefts— There were 94 thefts (49 retail thefts and 11 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 14 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 3 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 4 reported at Home Depot.

Theft of Motor Vehicles— There were 2 (0 attempts and +0 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 1 vehicle targeted this month was without keys. There were 0 vehicles taken while they were running. 1 of the 2 vehicles have been recovered. **[2025 YTD: 56 (22 attempts and +13 not returned rentals)]** motor vehicles reported stolen.

Arson— There were 0 arsons reported this month.

Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI) — There were 9 OAWIs reported this month

Pursuits/Eluding Cases – There were 2 reports of eluding. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed.

A Year-to-Date comparative analysis of Mayfair Mall shows a decrease in calls for 2025. In 2024 calls totaled 1,468 compared to 1,185 calls in 2025. A comparison of 2020 with 2025 shows an increase of 20.06%. A comparison of 2015 with 2025 shows a decrease of - 23.75%.
