Major Crime Update

Total Calls YTD (No DMP Calls): 5,743 Calls

Homicide— There were 0 homicide reported. There was 1 overdose reported this month, 0 overdoses were fatal.

Shootings— There were 0 shootings reported this month. 5 firearms were taken as evidence (7 total firearms were placed into property).

Sexual Assaults— There were 2 sexual assaults and 1 reported indecent exposure.

Robbery— There was 1 robbery reported this month.

25-004240: At approx. 22:53 on 2/12/25, officers were dispatched to the 6800 blk of W State St. for a report of a strongarm robbery. The victim reported that he was in the area, when he was approached by an unknown subject who demanded money. There is information that this incident may not have happened.

Assaults— There were 6 assaults reported this month. 2 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence.

Burglary— There were 3 burglaries reported this month. It was determined that 1 burglary was a false alarm.

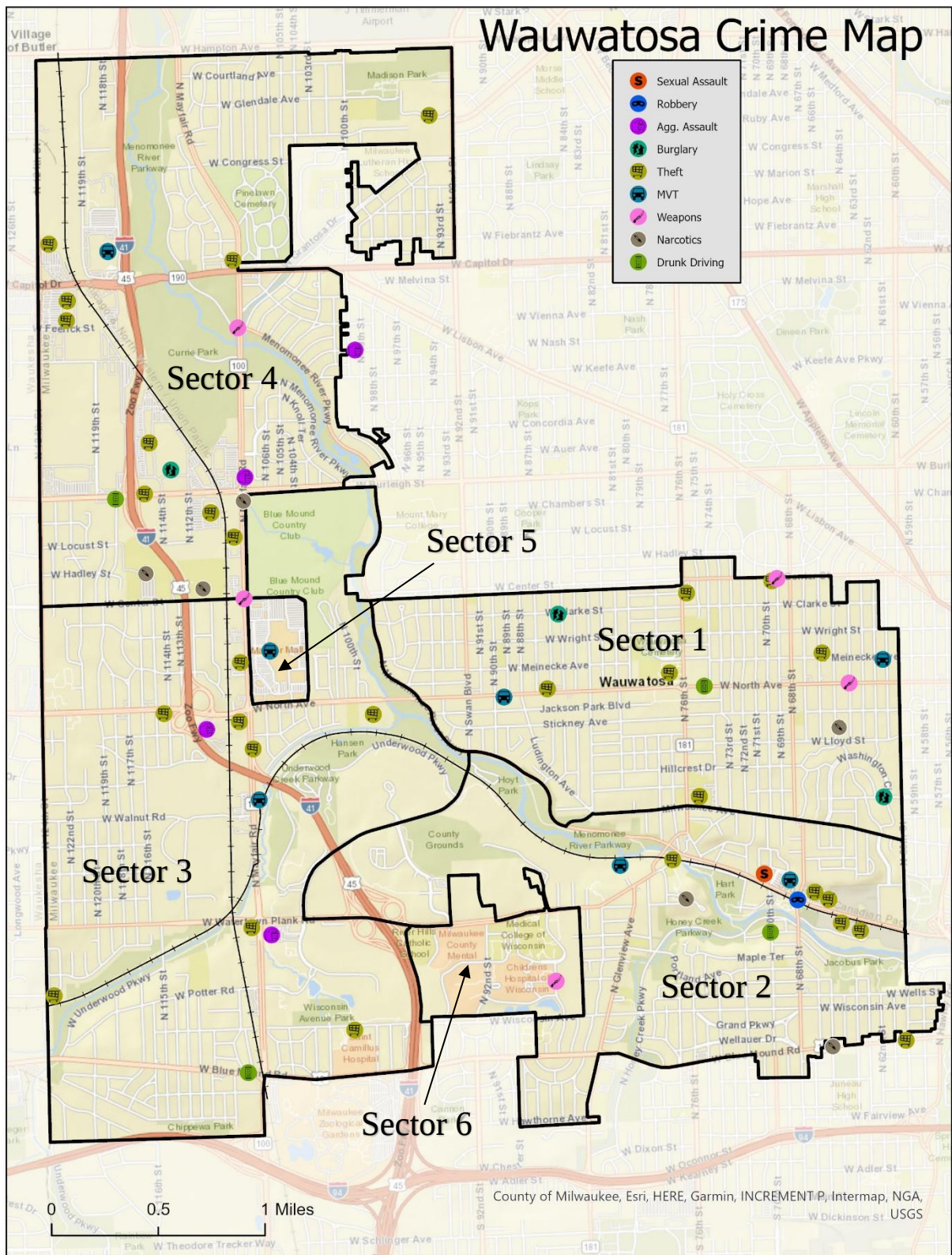
Thefts— There were 81 thefts (55 retail thefts and 8 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 10 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 3 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 4 reported at Home Depot.

Theft of Motor Vehicles— There were 5 (2 attempts and +6 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 4 vehicles were targeted this month were without keys. There were 2 vehicles take while they were running. 3 of the 3 vehicles have been recovered. 2025 YTD: 8 (4 attempts and +6 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen.

Arson— There was 0 arsons reported this month.

Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI) — There were 5 OAWIs reported this month

Pursuits/Eluding Cases – There were 8 reports of eluding. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed.
