Currently we are operating with 89 officers. One is on parental leave, one is injured on duty, 3 are on Light Duty, and 2 are in Field Training. Three officers are on Military Leave.

OPERATIONS **February 2026**

Major Crime Update- February 2026
Total Calls YTD (No DMP Calls): 5,397 Calls

Homicide— There were 0 homicides reported. There were 2 overdoses reported this month.

Shootings / Shots Fired— There were 0 shots fired reported and 1 person injured this month. 8 firearms were taken as evidence (10 total firearms were placed into property).

26-003410: On 02/08/2026 at approx. 22:34, two subjects were struck by gunfire during an altercation at 4315 N. 92nd St. One subject was transported to Froedtert Hospital for medical attention.

Sexual Assaults— There was 1 sexual assault and 1 sex offense reported.

Robbery— There were 2 robberies reported this month.

26-005275: On 2/27/2026 at 19:37, three subjects were arrested following a report of a robbery at Mayfair Mall. The victim reported that a black male forcefully removed his sunglasses from his head. As the suspect ran away with 2 other subjects, the victim observed the suspect holding a fire arm.

Assaults— There were 18 assaults reported this month. 24 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence. 0 incident(s) were reported as resisting/obstruction officer.

Burglary— There were 3 burglaries reported this month. There were no discernable patterns identified.

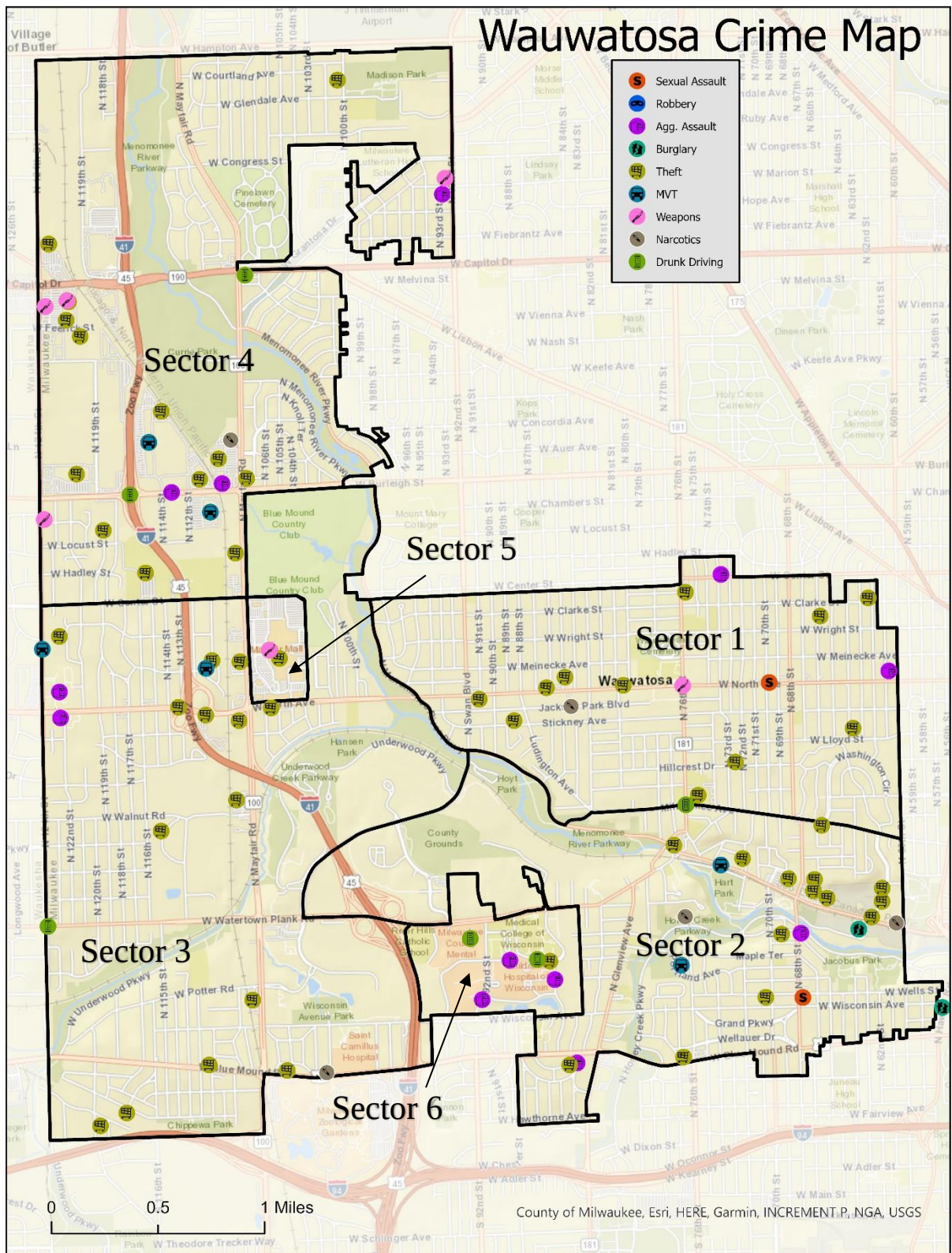
Thefts— There were 111 thefts (64 retail thefts and 12 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 10 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There was 1 theft reported at the Mayfair Collections and 7 reported at Home Depot.

Theft of Motor Vehicles— There were 5 (4 attempts and +0 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 5 vehicles were targeted this month were taken without keys. There was 1 vehicle taken while it was running. 4 of the 5 vehicles have been recovered. 2025 YTD: 26 (6 attempts and +8 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen.

Arson— There were 0 arsons reported this month.

Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI) — There were 9 OAWIs reported this month

Pursuits/Eluding Cases – There were 5 reports of eluding. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed.
