PERSONNEL ADDITIONS AND CHANGES

Currently we are operating with 98 officers, 1 is on parental leave, 3 are on Light Duty, and 3 are in Field Training. Two officers were sworn in on January 3, 2024. There are a total of three attending the Police Academy until May, 2025.

OPERATIONS **January 2025**

Major Crime Update

Total Calls YTD (No DMP Calls): 3,181 Calls

Homicide— There were 0 homicides reported. There was 1 overdose reported this month, 0 were fatal.

Shootings— There were 0 shootings reported this month. 4 firearms were taken as evidence (6 total firearms were placed into property).

Sexual Assaults— There were 4 sexual assaults.

Robbery— There were 4 robberies reported this month.

25-001084: At approx. 11:13 on 1/10/25, officers were dispatched to Best Buy for a report of a subject threatening an employee. The suspect grabbed an item off the counter and walked out. The suspect stated that if anyone follows him he will “pop” the employee.

25-001775: At approx. 22:02 on 1/17/25, officers were dispatched to Home Depot for a report of a subject attempting to steal items from the store. When the subject was confronted by employees, the subject implied he had a firearm.

Assaults— There were 12 assaults reported this month. 6 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence.

Burglary— There were 3 burglaries reported this month.

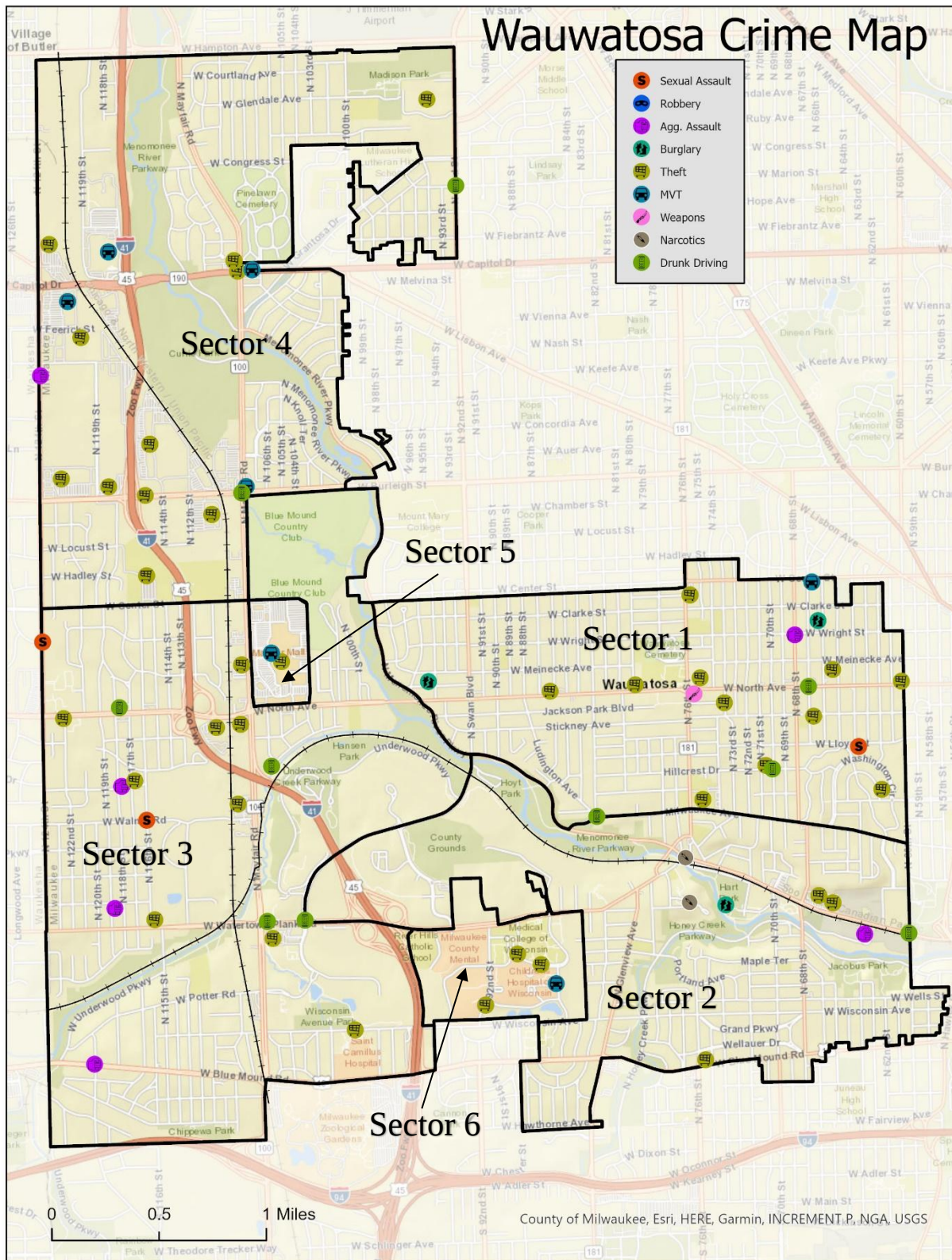
Thefts— There were 113 thefts (83 retail thefts and 7 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 22 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 5 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 8 reported at Home Depot.

Theft of Motor Vehicles— There were 3 (2 attempts and +0 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 2 vehicles were targeted this month were without keys. There was 1 vehicle taken while it was running. 3 of the 3 vehicles have been recovered.
2025 YTD: 3 (2 attempts and +0 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen.

Arson— There were 0 arsons reported this month.

Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI) — There were 13 OAWIs reported this month.

Pursuits/Eluding Cases – There were 9 reports of eluding. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed.
