PERSONNEL ADDITIONS AND CHANGES

Currently we are operating with 96 officers. One officer is on medical leave, one is injured on duty, 7 are on Light Duty. There are 5 officers in field training. One officer was sworn in on July 28, 2025, and entered the Police Academy on July 30th. Two officers are on Military Leave until May, 2026.

OPERATIONS **July 2025**

Major Crime Update-June 2025

Total Calls YTD (No DMP Calls): 18,371 Calls

Homicide— There were 0 homicides reported. There were 7 overdoses reported this month.

Shootings (Subject Struck)/ Shots Fired (No subject Struck)— There was 1 shots-fired call reported and 1 person injured this month. 13 firearms were taken as evidence (17 total firearms were placed into property).

25-019884: On 07/21/2025 at 18:25, officers responded to the BP Gas station (12324 W North Ave) for an altercation between two people. Prior to police arrival, one person was shot. The suspect was arrested upon police arrival.

Sexual Assaults— There were 0 sexual assaults and 6 indecent exposures/sex offenses.

Robbery— There was 1 robbery reported this month.

25-020087: Officers responded to Toppers Pizza (6810 W State St.) for a report of a robbery. The victim reported his cell phone and \$600 were taken from the store by a male armed with a handgun.

Assaults— There were 16 assaults reported this month. 10 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence.

Burglary— There were 7 burglaries reported this month.

There were no residential burglaries reported. 71.43% of the burglaries were forced entries.

Thefts— There were 100 thefts (73 retail thefts and 6 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 5 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 20 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 7 reported at Home Depot.

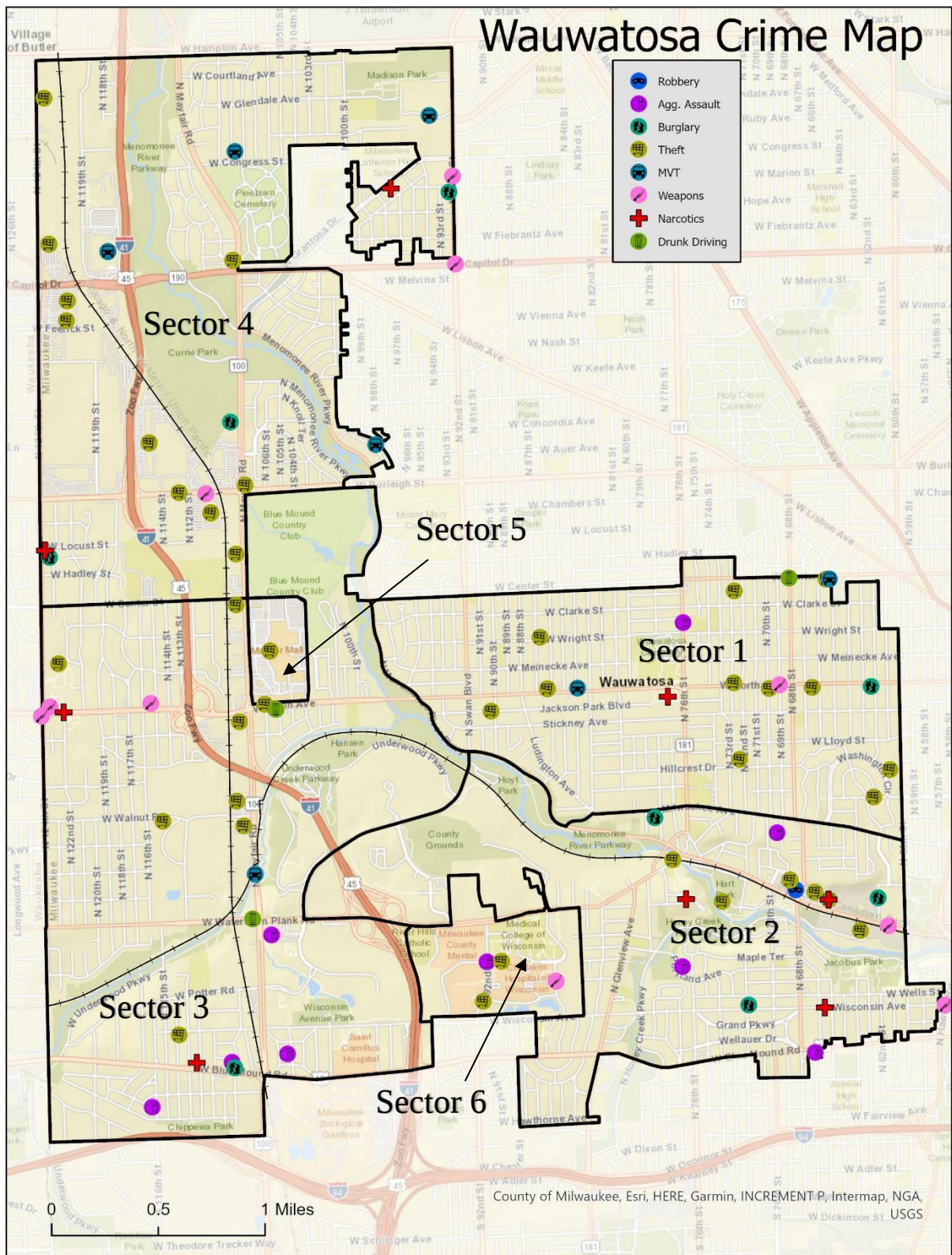
Theft of Motor Vehicles— There were 6 (3 attempts and +0 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 2 vehicles were targeted this month were without keys. There were 0 vehicles taken while they were running. 5 of the 6 vehicles have been recovered. 2025 YTD: 44 (19 attempts and +10 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen.

The Milwaukee area has seen a significant increase in the use of key fob re-programmers to steal vehicles. This increase was identified in November 2024, with the theft of multiple vehicles being taken in this method.

Arson— There was 0 arsons reported this month.

Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI) — There were 3 OAWIs reported this month

Pursuits/Eluding Cases – There were 9 reports of eluding. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed.
