PERSONNEL ADDITIONS AND CHANGES

Currently we are operating with 94 officers. Five officers were sworn in on July 23rd. One probationary recruit officer was terminated from employment on July 15, 2026. Four officers are in the Police Academy, six are in field training.

OPERATIONS

Major Crime Update- July 2026
Total Calls YTD (No DPM Calls): 19,057 Calls

Homicide— There were 0 homicides reported. There were 6 overdoses reported this month.

Shootings / Shots Fired— There was 1 shots-fired call reported and 1 person injured this month. 12 firearms were taken as evidence (16 total firearms were placed into property).

26-020049: At approx. 19:14 on 7/20/2026, Officers responded to the area of 107th & Grantosa Dr. for a report of shots fired in a nearby wooded area. The reporting individual said he was with two friends and had taken a bus to a mall. A newer black Jeep Grand Cherokee then pulled over near that location. The driver got out, walked toward the woods carrying what appeared to be an AR-15 style rifle, and fired two rounds into the wooded area where the friends were. The reporting individual witnessed this from a spot just south of a fence bordering the woods.

26-020952: At approx. 15:54 on 7/29/2026, officers responded to the area of N 60 St/W Lloyd Ave after a subject shot himself while driving a 2020 White Dodge Ram.

Sexual Assaults— There were 2 sexual assaults and 0 sex offenses reported.

Robbery— There were 2 robberies reported this month.

26-019340: At approx. 19:29 on 7/13/2026, Officers responded to Mayfair Mall for a report of a robbery. The victim reported that someone attempted to steal his phone while in the food court bathroom. The victim also report that he was struck in the head.

26-020798: At approx. 8:52 on 7/28/2026, Officers responded to the area of N 121/W Burleigh St. for a report of a robbery. The victim reported that a subject took a concrete saw from the work site and fled in a Chevrolet Monte Carlo. During the incident the suspect stated that he had a gun.

Assaults— There were 8 assaults reported this month. 15 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence. 0 incident(s) reported as resisting/obstruction officer.

Burglary— There were 5 burglaries reported this month.

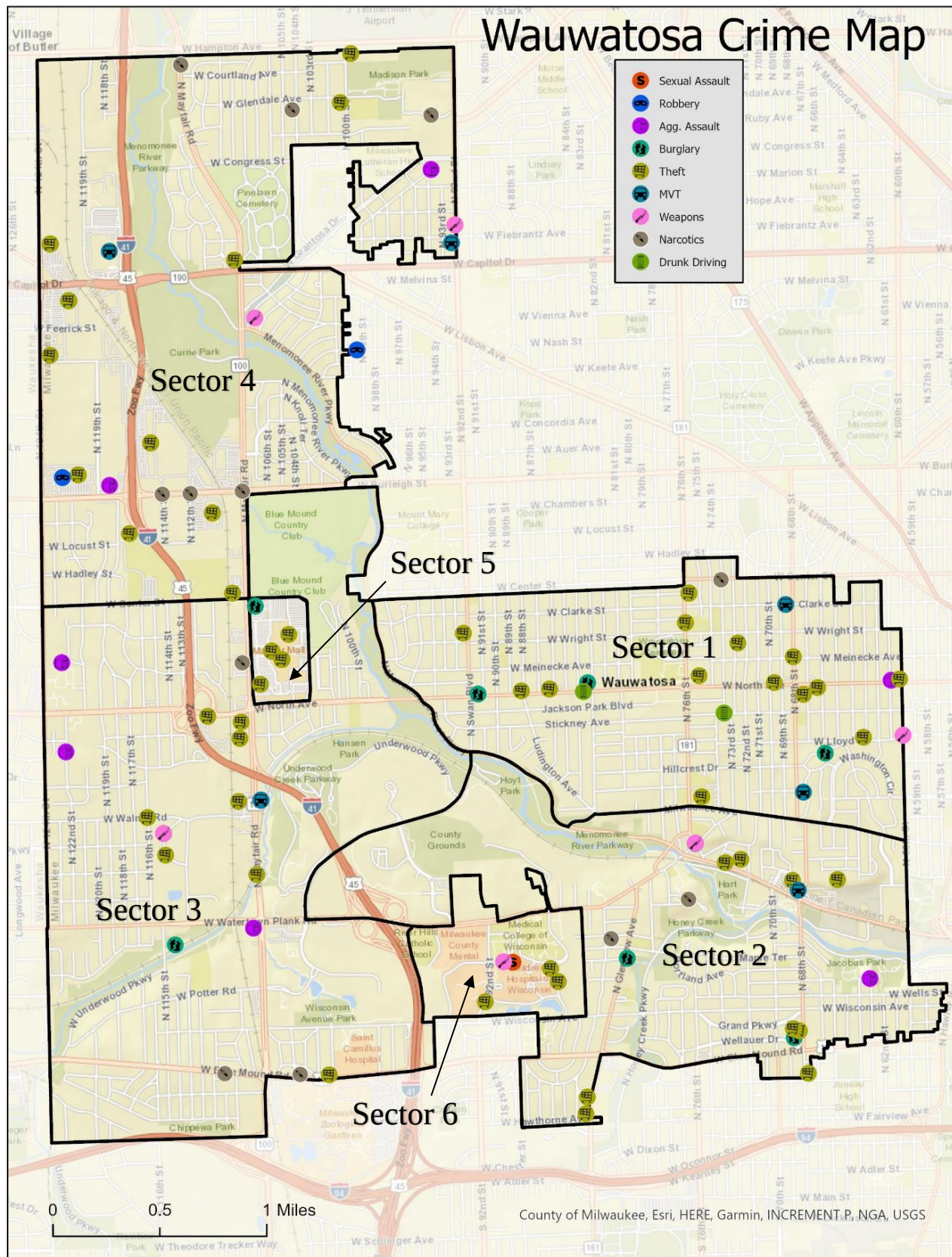
Thefts— There were 121 thefts (80 retail thefts and 13 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 10 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 5 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 10 reported at Home Depot.

Theft of Motor Vehicles— There were 5 (4 attempts and +4 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. Two vehicles were targeted this month were taken without keys. There was 1 vehicle taken while running, and 3 of the 5 vehicles have been recovered.

Arson— There were 0 arsons reported this month.

Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI) — There were 4 OAWIs reported this month

Pursuits/Eluding Cases – There were 14 reports of eluding. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed.
