PERSONNEL ADDITIONS AND CHANGES

Currently we are operating with 95 officers. Two officers are on medical leave, 6 are on Light Duty and 1 is Injured on duty. There are 4 officers in field training. Patrol Specialist Dan Kane retired on June 2, 2025 after 25 years of service. Sergeant James Morrill retired on June 11, 2025 after 17 ½ years of service. One officer was sworn in on June 12, 2025, and one officer resigned on June 30, 2025. Two officers are on Military Leave until May, 2026.

Major Crime Update-June 2025

Total Calls YTD (No DMP Calls): 16,217 Calls

Homicide— There were 0 homicides reported. There were 2 overdoses reported this month.

Shootings (Subject Struck)/ Shots Fired (No subject Struck)— There were 4 shots fired reported and 1 person injured this month. 7 firearms were taken as evidence (11 total firearms were placed into property).

25-016318: On 06/16/25 at 10:22pm, officer responded to the Synergy Apartments, approximately N 112 St & W Burleigh St at the Mayfair Collection. A resident reported he received an alert that his vehicle was being broken into and proceeded to confront the suspect. Gunfire was exchanged between both the victim and suspect. The victim sustained a gunshot to the leg.

Sexual Assaults— There was 1 sexual assault and 1 indecent exposure reported.

Robbery— There were 4 robberies reported this month.

Arrests were made in 3 or 4 incidents.

25-015079: Officers responded to the 2600 blk of N 62st for a report of an attempt carjacking. The victim was sitting in her vehicle when a subject approach the vehicle and demanded she get out and give him the keys and cell phone. The suspect implied he had a firearm. The suspect was later arrested.

Assaults— There were 11 assaults reported this month. 7 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence.

Burglary— There was 1 burglary reported this month.
No discernable pattern

Thefts— There were 138 thefts (88 retail thefts and 10 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 16 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 10 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 5 reported at Home Depot.

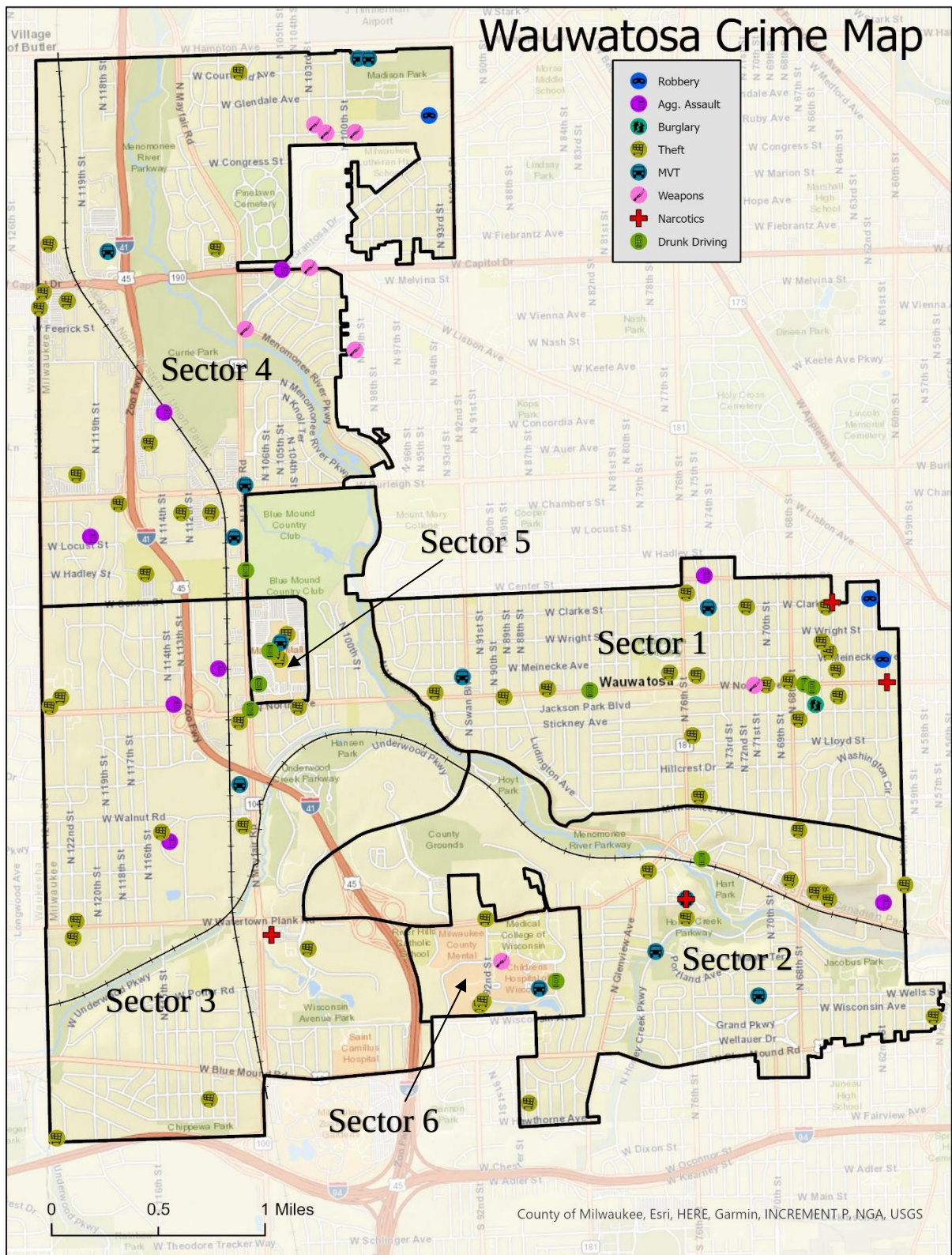
Theft of Motor Vehicles— There were 7 (8 attempts and +0 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 6 vehicles were targeted this month were without keys. There was 1 vehicle taken while it was running. 5 of the 7 vehicles have been recovered. 2025 YTD: 38 (15 attempts and +9 not returned rentals) motor vehicles were reported stolen.

The Milwaukee area has seen a significant increase in the use of key fob re-programmers to steal vehicles. This increase was identified in November 2024, with the theft of multiple vehicles being taken in this method.

Arson— There were 0 arsons reported this month.

Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI) — There were 12 OAWIs reported this month

Pursuits/Eluding Cases – There were 7 reports of eluding. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed.
