Major Crime Update- June 2026
Total Calls YTD (No DPM Calls): 16,031 Calls

Homicide— There were 0 homicides reported. There were 5 overdoses reported this month.

Shootings / Shots Fired— There were 2 shots fired calls reported and 0 people injured this month. 10 firearms were taken as evidence (12 total firearms were placed into property).

July 20, 2026

26-014901: On 6/2/2026 at approx. 16:17, a driver reported that another motorist in a white SUV fired a single round into the rear window of his vehicle during a road-rage incident in the area of 7800 Harwood Ave. The reporting driver stated that the shot was fired after a disagreement over merging, and he followed the suspect vehicle until visual contact was lost. No injuries were reported.

26-015577: On 6/9/2026 at approx. 00:24, officers responded to the 2600 blk N 88th St for the report of an occupied residence which had been struck by gunfire numerous times.

Sexual Assaults— There was 1 sexual assault, 0 sex offenses were reported.

Robbery— There was 1 robbery reported this month.

26-015721: On 6/10/2026 at approx. 10:30am, 2 known subjects assaulted the victim inside the Home Depot breakroom and stole her iPhone. The victim reported being slapped and punched multiple times before dropping her phone, which one of the suspects took as they fled.

Assaults— There were 7 assaults reported this month. 19 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence. 0 incident(s) were reported as resisting/obstruction officer.

Burglary— There were 5 burglaries reported this month.

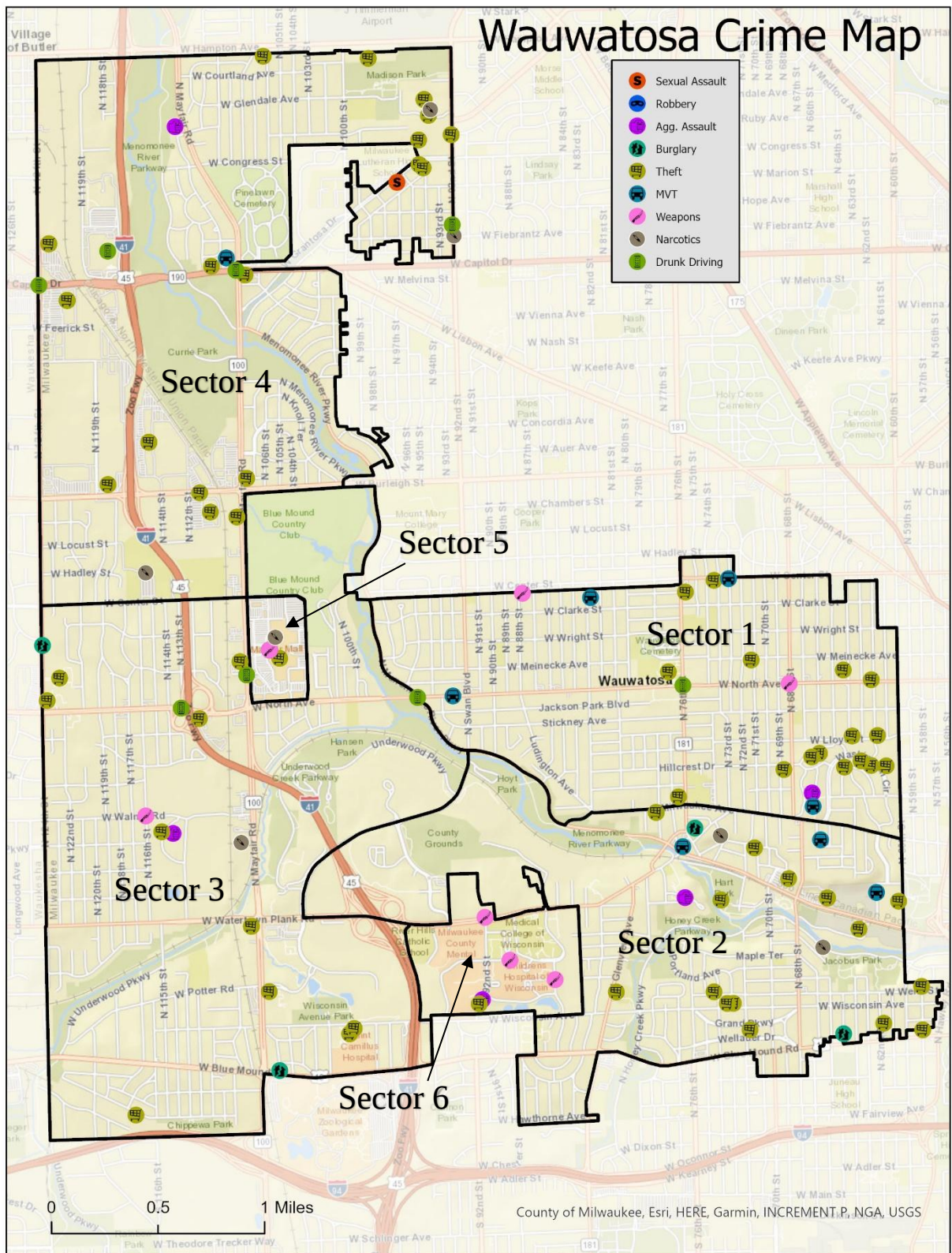
Thefts— There were 119 thefts (58 retail thefts and 21 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 24 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There was 1 theft reported at the Mayfair Collections and 6 reported at Home Depot.

Theft of Motor Vehicles— There were 7 (2 attempts and +0 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 6 vehicles targeted this month were taken without keys. There were 0 vehicles taken while running, 6 of the 7 vehicles have been recovered.

Arson— There was 0 arsons reported this month.

Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI) — There were 8 OAWIs reported this month.

Pursuits/Eluding Cases – There were 13 reports of eluding. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed.
