Major Crime Update

Total Calls YTD (No DMP Calls): 7,649 Calls

Homicide— There were 0 homicide reported. There was 1 reported overdose this month, 0 were fatal.

April 17, 2025

Shootings / Shots Fired — There were 0 shootings reported this month. There was 1 incident of shots fired reported. Five firearms were taken as evidence (7 total firearms were placed into property).

25-007679: At around 5:05 pm on 3/20/2025, officers responded to the area of N 62 St and W Meinecke Ave. for reports of *shots fired*. Upon arrival officers located multiple casings. Investigation indicated one black SUV was chasing another black SUV. Both vehicles were traveling westbound from the City of Milwaukee. One individual appeared to be hanging out of a rear window of the chasing vehicle, firing a gun at the other. There were no injuries, and no property was struck by the gunfire.

Sexual Assaults— There were 6 sexual assaults.

Robbery— There were 0 robberies reported this month.

Assaults— There were 12 assaults reported this month. 6 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence. 1 incident was reported as resisting/obstruction officer.

Burglary— There were 8 burglaries reported this month.

There were multiple (x2) burglaries reported at 2929 N Mayfair Rd where multiple (x4) vehicles were taken. Two juveniles were arrested in these burglaries.

There were multiple (x3) burglaries reported to churches and a vacant house where a juvenile was arrested.

66% of the Burglaries occurred during the night-time hours.

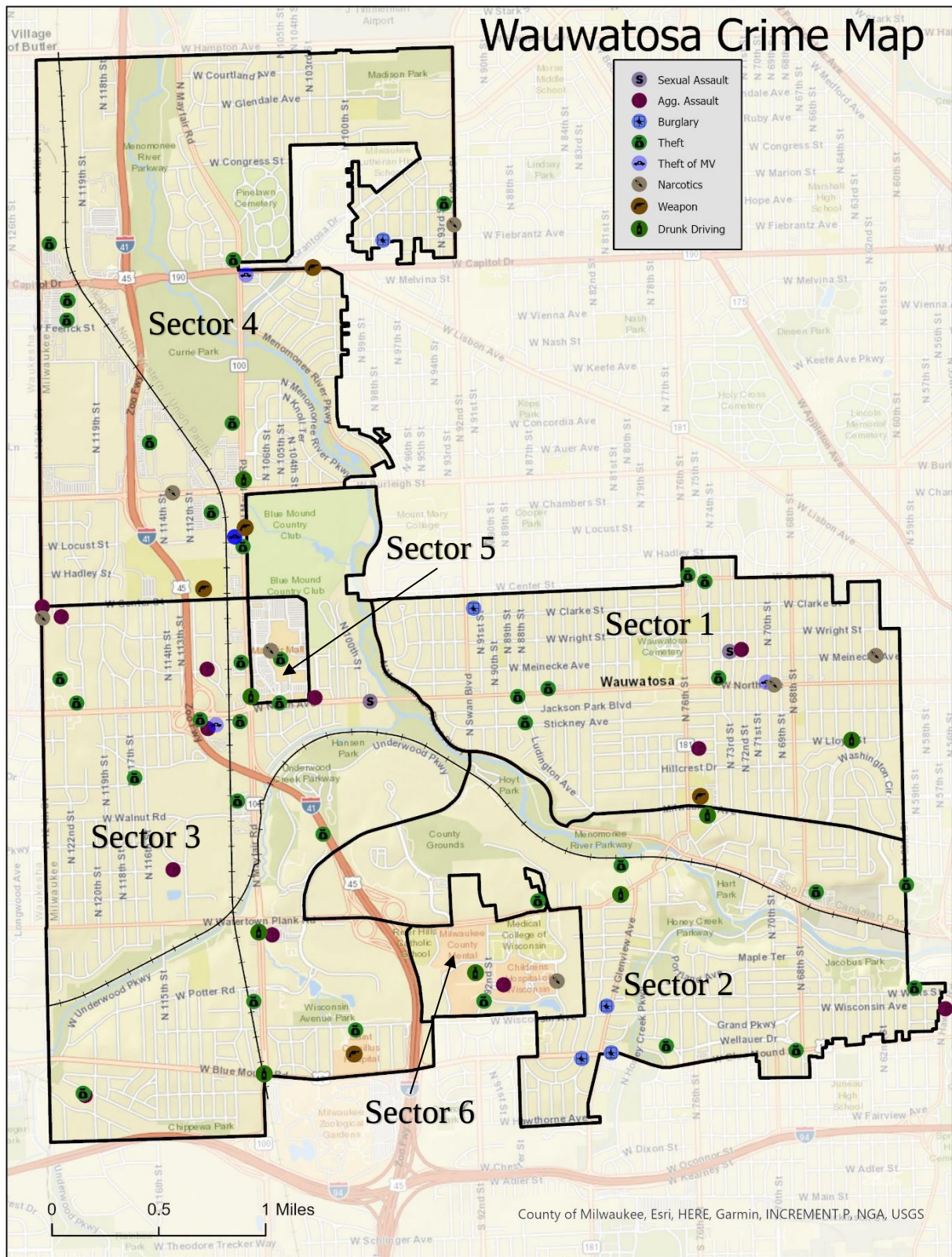
Thefts— There were 89 thefts (60 retail thefts and 5 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 12 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 8 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 1 reported at Home Depot.

Theft of Motor Vehicles— There were 5 (0 attempts and +0 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 5 vehicles were targeted this month were without keys. There were 0 vehicles taken while they were running. 5 of the 5 vehicles have been recovered. 2025 YTD: 16 (5 attempts and +6 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen.

Arson— There was 0 arsons reported this month.

Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI) — There were 10 OAWIs reported this month

Pursuits/Eluding Cases – There were 4 reports of eluding. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed.
