Major Crime Update- March 2026
Total Calls YTD (No DMP Calls): 7,472 Calls

Homicide— There were 0 homicides reported. There were 4 overdoses reported this month.

Shootings / Shots Fired— There were 0 shots fired reported and 0 people injured this month. 5 firearms were taken as evidence (11 total firearms were placed into property).

Sexual Assaults— There were 3 sexual assaults and 0 sex offenses reported.

April 13, 2026

Robbery— There were 5 robberies reported this month.

26-005979: At approx. 22:45 on 3/6/26, the victim reported as he was waiting at the bus stop in the 6400 blk of North Ave., unknown male subjects with firearms that demanded the victim's property. They fled in a silver Camry.

26-006028: At approx. 14:39 on 3/7/26, a subject attempted to remove items from Home Depot without paying for the items. When an employee approached the subject, the subject threatened to shoot the employee. **One person identified.**

26-006751: At approx. 17:26 on 3/14/26, multiple people were arrested following a robbery at 230 N 113th St. An individual was waiting in a parked vehicle for a known subject (suspect). When the suspect arrived, he attempted to grab the facemask off the victim. When the victim resisted, the suspect produced a spray-painted black and green handgun with an extended magazine, pointed it at them, and demanded the item. The victim had a cut hand and was in fear for their safety.

26-007295: At approx. 3:55 on 3/20/26, the victim (valet at Children's Hospital) stated that the suspect accused him of removing \$40 from the vehicle. During the altercation, the suspect threatened to shoot the victim.

26-007715: At approx. 19:50 on 3/24/26, multiple people were arrested after a robbery at Five Guys. The victim stated that the suspects approached her and demanded her sunglasses. As the victim was removing her glasses and placing them into her pocket, one of the suspects began to physically assault the victim.

Assaults— There were 19 assaults reported this month. 24 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence. 0 incident(s) were reported as resisting/obstruction officer.

Burglary— There were 4 burglaries reported this month.

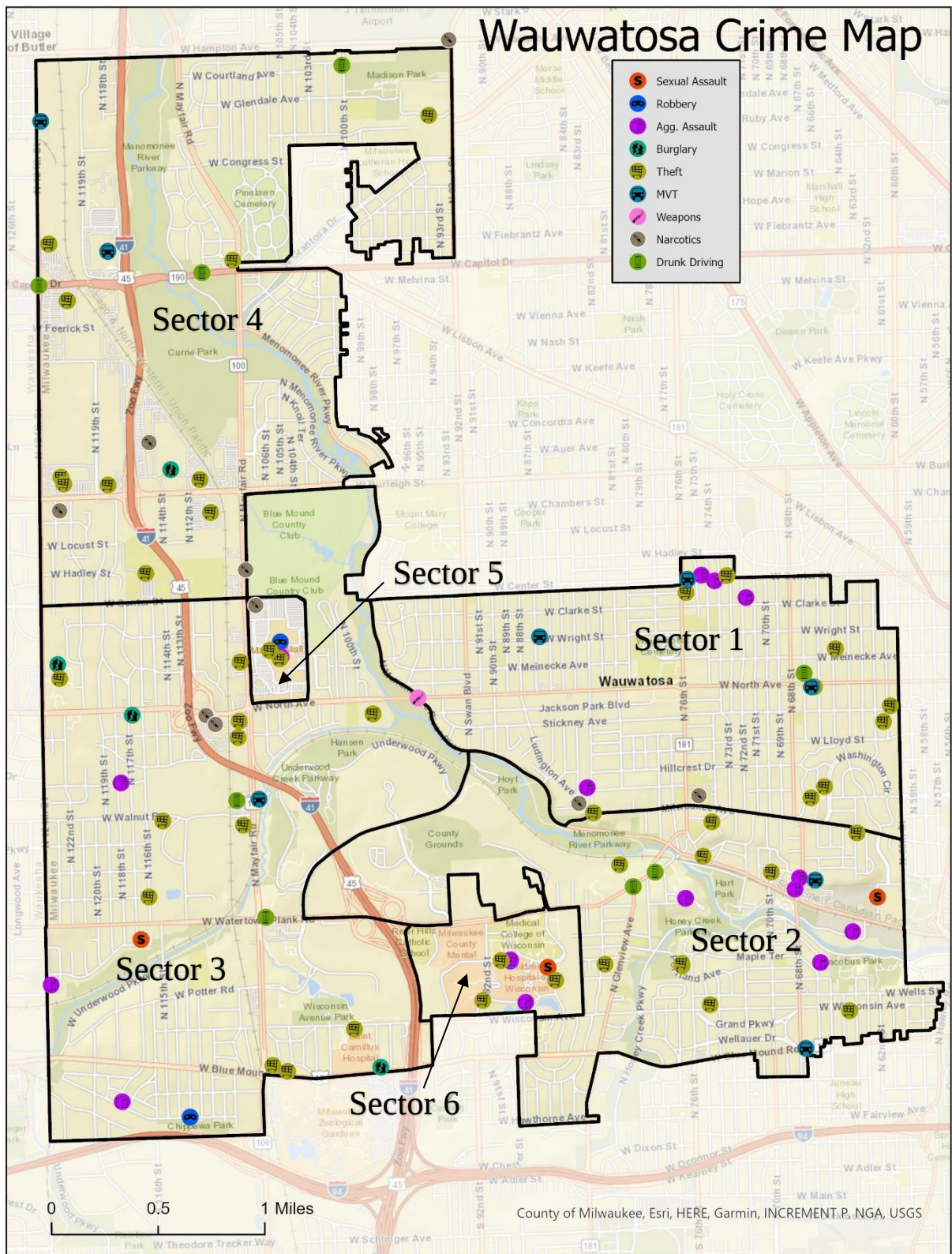
Thefts— There were 86 thefts (47 retail thefts and 10 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 11 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 4 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 4 reported at Home Depot.

Theft of Motor Vehicles— There were 5 (0 attempts and +1 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. Four vehicles were targeted this month were taken without keys. There were 0 vehicles taken while they were running, 3 of the 5 vehicles have been recovered.

Arson— There were 0 arsons reported this month.

Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI) — There were 6 OAWIs reported this month

Pursuits/Eluding Cases – There were 13 reports of eluding. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed.
