Major Crime Update-May 2025

Total Calls YTD (No DMP Calls): 14,064 Calls

Homicide— There were 0 homicides reported. There were 0 overdoses reported this month.

Shootings / Shots Fired— There were 0 shots fired reported and 0 people injured this month. 5 firearms were taken as evidence (15 total firearms were placed into property).

Sexual Assaults— There were 3 sexual assaults and 1 indecent exposure reported.

Robbery— There were 3 robberies reported this month.

25-011771: At approx. 23:51 on 5/1/2025, officers arrested one MB after he stole various cigarettes from Walgreens (2275 N Mayfair Rd). While the subject was stealing the cigarettes, he advised an employee not to call police and that he had a gun, while he began opening his trench coat, moving his hands towards his waistband.

25-012170: At approx. 12:55 on 5/6/2025, officers arrested one juvenile MB after he threatened to stab two people inside Meijer. The subject demanded money from the victims, while threatening them. The subject was arrested inside the store.

25-012451: At approx. 11:25 on 5/9/2025, 3 juvenile females were arrested following a retail theft, strongarm robbery, taking and driving a vehicle without the owner's consent and fleeing/eluding an officer. The suspects forced the victim out of her vehicle and took the vehicle.

Assaults— There were 13 assaults reported this month. 8 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence. 3 incidents were reported as resisting/obstruction officer.

Burglary— There were 5 burglaries reported this month. No discernable pattern

Thefts— There were 89 thefts (54 retail thefts and 8 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 9 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 8 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 3 reported at Home Depot.

Theft of Motor Vehicles— There were 6 (2 attempts and +2 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 3 vehicles were targeted this month were without keys. There was 1 vehicle taken while it was running. 6 of the 6 vehicles have been recovered. 2025 YTD: 30 (12 attempts and +9 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen.

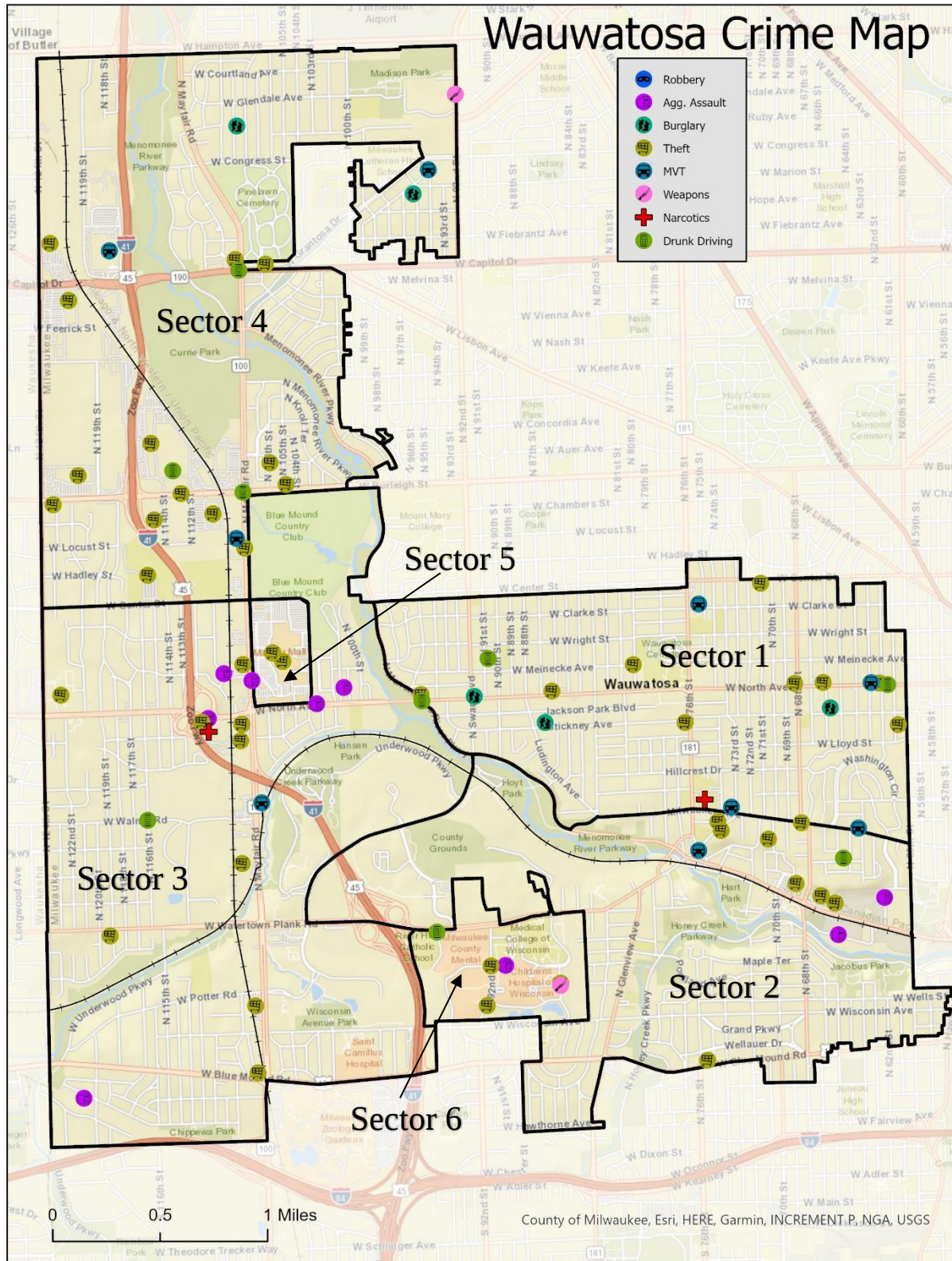
The Milwaukee area has seen a significant increase in the use of key fob re-programmers to steal vehicles. This increase was identified in November 2024, with the theft of multiple Infiniti Q60s from the area. The initial trend targeted Nissans and Infiniti's; however, currently there are a variety of vehicles being targeted.

***WUPD Arrested an individual known to be conducting these types of thefts. Since that arrest, only 1 vehicle has been stolen that fits this trend. ***

Arson— There was 0 arsons reported this month.

Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI) — There were 9 OAWIs reported this month.

Pursuits/Eluding Cases – There were 12 reported eluding. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed.
