PERSONNEL ADDITIONS AND CHANGES

Currently we are operating with 90 officers. One officer and one detective retired in May. One officer is on parental leave, 1 is injured on duty, 4 are on Light Duty and 3 are on Military Leave. Four officers were sworn in on May 26, 2026.

OPERATIONS

Major Crime Update- May 2026
Total Calls YTD (No DPM Calls): 13,057 Calls

Homicide— There were 0 homicides reported. There were 6 overdoses reported this month.

Shootings / Shots Fired— There was 1 shots-fired call reported and 0 people injured this month. 20 firearms were taken as evidence (27 total firearms were placed into property).

26-014093: At approx. 21:45 on 5/25/2026, two subjects were arrested in the 6000 blk of W North for discharging a firearm.

Sexual Assaults— There were 3 sexual assaults and 0 sex offenses reported.

Robbery— There were 3 robberies reported this month.

26-013037: At approx. 17:47 on 5/16/2026, one subject was arrested in the area of 2929 N. Mayfair Rd. following an attempted robbery incident. The suspect asked the victim if she could have the victim's dog and bank account. When the victim declines to give the suspect the item, the suspect threatened the victim with a knife. The victim believes that the suspect was scared off by another resident.

26-014236: At approx. 8:39 on 5/27/2026, officer responded to the building at 10111 W Capitol Dr. for a robbery/Lewd & Lascivious report. The victim reported that she observed a male engaging in a sexual act inside the building. As the victim was calling for police services, the subject gives the victim a hug and takes her cell phone.

26-014590: At approx. 14:54 on 5/30/2026, one juvenile was arrested following a robbery incident. The victim reported that the juvenile was in the area asking for directions and grabbed the victim's cell phone. The suspect stated that he would shoot the victim.

Assaults— There were 14 assaults reported this month. 20 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence. 0 incident(s) was reported as resisting/obstruction officer.

Burglary— There was 1 burglary reported this month.

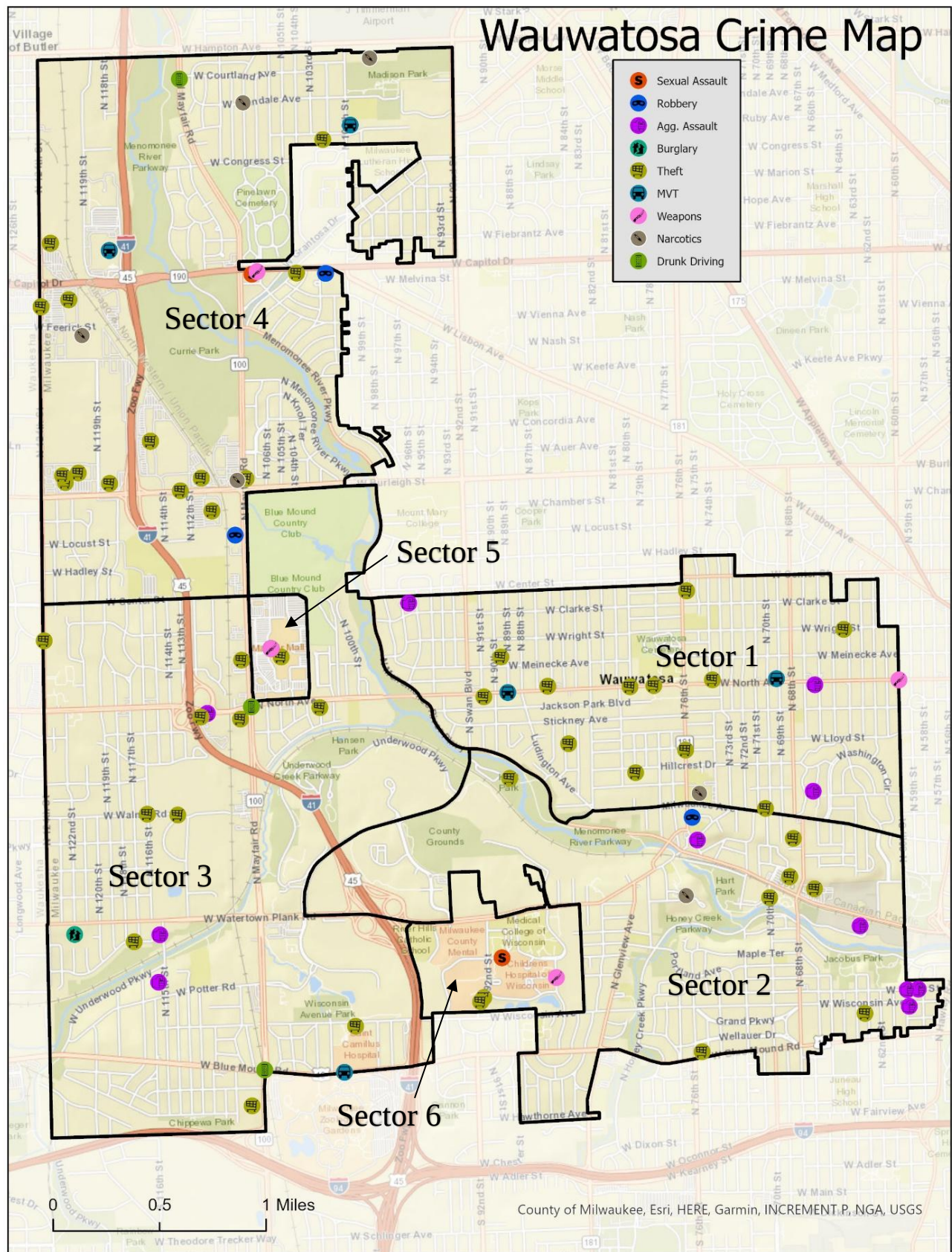
Thefts— There were 107 thefts (55 retail thefts and 14 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 21 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 3 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 8 reported at Home Depot.

Theft of Motor Vehicles— There were 2 (1 attempt and +1 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 0 vehicles were taken without keys, and 0 taken while running, 2 of the 2 vehicles have been recovered.

Arson— There were 0 arsons reported this month.

Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI) — There were 3 OAWIs reported this month

Pursuits/Eluding Cases – There were 12 reports of eluding. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed.
