Major Crime Update-November 2025

Total Calls YTD (No DMP Calls): 30,0228 Calls

Homicide— There were 0 homicides reported. There were 4 reports of overdoses this month.

Shootings (Subject Struck)/ Shots Fired (No subject Struck)— There was 1 shooting reported. 7 firearms were taken as evidence (13 total firearms were placed into property).

25-032031: On 11/12/2025, at approx. 00:56, officers responded to 6100 W State St. for a report of multiple gun shots. Two people were shot by an unknown subject attempting to enter the apartment. There were multiple people inside the apartment playing poker.

Sexual Assaults— There was 1 sexual assault and 2 indecent exposures/sex offenses reported.

Robbery— There was 1 robbery reported this month.

25-032506: On 11/16/2025, at approx. 16:24, A 2021 white Toyota Highlander was taken from the BP gas Station (7532 W Center St) while the victim was getting gas. A subject approached the victim and pushed her out of the way and entered the vehicle. The suspect then fled the area in the victim's vehicle. The vehicle was later recovered and one juvenile was arrested.

Assaults— There were 5 assaults reported this month and 5 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence.

Burglary— There were 5 burglaries reported this month.

In November, 66% of burglaries occurred during the nighttime along with 66% of locations being non-residential property.

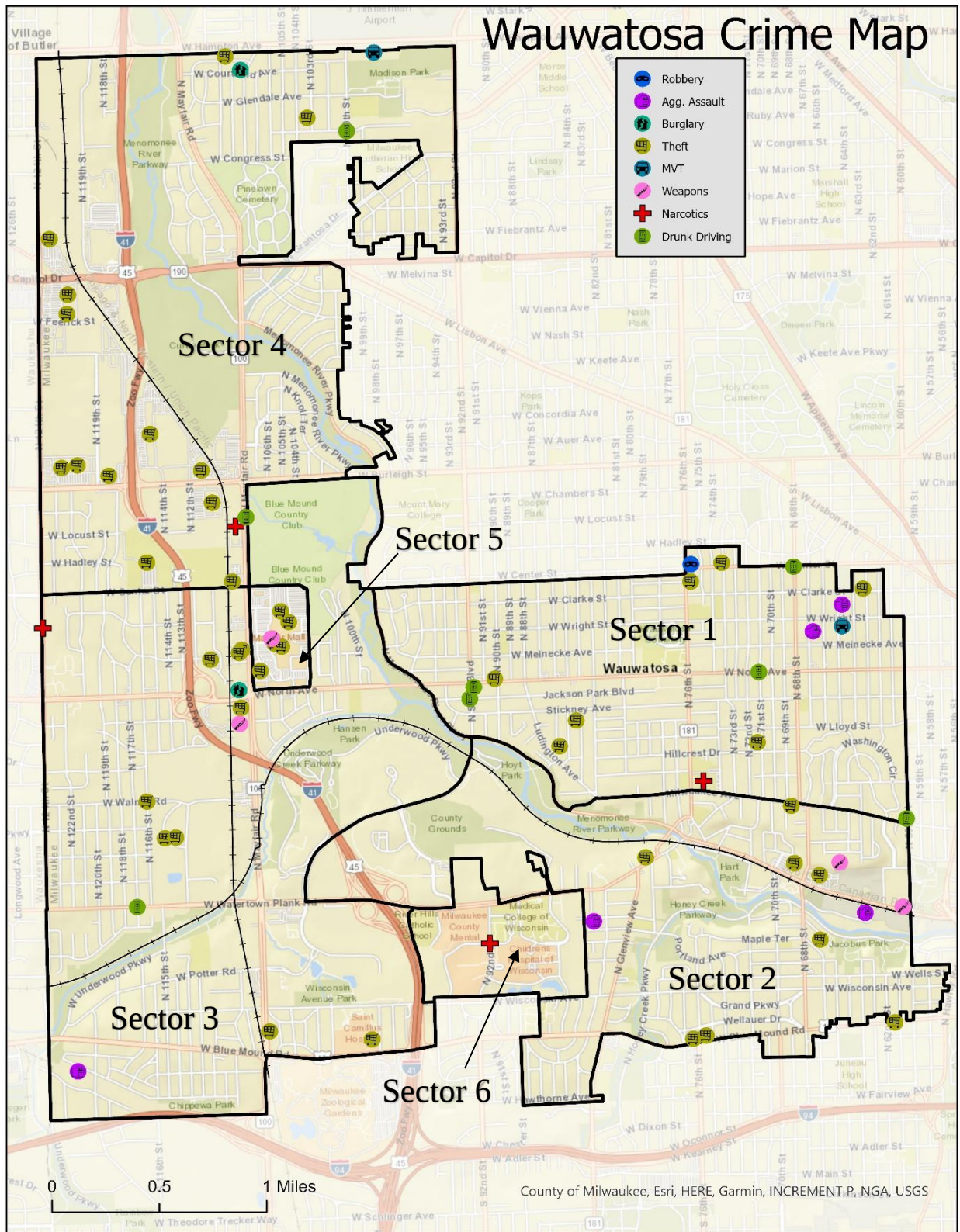
Thefts— There were 103 thefts (63 retail thefts and 12 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 10 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 11 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 5 reported at Home Depot.

Theft of Motor Vehicles— There were 3 (1 attempted) motor vehicles reported stolen. One vehicle was targeted without keys this month. There was 1 vehicle taken while it was running. 3 of the 3 vehicles have been recovered. **2025 YTD:** 54 (22 attempts and +13 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen.

Arson— There were 0 arsons reported this month.

Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI) Arrests — There were 9 OAWI arrests this month.

Pursuits/Eluding Cases – There were 3 reports of eluding. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed.

A Year-to-Date comparative analysis of Mayfair Mall shows a decrease in calls for 2025. In 2024 calls totaled 1,319 compared to 1,053 calls in 2025. A comparison of 2020 with 2025 shows an increase of 25.57%. A comparison of 2015 with 2025 shows a decrease of - 23.28%.
