PERSONNEL ADDITIONS AND CHANGES

Currently we are operating with 93 officers. One officer is in the Academy until December. Two officers resigned this month. One is injured on duty, two are on parental leave, 4 are on Light Duty. Two officers are on Military Leave until May, 2026.

Major Crime Update-October 2025

Total Calls YTD (No DMP Calls): 28,015 Calls

Homicide— There were 0 homicides reported. There were 4 overdoses reported this month.

Shootings (Subject Struck)/ Shots Fired (No subject Struck)— There were 2 shots fired calls reported. 7 firearms were taken as evidence (13 total firearms were placed into property).

Sexual Assaults— There were 0 sexual assaults and 2 indecent exposures/sex offenses.

Robbery— There was 1 robbery reported this month.

25-29011: On 10/13/2025 at approx. 12:47, a black male entered the BP gas station and held a knife to an employee's neck and demanded money from the register. One subject was arrested following an investigation.

Assaults— There were 10 assaults reported this month. 4 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence.

Burglary— There were 0 burglaries reported this month.

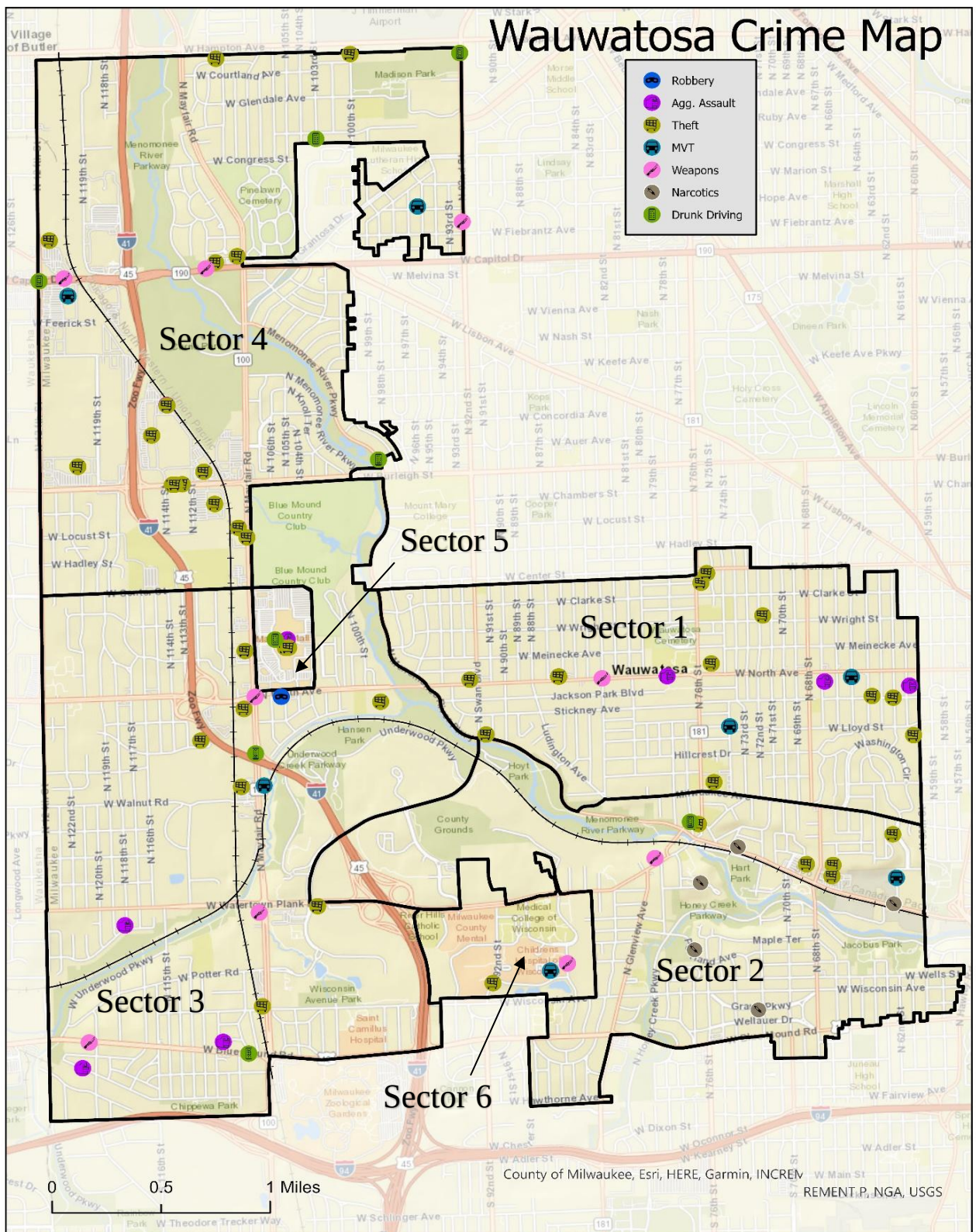
Thefts— There were 117 thefts (83 retail thefts and 9 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 13 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 6 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 7 reported at Home Depot.

Theft of Motor Vehicles— There were 3 (1 attempted and +1 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 1 vehicle targeted this month was without keys. There were 0 vehicles taken while they were running. 3 of the 3 vehicles have been recovered. 2025 YTD: 52 (22 attempts and +13 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen.

Arson— There was 1 arson reported this month.

Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI) Arrests — There were 11 OAWI arrests this month.

Pursuits/Eluding Cases – There were 8 reports of eluding. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed.
