### PERSONNEL ADDITIONS AND CHANGES

Currently we are operating with 95 officers. One officer is in the Academy until December. One officer resigned this month. One is injured on duty, one is on parental leave, 1 officer is in field training, 3 are on Light Duty. Two officers are on Military Leave until May, 2026.

### OPERATIONS **September 2025**

**Major Crime Update-September 2025**  
Total Calls YTD (No DMP Calls): 28,360 Calls

**Homicide**— There were 0 homicides reported. There were 2 overdoses reported this month.

**Shootings (Subject Struck) / Shots Fired (No subject Struck)**— There were 0 shots-fired calls reported. 8 firearms were taken as evidence (11 total firearms were placed into property).

**Sexual Assaults**— There was 1 sexual assault and 2 indecent exposures/sex offenses.

**Robbery**— There were 2 robberies reported this month.

**25-024677:** On 9/4/2025 at approx. 9:29, two suspects, a black male and a black female, took items from Metcalf's without paying. The male suspect threatened to shoot Metro Market security when confronted.

**25-0206814:** On 9/23/2025 at approx. 13:44, officers responded to the Holiday Inn Express for a report of a robbery. The victim reported that she invited a male subject to the hotel. As he was leaving the hotel he pushed the victim and took her phone.

**Assaults**— There were 13 assaults reported this month. 6 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence.

**Burglary**— There was 1 burglary reported this month.

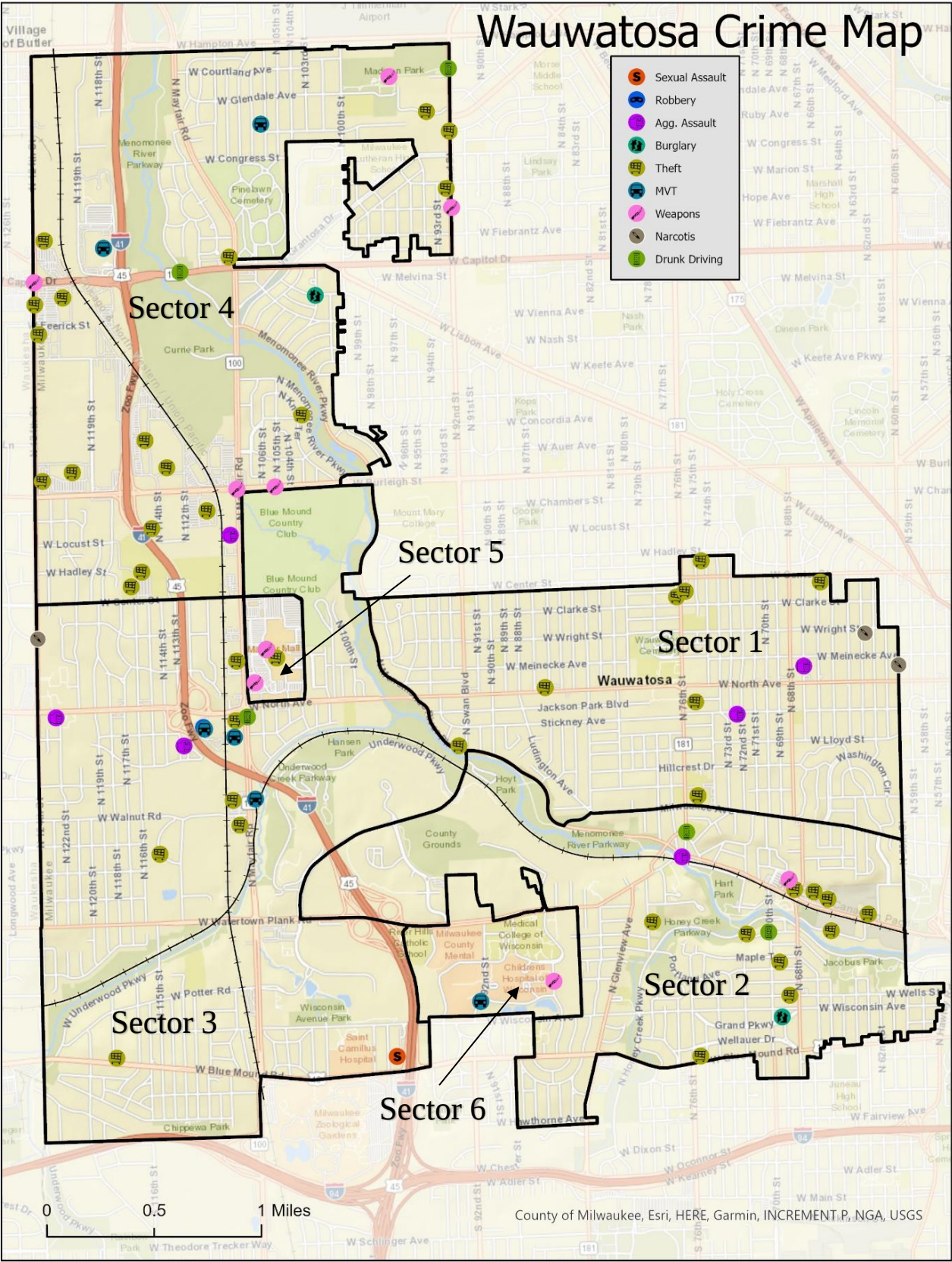
**Thefts**— There were 115 thefts (76 retail thefts and 3 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 5 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 11 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 7 reported at Home Depot.

**Theft of Motor Vehicles**— There were 2 (0 attempts and +1 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 2 vehicles targeted this month were without keys. 2 of the 2 vehicles have been recovered. There were 0 vehicles taken while they were running. 2025 YTD: 46 (21 attempts and +13 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen.

**Arson**— There were 0 arsons reported this month.

**Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI)** — There were 5 OAWI arrests this month.

**Pursuits/Eluding Cases** – There were 12 reports of eluding. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed.

### Mayfair Mall:

A Year-to-Date comparative analysis of Mayfair Mall shows a decrease in calls for 2025. In 2024 calls totaled 1,083 compared to 860 calls in 2025. A comparison of 2020 with 2025 shows a decrease of - 26.28%. A comparison of 2015 with 2025 shows a decrease of - 21.82%.

### The Mayfair Collection: Opened for Business in 2014

A Year-to-Date comparative analysis of The Mayfair Collection shows an increase in calls for 2025. In 2024, calls totaled 225 compared to 456 calls in 2025. A comparison of 2020 with 2025 shows an increase of 157.63%. A comparison of 2015 with 2025 shows an increase of 58.89%.
